CEO CORNER

Welcome back to another CEO Corner and it has been awhile since I've personally written this column for the Kulin community as I've been working remotely in a part-time capacity for the past month. Many thanks to the staff who held the fort in my absence and as usual kept things ticking along smoothly.

A big thank you also to the wider Kulin community for your ongoing support and messages to myself and Tenille as we welcomed Charlie Frances into the world. The support of the community has been so overwhelming, but not unsurprising and reminds us how lucky we are to be part of this great community.

From a Shire perspective, things continue to progress. At this months September Council Meeting we received our Long-Term Financial Plan. We are also in the process of finalising our updated Asset Management Plan, which will be put to Council at the October Meeting. These two documents form the basis, by which Council will make financial decisions over the coming 10 years. More detailed information on these two documents will be presented as part of Council's Strategic Community Plan update process, which is scheduled to be undertaken this financial year.

Last week President West and myself attended the WALGA AGM. This included a Political Forum in the morning, presented by the leaders of the State's major political parties as they outlined their key focus areas in advance of the 2021 State Election. This was followed by the formal WALGA AGM in the afternoon. Key topics of discussion included the on-going process of reforming the Local Government Act, Mandatory Councillor Training, COVID Challenges, Drought Assistance Eligibility and State Government Rates on Unallocated Crown Land.

Last Tuesday 22nd September saw the Kulin Co-operative AGM held at the FRC. Over the past 12 months this group has purchased property and injected a well needed business into the community. They continue to investigate the next community economic development venture in town and certainly welcome further ideas and investment. On Thursday 17th September I was fortunate enough to be to provide a briefing to the Federal Assistant Minister for Road Safety and Freight Transport regarding the progress of the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network project. He was absolutely astounded at how 42 local governments could work together to plan and deliver the \$87M Stage 1 of WSFN. Currently myself and Judd are developing the budget and scope of works for Kulin's identified works along Fence Road to be completed which is approximately \$5M over the next 4 years, of which 93% will be externally funded.

Freight and transport throughout the region will always remain a hot topic. President West is a fierce advocate and lobbyist for reopening Tier 3 rail lines, especially the line from Kulin back to Narrogin. Last Thursday the State Transport Minister Saffioti released the Tier 3 Grain Lines Engineering Review Report, an independent engineering assessment outlining the estimated cost of restoring each section of the Wheatbelt's Tier 3 rail network.

This included an estimated cost \$164.41 million to restore the Kulin (via Yilliminning) to Narrogin to a suitable condition for commercial operation, including the potential to upgrade some sections from narrow to standard gauge.

This information is the precursor to a business case for rail freight investment proposals on Tier 1, 2 and 3 rail to be prepared and submitted to Infrastructure Australia for consideration and could lay groundwork for potential future funding partnerships with Federal Government. Receiving this information can largely be attributed to the tenacious work that President West has undertaken over the past few years and hopefully the next stage of the process will bring to fruition further transport investment within the region and ultimately reopening the Kulin to Narrogin railway line.

Congratulations to local sports teams who have proudly represented the Kulin community over the past few weeks. The Kulin-Kondinin Blues Reserves team fell agonisingly short in the EDFL Grand Final a few weekends

ago, but with some school aged kids performing well it certainly shows that the club continues to develop young players of the future. Speaking of youth, a big congratulations to KDHS Country Week Netball team who took out their division at last week's school Country Week, well done team.

NOTICES FROM THE SHIRE OF KULIN

TO THE HOUSEHOLDER COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP

With the coming spring and even though there are no Bush Races, many visitors will still be arriving/travelling in our Shire for a multitude of reasons, not the least that Kulin is quite simply a fantastic place to be.

With the above in mind the Shire is requesting all residents to set aside some time now to spruce up their little piece of heaven. Time to clean up around your home for the spring and to get in early to get rid of potential fire hazards that will exist once the grasses dry off. There is also the issue that long grass and rubbish makes an ideal home for snakes and other unwanted pests. In terms of Bushfire control, in past years Council has not seriously considered issuing infringements however this year there will be no warnings given to anyone not complying with the firebreak order.

THE FIREBREAK ORDER THAT APPLIES TO TOWNSITE LAND IS AS FOLLOWS:

"Land Area less than 1 hectare: All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It be recommended that at least a 2m wide area, immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs."

For information any land of one hectare or above the rural provisions apply.

We look forward to your support and cooperation in helping clean-up Kulin.

VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION STICKERS

Volunteer Fire Fighters / Bush Fire Brigade Members please be advised that the grey Vehicle Identifier Stickers will expire on 30 September 2020; and need to be replaced with the new blue stickers (valid from 1 October 2020 – 20 September 2022). These stickers are available from the Shire Office. If you would like one posted out please email Nicole eso@kulin.wa.gov.au and provide your vehicle registration plate number and the make & model of your vehicle.

Please see below key information from DFES regarding these stickers:-

- DFES encourages the use of Vehicle Identifier stickers to identify private vehicles owned by persons pre-authorised by Local Governments to enter the fire ground and assist with emergency response operations:
- As emergency response is often supplemented by local farmers/land owners with
- private vehicles who may not be members of local fire brigades they assist to provide timely identification of private vehicles and persons suitable for access on the incident ground;
- Vehicle Identifier stickers are affixed to the lower left corner of the windscreen of a vehicle to identify it as a private
- vehicle owned by a person who is authorised by Local Government to assist with operations;

NOTICES FROM THE SHIRE OF KULIN

CONDITIONS

DFES has set minimum conditions which the person being issued a vehicle identifier sticker must agree to:

- It is the responsibility of the owner and driver of the vehicle to comply with the Road Traffic Act 1974;
- Appropriate Personal Protective Equipment and Clothing will be worn at all times; and
- The driver will ensure that the vehicle's presence at an incident is recorded on both arrival and departure. The vehicle identifier sticker does not infer that a vehicle is a fire fighting vehicle, but that it may be assisting or supporting an incident, or to enable passage of brigade members through a Vehicle Control Point for the purpose of deployment to the incident (e.g. to travel to a local brigade station or to crew an appliance deployed to the incident).

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

The RESTRICTED burning period commenced on 19 September and goes through to Saturday 31 October 2020. Effectively this means that no burning can be carried out unless you have a permit from your local Fire Control Officer. The exception is burning rubbish and garden refuse after 6pm (needs to be extinguished by 11pm). Other conditions apply.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

PURSUANT TO THE POWERS contained in Section 33, you are hereby required on or before 31 October 2020 and thereafter up to and including 15 March 2021 to have a 3 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material on all rural and townsite rural land owned or occupied by you:

- 1. Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and 2. In such other positions as is necessary to divide land into areas not exceeding 500 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak; and
- 3. Immediately surrounding any part of land used for crop; and 4. Parallel to and within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps on the land; and 5. Immediately surrounding

receptacles used for the storage

of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not; the firebreak required to comply with this item shall be no less than 5 metres wide; and 6. Immediately inside land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not); the firebreak required shall be no less than 7 metres wide. Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after 19 September 2020 you shall

provide the firebreak immediately.

and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It is recommended that at least a 2m wide area immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs."

(Note: any land of one hectare or above - rural provisions apply.)

FIREBREAK VARIATION

If it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impractical to clear firebreaks to comply with this notice due to soil erosion, the spread of salinity or for any other reason, a request for a variation may be made to the Council no later than the 1 September of each year. Such a request must be in writing and include a detailed plan showing the proposed location of firebreaks or of the alterative fire protection methods to be used.

HARVESTING OPERATIONS - MOBILE FIRE FIGHTING UNITS

An operational mobile engine powered firefighting pump unit with no less than 500 litres of water shall be in attendance during grain harvesting operations. If the unit is trailer mounted the trailer must be attached to a vehicle at all times during harvesting operations and the unit must be in the paddock, or adjoining paddock, where the harvesting operation is being carried out.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954 CONTINUED

AUTOMATIC HARVESTING BANS

A Harvest Ban will apply automatically on Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

OTHER MATTERS

If for hardship reasons, it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impossible to clear firebreaks required by this Notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to seek alternative

options. Claimants of hardship, should do so with sufficient time to allow alternatives to be enacted. Claims of hardship does not automatically exempt owners and occupiers from the requirements of this Notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this Notice is a fine not exceeding \$5000. A person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of the Shire or a contractor

performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the due date. If the requirements of this Notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.


ACTS OF KINDNESS AND APPRECIATION

TESLA OWNERS CLUB OF WA (TOCWA)

The Tesla Owners Club of WA (TOCWA) will be venturing to Kulin on 10th and 11th October 2020. Tesla Owners Club Western Australia (TOCWA) is a group which facilitates communication, advocacy and community for Tesla Owners (and reservation holders) within WA.

The Club has decided to visit Kulin firstly due to our installed EV charge points, but also to allow new Tesla electric vehicle owners to explore regional Western Australia.

Tesla cars can be charged from any single or three phase power source including 10 and 15amp caravan sockets, although the installed Tesla chargers are multiple times faster. The average car will consume less than \$15 of electricity to replace the energy consumed during the 270km drive from Perth.

TOCWA has arranged for the cars and their owners to be on display on Saturday 10th October in the main street parking bay next to the playground and public toilets from 2pm – 5pm. TOCWA members will be available to have a chat and answers questions about the cars and to have a look in the cars.

The centre also hoped to purchase more outdoor equipment such as balance beams and obstacle course items to go with our metal climbing frames and wooden balance beams. These activities promote balance, teamwork, patience and the development of gross motor skills.

Our request for funding was successful and the centre was able to purchase all of the items on our 'Wish List'. KCCC has also been fortunate to secure KBR funding. This funding will purchase a laptop, keyboard and mouse and laptop case which will improve our efficiencies with documentation as all educators will be able to access the laptop to upload documentation including individual/group observations, children's daily learning and experiences and to Storypark, our online platform to communicate with families.

This will remove significant pressure from the senior staff and will allow our educators to use their qualifications to their full potential, while being engaged in all areas of the business. On behalf of our enrolled

children, staff and parents we would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to the AOOBs and Kulin Bush Races for their very kind donations, even during this extremely tough year. Their generosity is greatly appreciated.





Eligibility criteria

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the local authority making the award.
- Awards may be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- Groups of people or couples will not normally be eligible except when meeting the criteria for a community group.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition of their particularly outstanding community contribution or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Nominations must be apolitical in their nature and should not in any way bring the awards program or local government area into disrepute.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.
