



CEO CORNER

Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2021.

Our community engagement process for the updated Integrated Planning and Reporting required for 20/21 was kick started this week. We held a Business Workshop on Tuesday the 23rd of February with a Community Workshop scheduled for Thursday the 4th of March. There will also be a community survey issued in the coming weeks. All information gathered will go towards updating our Strategic Community Plan and identifying specific initiatives for inclusion within the Corporate Business Plan.

If your community organisation has an event or an AGM coming up in the next few months, please let me know. I would be more than interested in attending to learn how Council, the Shire and your organisation can work together to continue to develop this progressive community. So far in 2021 I've met with Kulin Bush Races and Blazing Swan to get an understanding of the processes required for COVID and wider event planning. I've also had discussions with KKFC and will be attending the KKHC AGM in the coming weeks.

Shire staff are continuing to deliver and finalise planning for the projects funded via COVID and drought money. This includes:

- Townsite street reconstruction.
- Aquatic Centre amenities improvements.
- FRC Court Replacement
- FRC audio visual equipment upgrade.
- CCTV.
- Town footpaths.
- All Ages Precinct.

Unfortunately, last week at Council Meeting our 2019/20 Audit was delayed by the OAG who is still finalising their review. This will ultimately push back our Annual Electors Meeting a further month or so. Once we get the all clear we will hold a Special Council Meeting to accept the Audit and finally determine a date for the Annual Electors Meeting.

From a Council perspective we were informed of Cr Brad Taylor's resignation from Council the week prior to February's Council Meeting. Reluctantly Council accepted his resignation from Central Ward and will govern with 8 remaining Councillors until the next Local Government Elections in October this year. On behalf of Council and the community I would like to thank Cr Taylor for his input on Council for a number of years. He has been a very

passionate councillor for the whole Shire and particularly for the community of Pingaring and Central Ward. He has been particularly proactive on the issues of water security in the eastern sections of the Shire where he has worked with staff and government agencies to develop new strategic water resources. Personally I have found Cr Taylor to provide constructive feedback and ask tough questions as required.

On a staff note, congratulations to Annette Lewis who ticked over 20 years at the Shire last week. Another example of fantastic service to the Shire and wider community. I know Annette is very passionate about her role with Kulin Retirement Homes and always bounces into the office full of chirp. We had a small gathering with Annette to celebrate with her the other week. We look forward to her MOCHA cake when she returns from holidays.

The summer sports season is reaching the business end. KDHS are holding their Swimming Faction Carnival this Friday, good luck to all involved. Country Week Bowls takes place this long weekend in what I'm sure will be a crackerjack event, good luck gents.

Postal voting

Early voting (by post) is made available at all State elections but is important in 2021 for those who may be uncertain about casting their ballot in person.

An application for a postal vote can be completed electronically on the Commission's website (https://www.elections.wa.gov.au/postal-vote-apply) or a printed form can be requested by contacting the Commission on 13 63 06 and selecting option 2. Ballot papers will be posted to electors from Monday 22 February 2021. If posted by the elector on or before polling day, completed postal packages can be accepted via mail until 9:00am on the Thursday following polling day.

Early voting (in person)

The WA Electoral Commission is working closely with the WA Department of Health to manage the risks around COVID-19 at the 2021 election, but the constantly changing situation means the WA Electoral Commission cannot plan the lead-up to and the actual election with absolute certainty. Most importantly, the WA Electoral Commission is encouraging everyone who has concerns about attending a polling place on election day to vote prior to election day, either by postal vote or at an early voting centre.

HARVEST BAN INFORMATION LINE 9880 1511

This is a recorded message and is updated with current harvest ban information

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by your local government and are put in place when your local Bushfire Control Officer identifies the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery as high bushfire risk activities, during particular times of the day.

Kulin Shire will distribute this information via SMS and the harvest ban information line.

TOTAL FIRE BAN

A Total Fire Ban is declared on days when fires are most likely to threaten lives and property. This is because of predicted extreme fire weather or when there are already widespread fires and firefighting resources are stretched.

Total Fire Bans are put in place by DFES.

IN CASE OF FIRE RING 000

If there is a fire you must call 000 immediately. Shire of Kulin staff are unable to register the emergency.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

Burning is restricted from 16 Feb 2021 to 15 March 2021.

KULIN OVAL WATERING

The Shire of Kulin wish to advise that the town oval is no longer being watered with re-use water. Access to the oval is no longer restricted.

Contact Registers in Shire facilities

From 5 December 2020, Shire of Kulin is required to maintain mandatory contact registers for WA Health Department COVID-19 contact tracing.

Individuals can either scan the SafeWA QR Code or manually sign in at each venue.

The following venues/buildings will have contact registers:

- Kulin Aquatic Centre and Waterslide
- Freebairn Recreation Centre
- Freebairn Recreation Centre Gym
- Kulin Memorial Hall
- Kulin Public Library (located at Kulin Post Office)

The WA Government has developed a free app, SafeWA, which is a digital contact register system. The SafeWA app can be downloaded from Apple App Store or Google Play. The app is not mandatory, and an alternative paper based system is also be available.

- -Failing to comply to the new requirements could result in fines and penalties of up to \$50,000 for an INDIVIDUAL and \$250,000 FOR A BODY CORPORATE or 12 months imprisonment.
- Any person aged 16 years and over who attends the facility, including patrons, staff, volunteers and contractors will be required to register their contact details. Records are not required to be collected for children under 16 years.



KULIN DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOL

There are several exciting things for everyone to look forward to this Term. The Faction Swimming Carnival on the 26th of February, Mental Health Training in First Aid for High School students and staff in week 7, and the High School Belongingness Camp in week 8.

Kulin District High Schools New Teachers

Eliza Edinger graduated High School in 2011 and spent her gap year volunteering in Tanzania (Africa) teaching Maths and English to orphans. This was where she found her love for teaching children. So in 2016 she moved to Melbourne and started her Teaching degree. After graduating in 2020, Miss Edinger moved back to Perth and was hired by KDHS in the fifth week of School Term 4. Her first impressions of Kulin were that it was extremely hot, a very small town and she couldn't believe there was no pharmacy. Miss Edinger found her first weeks daunting because everyone knew each other and she felt like an outsider, as everyone knew what Eliza was here for but no one really knew who she was.





Special Resolution: Proposed Amendment to the Constitution




