My recent sojourn to warmer weather communities prompted for me to undertake an informal study the tourist facilities along the way. It is pleasing to see that some local governments make a real effort to alert travellers to both the historical, environmental and indigenous histories of their stopping points, and many have invested heavily to ensure signage, BBQ's, shelters, toilets and stopping bay hardstands are provided at each location. It is without question, that the quality of the location attracts, but if the facilities are not to the highest standard; then the stopover is short lived.

Kulin stacks up very favourably to most communities and was a wonderful comparative tool. Our tourist comment/feedback record shows that the town centre facilities are excellent and the brand is strong, but near stopover points and regional route environs may need some improvement. As always the travellers whisper amongst themselves about the deals and locations they enjoy the most and Kulin was mentioned for its 72 hour RV stop to me on many occasions, clearly a winner in travellers eyes. For those that did not know – they soon got to hear about it.

AVON WASTE



Avon Waste to deliver waste management services to the RoeROC Shires

The Roe Region of Councils have successfully secured a 7 year contract to deliver essential waste management collection services to the Shires of Corrigin, Kondinin, Kulin and Narembeen commencing 1 July 2018. Under the 7 year contract, Avon Waste will be delivering general waste and recycling waste collection services per year for each residence in each Shire.

Avon Waste CEO, Del Sherry said "it is expected the transition to the new contract will be seamless given that Avon Waste have been providing services for RoeROC residents for the past 10 years".

Chair of the RoeROC Council, Cr Rhonda Cole said "Avon Waste's proposal offered the greatest overall advantage for Council's objectives, they provide a high standard of service and this contract recognises the service provided over the past 10 years."

A significant change in the existing waste management system will be that from 1 July 2018 glass containers should not be placed in the yellow-topped recycling bins.

Glass is being taken out of the yellow-topped recycling system for several reasons.

Cr Rhonda Cole said "we have a glass crusher in the RoeROC region and we would like residents to consider recycling glass to make use of this machine, crushed glass takes up much less space and can provide useful cover material at the Bendering Landfill site.

In addition to this, glass is becoming a problem when being recycled as it contaminates other products and there is no local market for the product. The removal of glass from the recycling bins will also minimise processing charges. Residents have two options in dealing with the disposal of glass:-

- 1. Glass may be placed in the general waste bin; or
- 2. Check with your local Shire on their options for recycling glass.

As part of our ongoing commitment to recycling in the region, the Shires and Avon Waste will provide a series of workshops about sustainability and recycling during July and August. Facilitated by Karla Hooper – Earth Girl (www.karlahooper.com), these workshops will provide an opportunity for residents to find out more about recycling. Karla is passionate about sustainability and is a zero waste living advocate and is excited to be sharing her

message across the RoeROC Shires.

"Avon Waste has a proud history of providing waste services in the regions and we look forward to the next 7 years working closely with the RoeROC Shire's to enhance waste delivery and recycling services within these towns" said Del Sherry. A media campaign will be undertaken in the coming weeks, keep an eye on your Shire's website as well as Avon Waste (www.avonwaste.com.au).







Pingaring Tank/Standpipe

Pingaring town standpipe will now require an access card for water - please contact the office if you require a card. Also note that the water level is low and people are advised to use other standpipes where possible. The mains connection to this standpipe is only a temporary short term fix until the tank on the hill has sufficient amount of rain water.

IS YOUR FIRE PLACE READY FOR WINTER?

You may be thinking about organising your flu shot, but are your chimneys and flutes ready for winter?

Each winter, fire fighters attend many house fires due to ash, soot and combustion residue that has built up inside chimney flues.

This residue can ignite causing a fire. In most cases you will see flames shooting out of the top of the chimney!

To make sure your chimneys are ready, we recommend you:

- Check the heater, fire place brickwork, chimney and flue before lighting your first fire of the year to make sure it is clean.
- Look at purchasing some additives you can put in your fire while its burning that can help reduce residue build up (check out your local hardware store).
- If your fireplace chimney is brick, check that the surrounding brickwork has not cracked. This can reduce the chance of a fire creeping through the course in back wall.
- Ensure that your wood heaters are installed and maintained by a qualified operator.

House fires can cause extensive property loss and damage. Most of these are accidental and preventable – so take action now to minimise your risk.




