CEO CORNER

Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2021. Easter, School Holidays and Blazing Swan have been and gone. There seems to be plenty of tourists passing through town and checking out our quirky tourist offerings as they venture around the wider wheatbelt.

The farmers of the district welcomed a significant rainfall event on Sunday 11th April, brought about via the weather systems associated with TC Seroja. Whilst many communities suffered significant infrastructure damage fortunately the Shire of Kulin was spared any major issues. The rain brought some welcome runoff and presented opportune conditions for seeding to commence. Two good rainfall events in March and April have certainly provided a more optimistic start than in recent seasons.

From an operational level we were a bit light on for staff numbers during school holidays, as many staff members took the opportunity to spend some time with their families. These present challenging times to maintain appropriate levels of service, however the cooperation and planning of staff enabled us to provide adequate coverage, albeit somewhat reduced. Hopefully this wasn't too much of an inconvenience to the community, however if there has been a delay in receiving the required

information or service, we are back to nearly a full compliment of staff this week so please contact the relevant staff member.

Like many workplaces we balance the challenges of providing flexible employment opportunities for working families, particularly for a large percentage of our administration staff. Providing such opportunities is vital for both our business, the wider community and the individual families. Balancing challenges in such situations is something that all our staff are mindful of and is generally undertaken in an open and respectful manner amongst the staff to achieve mutual outcomes whilst maintaining adequate service levels. In short it is the lot of a modern day workplace, that all staff and wider stakeholders, just have to deal with and respectfully manage. People stepping up to new roles, or providing coverage for staff, presents professional development opportunities and is widely appreciated.

Around town the major road construction works are nearing completion. The hotmix and kerbing have gone down on High Street, with the paving nearly complete. Sealing of CBH Road and Jilakin Street continues to be delayed by the weather, but this should be happening soon. Remedial repair works are also underway at the Aquatic Centre to reseal expansion joints and tile joints, remove broken wall tiles and regrout, remove, seal and reinstall anchor bolts and install hydrostatic valves. We have recently completed the installation of CCTV in three locations along Johnson Street to improve safety and security for businesses and residents. Works will also commence on refurbishing the public toilets of the VDZ which are in need of a renovation and a refresh.

Winter sport is cranking up. The KKFC Blues have played their first 2 games, Kulin Golf Club has its opening day on Sunday, with KKHC Vipers commencing this weekend and Kulin NC starting up soon as well.

As always plenty happening in Kulin, until next time safe travels.






RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

Burning is permitted until 19th September 2021.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by your local government and are put in place when your local Bushfire Control Officer identifies the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery as high bushfire risk activities, during particular times of the day.

Kulin Shire will distribute this information via SMS and the harvest ban information line.

TOTAL FIRE BAN

A Total Fire Ban is declared on days when fires are most likely to threaten lives and property. This is because of predicted extreme fire weather or when there are already widespread fires and firefighting resources are stretched.

Total Fire Bans are put in place by DFES.

HARVEST BAN INFORMATION LINE 9880 1511

This is a recorded message and is updated with current harvest ban information

IN CASE OF FIRE RING 000

If there is a fire you must call 000 immediately. Shire of Kulin staff are unable to register the emergency.

KULIN OVAL WATERING

The Shire of Kulin wish to advise that the town oval is no longer being watered with re-use water. Access to the oval is no longer restricted.

Contact Registers in Shire facilities

From 5 December 2020, Shire of Kulin is required to maintain mandatory contact registers for WA Health Department COVID-19 contact tracing. Individuals can either scan the SafeWA QR Code or manually sign in at each venue.

The following venues/buildings will have contact registers:

- Kulin Aquatic Centre and Waterslide
- Freebairn Recreation Centre
- Freebairn Recreation Centre Gym
- Kulin Memorial Hall
- Kulin Public Library (located at Kulin Post Office)

The WA Government has developed a free app, SafeWA, which is a digital contact register system. The SafeWA app can be downloaded from Apple App Store or Google Play. The app is not mandatory, and an alternative paper based system is also available.

-Failing to comply to the new requirements could result in fines and penalties of up to \$50,000 for an INDIVIDUAL and \$250,000 FOR A BODY CORPORATE or 12 months imprisonment.

- Any person aged 16 years and over who attends the facility, including patrons, staff, volunteers and contractors will be required to register their contact details. Records are not required to be collected for children under 16 years.

The Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) was established in 1921, building on the foundations laid by its forerunner, the Australian Flying Corps, during the First World War. Ever since, the RAAF has played a vital role in Australia's military operations. From the Second World War, through Korea, Borneo, Malaya, Vietnam, the Persian Gulf and Afghanistan to peacekeeping and humanitarian operations, air force personnel have earned the respect of Australians and people around the world.

HISTORY IN FOCUS

FIGHTER COMMAND

The Royal Air Force's (RAF) Fighter Command was established in 1936. Its most well-known campaign was the Battle of Britain, when Germany sought to destroy the RAF in preparation for a seaborne invasion of England in 1940. Up to thirty-five Australians served in Fighter Command during the battle, which one remembered as, 'a blur of twisting machines and tracer bullets'.

After defeating the German Air Force - the Luftwaffe - over England, Fighter Command began offensive sweeps to occupied France and continued to defend against German raids on Britain's south coast. In the second half of 1942 its aircraft began escorting United States bombers on daylight raids, but their limited range restricted British fighters to the English Channel and a small area of western Europe.

In 1943 Fighter Command was disbanded and divided into the Air Defence of Great Britain (ADGB) and the Second Tactical Air Force. In June 1944 ADGB supported Operation Overlord, the Allied invasion of German-occupied France. In October it was renamed Fighter Command. The new Fighter Command's

operations included risky attacks on German flying-bomb launch sites in western Europe. A pilot wrote about the dangerous raids: 'We charged, skimming the ground at ten or twelve feet ... the flak had ... our range ... Five posts immediately caught me in their cross fire ... I got three direct hits ... All I could hope for was to save my own skin'.

Fighter Command raided German airfields both day and night. After Overlord the command's aircraft began operating from north-west Europe, remaining in action until Germany's surrender.

Almost 4000 members of Fighter Command were killed and some 1200 were wounded during the war. After the war, Fighter Command took on a defensive role against the possibility of a Soviet air attack on England. In 1968 Fighter Command was combined with Bomber Command to form Strike Command.

KULIN WILDFLOWER SOCIETY

DETECTIVES NEEDED: to find, photo and report a gold-glimmer butterfly on a spiky shrub with yellow pea flowers. Researchers are visiting 21-22 APRIL looking for it and other pollinators Corrigin-Kulin-Tincurrin-Harrismith. Rod Eastwood is a butterfly specialist. Fred and Jean Hort are brilliant nature researchers, photographers and inspiring communicators. Being ex-chalkies they encompass every aspect of nature. We shall be asking them to talk and walk with us in the spring. *Daviesia angulata* is pretty drab and spiky most of the year but when flowering it is critical to this butterfly.

ORCHID DRAWCARDS The phone is running hot with "Is it out yet?" and "Where?"



Can you see the 15 Pygmy Orchids amongst the bark? Usually in loamy-clay under Gimlet, Kondinin-Blackbutt, Morrell and Wandoo gums. So easy to step on, a fine green 10-25cm stem, with many tiny green 2-3 mm flowers and occasionally with pink or black ones.



We only saw 2 Pygmy Orchids at Gnarming last year. Can you find some around Kulin? The WANOSCGs & we have found them Corrigin-Kondinin-Karlgarin in recent years. They also grow from Gnowangerup to Eucla and South Australia. New name: *Corunastylis fuscoviridis*, old *C. tepperi*.

Come and join the Kulin Wildflower Branch as a member or friend. No-one gets paid but the rewards are unending, lots of exercise, the joy of discovery and querying how our plants are designed. Each species is unique. Best of all you engage with people of all ages from all walks of life and they are amazed at how we grow their food. Even 8 year olds have the confidence to give scientific talks.

ARE YOU A CYCLIST? Come and chat with **thirty** cyclists from Cycle Touring Australia WA on their Grain-Silo-Art-Tour. They are on a 1238 km ride York-Gnowangerup-Ravensthorpe-Merredin-York over 19 days plus 3 rest days. They carry all their own camping gear with no support vehicles!!! 72km a day is 71km too much for me. They'll ride to the Macrocarpa Trail but walk around as they can't get sand in the chains. **WHEN: SATURDAY mid-late-afternoon, 1 MAY at the Caravan Park and MACROCARPA Trail.**


