With harvest on the horizon and many farmers 'office' about to be a header cab, truck cab or ute, it is timely to remember safety, not only for farmers but those on our roads.

All Primary Producers are responsible for understanding Access Requirements on WA Roads. All public roads in Western Australia have Restricted Access Vehicle ratings (RAVs). Make sure you know the RAV rating of the roads you are using for harvest. For more information use the RAV Mapping Tool - <https://www.mainroads.wa.gov.au/heavy-vehicles/compliance-enforcement/>.

Primary Producers must also be aware of the rules around driving an agricultural combination or agricultural machine on a public road. For more information see <https://www.mainroads.wa.gov.au/heavy-vehicles/permit-or-order-scheme/agricultural-vehicles>

For those driving on our roads during harvest a gentle reminder:

- If you are travelling near an agricultural vehicle, please be patient, reduce your speed, maintain a safe following distance, and only overtake when safe to do so
- If an oversize agricultural vehicle is approaching you from the opposite direction, you may need to pull over safely to let them pass

Funding approval for the remainder of our LRCIP Phase 3 (Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program) was

received on 7 October 2022.

The projects nominated for this program have been identified in the current budget. Staff will work through these projects to deliver by 30 June 2023.

Kulin Aquatic Centre pool and surrounds are looking fantastic and ready to open next week. Jones and the outside crew have been working hard to get ready for opening day on Tuesday 1st November 2022. The facility is looking its best and we look forward to a busy summer season. More information on opening time and early morning swimming can be found in this edition!

Renovation works on the pool slide and structure continue. The scope of works has not changed, however the time-frame to complete the works has been extended to allow for contractors to finish all work identified. This will impact on the opening date of the slide and Shire of Kulin apologises for the inconvenience to our community and visitors. Shire of Kulin have recognised it to be most prudent and beneficial to continue and complete the renovation works whilst the renovation contractors are mobilised to Kulin understanding it will delay the opening of the slide which is unfortunate and regrettable. We will keep the community updated as to opening dates.

Thankyou to everyone who attended a crossroads breakfast. We received honest and valuable feedback and questions

and appreciate meeting with the ratepayers and rural stakeholders of Kulin Shire. As we continue to reiterate, our doors are open, and our senior staff contact details are on the back page of the update.

KULIN HOTEL

Sunday 16th October with the sun shining was a fantastic day to celebrate the custodianship of the Kulin Hotel building back to the Kulin community.

The Kulin Hotel was pivotal in the development of Kulin town-site and the most controversial story connected to it. Since 1912 Dudinin Store operated a liquor outlet and a sly grog shop was available in Jitarning from 1914. In 1918 construction of a two story stone building began in Jitarning, intending to be a hotel. By the time the Jitarning building was complete, the Kulin Hotel had been built and obtained a liquor license. The license for the Jitarning hotel was rejected and Kulin Hotel kept its license. The Kulin Hotel opened on the 1st April 1919 however no one attended as they believed it was an April fools joke!

Since this time, it has been integral in the social and cultural development of Kulin. It continues to be the social hub of the community and the building is a significant landmark in the Kulin townscape.

Cultivating Kulin Committee is committed to projects that have whole of community benefit and improving and maintain the quality of life in Kulin. This project fitted with our objectives of supporting our community to retain its amenities and ensure the protection of the historic Kulin hotel building.

Custodianship of the building to

conserve, retain and improve is a privilege and gives our community the confidence that we continue to be in control of the future direction of our community.

Projects like this do not happen without broader community support. We are the envy of every community in what we can achieve together. This project has been co-funded through the generous donation of Kulin Community Financial Services and Kulin Bush Races. Both organisations have donated \$200,000 to CKC for the purchase. A \$100,000 loan has been provided to Cultivating Kulin Committee from Kulin Community Financial Services to secure the purchase. It is a remarkable situation our community finds itself in when community projects can be realised through local collaboration. We are the envy of every community, and this is testament to our volunteers and community contributors that get involved for the benefit of Kulin.

We must also recognise the efforts of CKC volunteers. Our cropping program is our major funding project. Over the past three years we have had a significant amount of generous donations for equipment, cartage, crops inputs and grain marketing. Thank you to everyone who is involved and if you would like to be involved, please contact our cropping Managers Chad Frantom and Brad Miller.

Thankyou to everyone who

attended and supported the CKC Gala Ball. It was a great opportunity to dress up and enjoy great company, food and live music in Kulin. Congratulations to Elana Frantom and team for all their work.

Finally, I would like to recognise the Kulin Hub group who own the operational lease of the building. Your commitment to making sure we have a functioning pub and accommodation in Kulin is greatly appreciated by the broader community. You have weathered the storm of a very tough economy over the past few years, however steadfastly provided an exceptional service to the community. The community appreciates all the efforts of staff and directors of the Kulin Community Hub.

Thank you to everyone who came to celebrate this project. It was a fantastic afternoon with great weather, live music by Fiona Jasper and tasting platters for all to enjoy. It was wonderful to have everyone together to celebrate the success and achievements of our community.

COUNCIL DECISIONS OCTOBER 2022

WRITE OFF MEMORIAL HALL RENT – approval to write off \$720 in rental income owing by Amara Aija Wellness was granted.

POLICY AMENDMENT – COMMUNITY SERVICES PRACTICES - Council adopted amendments to Policy CS13 which limits the length of hire of the community bus by commercial school bus operators and other businesses to seven days. CEO is authorised to approve longer periods on request.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REFORM – ELECTION TRANSITION ARRANGEMENTS Council will provide confirmation to the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries that the Shire of Kulin will commit to undertaking a Ward and Representation Review and have the completed review to the Local Government Advisory Board by the 14 February 2023; and confirm that the Shire's preferred number of Council members is no less than seven.

REQUEST FOR TENDER – NEW DWELLING – Council resolved not to accept the tender from CLPM Pty Ltd for the construction of one new executive residence due to insufficient budgeted funds. Housing Committee will review and reprioritise funds for the 2022/23 financial year with a view to assessing the cost and benefit of investing funds into the upgrade of existing housing stock.

CHANGE OF MEETING DATE - Council agreed to change the December 2022 Ordinary meeting date from Wednesday 21 December to Tuesday 20 December 2022.

CHRISTMAS OPENING HOURS – approval was granted for closure of the Administration Office from Friday 23 December 2022 to Monday 2 January 2023 (inclusive).

KULIN CHILD CARE CENTRE – OPENING HOURS & FEES AND CHARGES 2022-2023 – Updated Fees & Charges were adopted with implementation from 5 December 2022. Amended opening hours being 8am – 5pm Monday – Thursday (all categories of care provided) and 8am – 5pm Friday (no after school care) were also adopted.

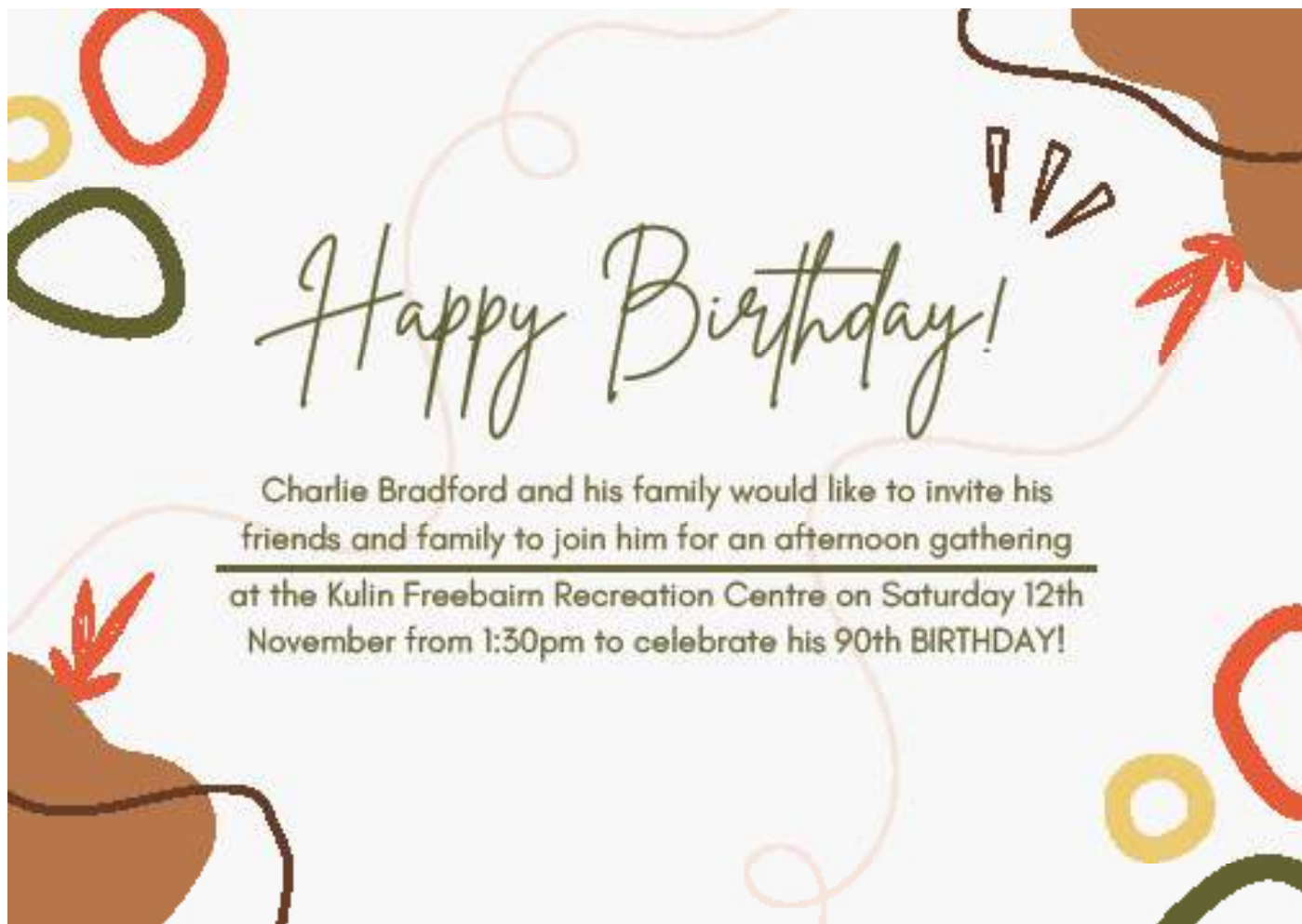


MOSQUITO FOGGING

BUSHFIRE VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION STICKERS

To assist authorities to identify vehicles which can assist DFES in bushfire response, DFES and the Shire encourages owners of such vehicles or machinery to apply for a Fire Response Vehicle Identifier windscreen sticker (application form on follow page). The stickers are designed to enable passage of approved vehicles through the vehicle control points (road blocks) where approved by the Incident Controller. Appliances or machinery without a Vehicle Identifier sticker may be delayed or prevented from assisting in the response.

Your existing sticker expired on 30 September 2022 and therefore is no longer valid. Stickers for the period ending 30 September 2024 are now available.

Multiple stickers may be issued to persons with multiple suitable vehicles/equipment – one application form per vehicle is required.

Stickers can be mailed out once the application is processed at the Shire.

Monday 31st October 2022,

failure to comply will result in fines being issued.

Bush Fire Control is as follows:

"Land Area less than 1 hectare:-

All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It be recommended that at least a 2m wide area, immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs."

For information any land of one hectare or above the rural provisions apply.

KNOW YOUR FIRE DANGER RATING

The Fire Danger Rating System has changed. Know the changes – they could save your life.

A new nationally consistent Fire Danger Rating System has been created. It's now simpler, clearer, and it could save your life. The new System has four levels. Each level tells you how dangerous a bushfire could be if one starts and comes with clear actions to take. The higher the Fire Danger Rating, the more severe the bushfire could be.

Fire Danger Ratings are important because they provide people with information so they can take action to protect themselves and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of bushfires. Ratings are calculated using a combination of weather forecasting and information about vegetation that could fuel a fire. They do not indicate the chance of a fire occurring, although this is a common misconception.

What do the ratings mean and what should I do?



Restricted Burning Period

The Shire of Kulin has entered its restricted burning period which runs from 19 September to 31 October.

A permit for burning is required and may be obtained by contacting your local bush fire control officer.

Water-saving offers available to Great Southern towns

Water Minister Dave Kelly has encouraged Great Southern residents to take advantage of free waterwise offers available as part of Water Corporation's 2022-23 Waterwise Towns Program.

The annual program was created to make it easier for regional Western Australians to use water more efficiently and save money on bills by making waterwise changes around the home.

Participating towns this year include Cranbrook, Gnowangerup, Hopetoun, Jerramungup, Kondinin, Kulin, Lake Grace, Newdegate, Nyabing, Pingrup, Ravensthorpe, Walpole and Wellstead, with residents eligible for a free showerhead swap and rainwater tank rebate.

The Showerhead Swap Program allows residents to replace up to two inefficient showerheads with waterwise alternatives, helping save up to 20,000 litres of water per household each year. In 2021-22, 108 Great Southern households made the switch, saving 2.1 million litres of water.

The rainwater tank rebate will support residents by providing up to \$1,000 to purchase a new rainwater tank, or up to \$500 to plumb in or replace an existing rainwater tank.

Since 2013-14, the State-wide Waterwise Towns Program has saved an estimated 1.7 billion litres of precious water - equivalent to 756 Olympic-sized swimming pools.

Offers are available to participating towns until 31 May 2023 or until stocks last.

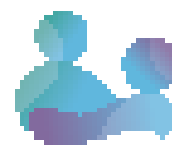
