CEO CORNER

Welcome back to my first CEO corner for 2021. I trust many people had a refreshing and relaxing festive season. One that probably lulled us all into a false sense of security, only for us to be slapped down with the sudden COVID19 restrictions for Perth. Just another challenge to keep us on our toes for 2021.

During January town was somewhat quiet, but it was still all systems go at the Shire. Thanks to Taryn, Christina and the crew for organising Council's Australia Day event. It was certainly well attended. Congratulations to our 3 newest Australian Citizens, as well as Mr Proud whos 100th birthday festival celebrations continued with an official plaque being presented in recognition of his milestone and service to the community.

The Aquatic Centre remains our feature tourist attraction of the summer with people coming from far and wide. The Aussie Day event with local entertainment duet was a highlight as well as the extra entertainment for the kids. Thanks to all in the community who have stepped up on the slide, in the kiosk and cleaning to make the centre run smoothly. Early morning swimming continues to attract a few early risers for a refreshing wake up call. I've even turned this into a bit of a New Year's resolution and am half way to Rotto.

Judd and the crew have ripped into their town street projects. High Street drainage is well on its way to completion. A minor inconvenience to what will be a long-term improvement. The system certainly seemed to pass its first minor test on Sunday.

CBH Access Road and Jilakin Street upgrade works are also well progressed. We are working with Main Roads on the intersection design of both these roads, along with the Lake Grace Road. Hopefully all works are completed within a month or so.

Last week we also had our quarterly LEMC Meeting including a desktop exercise on dealing with major storm and flood damage. Luckily, we didn't have to put any key actions from this learning into practice, but it was a worthwhile exercise for the emergency management organisations from around the community to undertake as a group.

Next week is the first Council Meeting for 2021. It looks like our 2019/20 Audit will be finally ready to go to Council following review from the OAG, with the Annual Electors Meeting following in late March. Well done to Cassi and the finance team getting this over the line.

We will be embarking upon an updated Strategic Community Plan which is required under legislation. This will give Council, the community and staff an opportunity to identify the key community drivers that will be the cornerstone of Council investment over the next 5 years. We will be holding two community engagement meetings. Please see details on page 6. We look forward to community and business involvement. It will be great to get community ideas on how Council, Shire staff and community members continue to progressively drive community investment.

We have a few new starters in the office. Nicole Thompson is taking 12 months leave and in her absence we have Fiona Jasper, welcome Fiona. We also welcome Peter Hall working as Project Manager on WFSN Project. The FRC has also welcomed new backpackers in early February.

All systems go on the sporting front. Bowls is back in full swing, swimming club is up and running again, the Roodogs and Roopups have taken to the cricket field in their new caps and this Saturday the Tennis Club are hosting a big day.

This is a recorded message and is updated with current harvest ban information

IN CASE OF FIRE RING 000

If there is a fire you must call 000 immediately. Shire of Kulin staff are unable to register the emergency.

PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All burning is prohibited from 1 November 2020 to 15 February 2021.

NO burning permits can be issued in this period.

TOTAL FIRE BAN

A Total Fire Ban is declared on days when fires are most likely to threaten lives and property. This is because of predicted extreme fire weather or when there are already widespread fires and firefighting resources are stretched.

Total Fire Bans are put in place by DFES.

KULIN OVAL WATERING

The Shire of Kulin wish to advise that the town oval is no longer being watered with re-use water. Access to the oval is no longer restricted.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by your local government and are put in place when your local Bushfire Control Officer identifies the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery as high bushfire risk activities, during particular times of the day.

2021 Townsite Roadworks

As you will be aware, there has been a mass of road construction on High Street, between Day Street and Johnston Street. Our contractors Key Civil have done a great job of the drainage install and have completed all the underground pipe work along High Street.

Pipes have now also been installed under Johnston Street to allow the water off High Street to continue through opposite the Community Hub which then connects to a new drainage pit located in the VDZ drain. Shortly Johnston Street will again be partly closed for the installation of a new culvert from outside the Woolshed across to the Public Toilets. This is additional works completed for Main Roads while we have the professionals available.

Over the next couple of weeks, we will be carting gravel into High Street to form the new road surface. We will still be required to leave up the fencing that is currently along High Street for the public's safety and for the safety of the Works crew.

High Street, CBH Access Road, Jilakin Road and areas of Johnston Street are scheduled to begin being bitumised on Monday the 8th of March. The roads will then be opened, so please drive to the posted speed limits. The roads will be closed again for asphalt application around Monday the 12th of April.

I would like to thank everybody for their patience and understanding during these interruptions. It has taken much time and effort to get these works to proceed and we are pleased with how they have progressed so far. It is a short time pain for long-term gain.

Contact Registers in Shire facilities

From 5 December 2020, Shire of Kulin is required to maintain mandatory contact registers for WA Health Department COVID-19 contact tracing. Individuals can either scan the SafeWA QR Code or manually sign in at each venue.

The following venues/buildings will have contact registers:

- Kulin Aquatic Centre and Waterslide
- Freebairn Recreation Centre
- Freebairn Recreation Centre Gym
- Kulin Memorial Hall
- Kulin Public Library (located at Kulin Post Office)

The WA Government has developed a free app, SafeWA, which is a digital contact register system. The SafeWA app can be downloaded from Apple App Store or Google Play. The app is not mandatory, and an alternative paper based system is also available.

-Failing to comply to the new requirements could result in fines and penalties of up to \$50,000 for an INDIVIDUAL and \$250,000 FOR A BODY CORPORATE or 12 months imprisonment.

- Any person aged 16 years and over who attends the facility, including patrons, staff, volunteers and contractors will be required to register their contact details. Records are not required to be collected for children under 16 years.

KULIN AQUATIC CENTRE AND WATERSLIDE

Interesting season we are having. As I'm writing this the weather is looking like it's going to drop a bit of rain, so hopefully we might get some in the dams around the place. The cooler summer has meant the pool hasn't been quite as busy as last season but still had some days with big numbers. Couple days up around 200 which is good to see. Still got a few early morning swimmers coming down which is good, and the tally of laps is climbing.

As mentioned in previous writeups I'm keeping a total town tally as well as individual tallies with the aim for individuals to swim from Cottesloe to Rottneest which is 19.7km or 788 laps in this pool. I'm here for encouragement as I look into my book of excuses as to why I'm not in the water. I'm sure the regulars have heard my excuses but I'm only into book 2 so have plenty more where they came from.

What I'm doing with all the laps is totalling them up and adding each year together to hopefully do

a full lap around Australia with laps swum. Last year as a town we swam from Kulin through Perth to roughly the Wooramel roadhouse, 120 odd km south of Carnarvon, so this is where we take off from this season. With 83 people having their names down for doing laps we are getting the tally up there and so far as a town we have swum 27014 laps this season which works out to 675 km. This takes us to Mardie station south of Karratha so huge effort from everyone so far. A few single efforts to mention so far are Bec with 2770 laps 69km, Jennie 2410 laps 60km, Clint 1732 laps 43km, Jacquie 1728 laps 43km, Tracy 1190 laps 30km and Tinny with 820 laps 20km. Great effort to the guys and everyone else who is taking part in the challenge.



Congrats to Liam, Bec and Dee on their Citizenship on the day, and big thanks to Edwina and Fiona for coming down and performing at the pool on the day. I think everyone enjoyed sitting back relaxing and listening to Edona Heartland. Will be doing it again soon hopefully.

That's it from down here for now. Hopefully it warms up again through February and March, and I hope to you see you down here.

The readings will be taken on the roadside or along existing tracks by field crews mounted on quad bikes. To get the required coverage from time to time the crews will need to access paddocks within the survey area. The joint venture has engaged DAISHSAT to conduct the survey. DAISHSAT will follow our standard practice of cleaning their vehicles of burrs and seeds between paddocks to prevent seeds from spreading. They will leave gates as they find them and are fully insured for the works. The gravity survey is due to commence in mid to late January 2021. The location of the survey within your area is shown on the map below with the quad bike set-up.
