# CEO CORNER

---

Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2021. Hopefully most of you will have seen the Community Strategic Planning Survey that Council is undertaking as part of our Integrated Planning and Reporting process. Information gathered from this survey will be vital for informing Council of key community priorities in the coming years. Topics and items raised in the survey have been identified in a number of ways including utilising information from our existing IPR documents, feedback from Business and Community Workshops, Council discussion as well as day-to-day queries and requests that both Councillors and staff receive. Whilst the questions and potential answers might not be everyone's desire they are designed to be thought provoking and highlight key issues to be resolved within the community. In some instance they have been intended to "rip the band aid off" per se, and gain direct feedback of what community sentiment is towards specific issues. From this information staff and Council can further investigate potential financial impacts and report this information back

to the community for further informed decision making. Well done to Judd and the crew for sealing of Jilakin Street and CBH Access Road this week, just before the rain. These have been significant projects around Kulin's CBH Receival Point to improve the transport infrastructure and safety for heavy vehicles. Intersection works on the Lake Grace Road for both of these streets will be put back until the new financial year to ensure all compliance with Main Roads requirements and to finalise their specific budgets. No doubt this week's rainfall following up on other events the past month will produce ideal conditions for seeding. Hopefully a couple of days of steady rain will produce some much needed runoff. Harry Hodgson has been regularly checking the levels of the recently installed Pingaring Dam and it now has 2m in it. With more runoff expected, hopefully this resource will be available for potentially tougher drier conditions down the track. Despite recent COVID restrictions over the ANZAC Day long weekend, we have still seen an influx of tourists through town. The Caravan Park and RV area

have been busy and various tourist groups have made Kulin their destination of choice of the past month. A big congratulations to Phil Roads for his Hole in One at the Kulin Golf Club last Sunday. Phil has been a tireless worker around the club for many years, not to mention a handy golfer as well. He always welcomes new members and provides respectful advice for those learning the game. Congratulations Phil for many years of dedication to your craft. I believe Phil was also lucky enough to be drawn out for Chase the Ace at the Hub last Friday. Good luck with Lotto this weekend Phil! On a personal note thank to the community volunteers from Kulin Bush Races who assisted with running the bar for mine and Tenille's wedding. A thank you to all other local friends and community members who helped out in any such way at some stage. We were fortunate to host our Reception at the FRC which provided an awesome venue for family and friends to celebrate, a big thank you to the relevant venue staff involved as well. ## LOCAL ROADWORKS


As you might be aware we were able to complete our sealing works on the CBH Access Road and Jilakin Street on Monday, just in time before the big wet! You will still notice that at the end of Jilakin Street there is a portion of the road not sealed. This is due to the upgrade of the intersection that joins Lake Grace Road which has been held up for various reasons. This section will be completed after winter grading. There will be signs left on that section over the winter period.

High Street is now complete and Tuesdays rains were a real test. The drainage seemed to handle it very well even though there was some water pooling in some spots, it did clear quickly. We do have a couple of spots that we will require the asphalt level to be lowered outside the Community Hub to remove the puddle there. With the recent rains we have seen all the dams around town filled to capacity, except the main oval dam. This dam has over 3m of water run in, which puts

us with more about a metre of water in the dam than we started with this time last year. I can assure you that there is no-one more pleased to see the end of the works around town than me and thank you to everyone for their patience over the past 4 months.

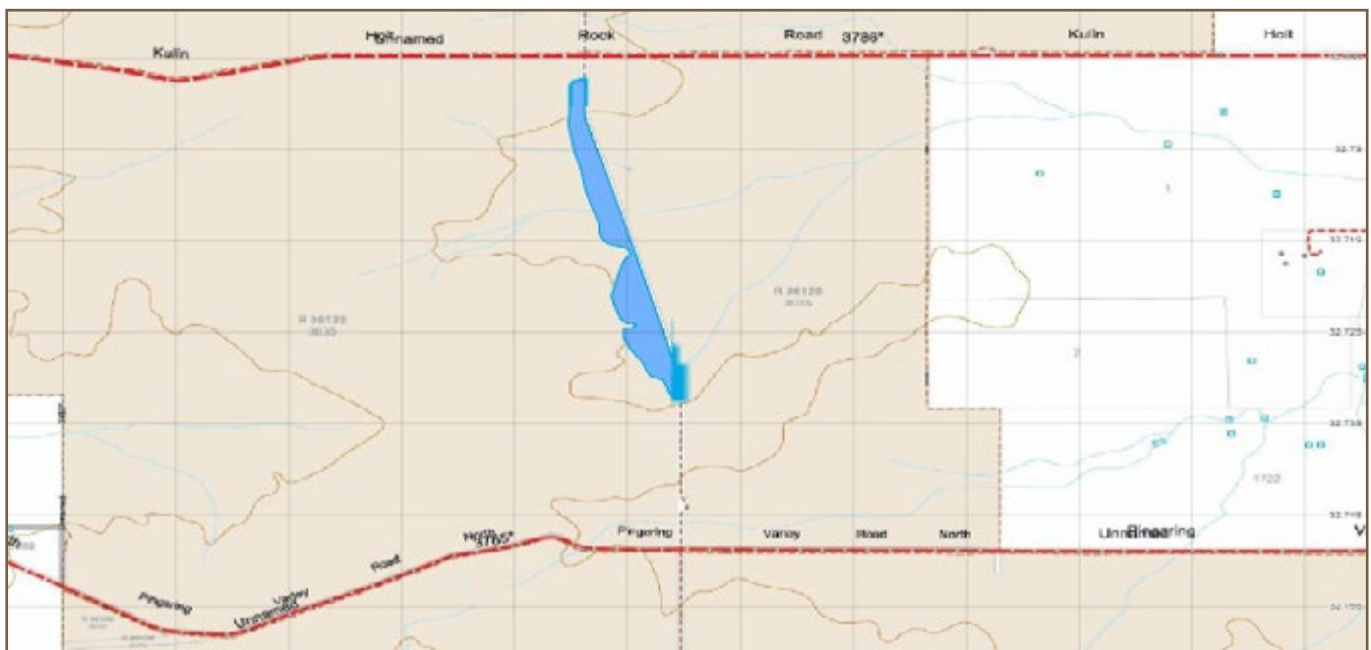
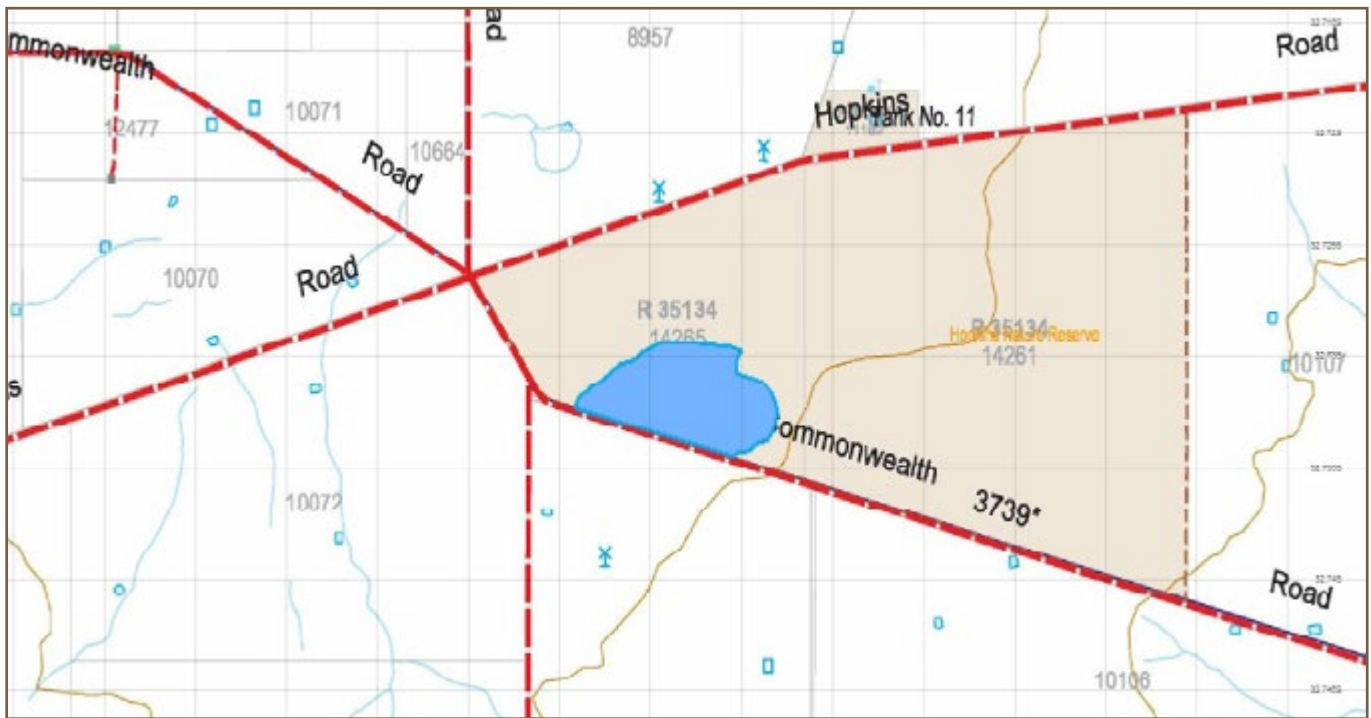


# NOTICES FROM THE SHIRE OF KULIN

## Contact Registers in Shire facilities

From 5 December 2020, Shire of Kulin is required to maintain mandatory contact registers for WA Health Department COVID-19 contact tracing. Individuals can either scan the SafeWA QR Code or manually sign in at each venue.

The following venues/buildings will have contact registers:

- Kulin Aquatic Centre and Waterslide
- Freebairn Recreation Centre
- Freebairn Recreation Centre Gym
- Kulin Memorial Hall
- Kulin Public Library (located at Kulin Post Office)

The WA Government has developed a free app, SafeWA, which is a digital contact register system. The SafeWA app can be downloaded from Apple App Store or Google Play. The app is not mandatory, and an alternative paper based system is also available.

-Failing to comply to the new requirements could result in fines and penalties of up to \$50,000 for an INDIVIDUAL and \$250,000 FOR A BODY CORPORATE or 12 months imprisonment.

- Any person aged 16 years and over who attends the facility, including patrons, staff, volunteers and contractors will be required to register their contact details. Records are not required to be collected for children under 16 years.

## ANZAC address regarding Reginald Arthur George Davies By Bev Stanes

I have the honour of speaking about the WWI contribution of my maternal grandfather, Reg Davies. Much of the information I share with you, is attributed to the research of my cousin, Debbie Payne (nee Davies), Neville and Margaret's daughter, and Reg's granddaughter.

My grandfather Reginald Arthur George Davies was born on 20 September 1897 in Guildford, Western Australia. He was the youngest son of William George Davies, a Guildford butcher, and Annie Florence Whiteman, a daughter of one of the local Whiteman families. Reg had an older brother and two sisters. Being an athletic young man, he won a sporting scholarship to Christian Brothers College. As a Boy Scout in 1914, he was also awarded WA Under 18 Champion for both the 100- and 440-yards Running events. We also have records from the WA Amateur Swimming Association showing that he completed the Swim Through Perth on January 16th, 1915 in 2 hours 13 minutes.

At the age of 18 and a half, Reg applied to enlist at Black Boy Hill located at the foot of the Darling Ranges, east of Perth. Reg's son Neville said his father joined the war because while he was travelling on a train, he was

given a white feather by a woman. In those days, the white feather signified that the person giving it to you saw you as a coward. The application contained the following details about Reg: 18 years 6 months, junior clerk, 5 foot 4 inches, 145 lbs, chest 36 inches, dark complexion, brown eyes, and dark hair. He listed his mother as his next of kin.

On 10 April 1916, Reg's application was accepted, and he joined the 8th Battalion, AIF (Western Australia) 7th Infantry Brigade. The blue and white diamond were the 28th Battalion colours. The 7th Infantry Brigade was formed in early 1915 from battalions recruited in the "outer states" and became the 3rd Brigade of the 2nd Australian Division. It consisted of the 25th and 26th (Queensland), 27th (South Australia) and 28th (WA).

Reg's older brother Percy also enlisted in April. Percy was 24 years old and married a month later in May 1916. Percy enlisted with the 44th Infantry Battalion and left Fremantle on 6th June 1916. His battalion took part in the fighting at Gallipoli.

On 26 September 1916 and at the young age of 19, Reg was one of 152 reinforcements sent to join the 28th Infantry Battalion. They sailed from Fremantle on the Ship HMT A52 Surada. The draft consisted of 2 officers and 150 men of various ranks.

About 2 months later, on 20 November 1916, the reinforcements disembarked at Plymouth, England. On 22 December, they left Folkstone, England and proceeded to France on the HMT Princess Clementine. They joined their unit on 17th January 1917. The 28th Battalion fought most of the major battles on the Western Front including Poziers, Flers, Warlencourt, Lagnicourt, Bullecourt, Third Ypres, Morlancourt, Amiens, and Mont St Quentin. For many of the major battles of 1917, the 28th found itself in supporting roles. At the second battle of Bullecourt, the 28th provided reinforcements and were involved in heavy fighting. The 28th went on to attack as part of the third phase at the Battle of Menin Road, capturing its objectives in seven minutes, and was in reserve during the capture of Broodseinde Ridge. The battalion was also in reserve for the battle of Poelcappelle on 9th October, but with the attack floundering in the mud, it soon became embroiled in the fighting. On 7th January 1918 at just over 20 years of age, Reg was appointed Lance Corporal. Between 2 and 23 February 1918, Reg enjoyed a period of leave which he spent in England. Family photos show that he visited his mother's family (the Whitemans) in Hove with his brother Percy. Many years later, Reg told his daughter Dawn that he was not impressed to find that his brother wanted to spend his entire leave time, drinking!

In April 1918, the 28th fought to turn back the German spring offensive and on 1 June 1918, Reg was promoted to temporary Corporal.

In his book "The Blue and White Diamonds 28th Battalion", Neville Browning describes some of their exploits.

On 5th June 1918, the 28th relieved the 19th in the line east of Morlancourt. On 10th June there was an attack on the trench system. Neville Browning describes in his book how during the Morlancourt battle, at midnight on 9th and 10th June an enemy party advanced and attacked a barricade built by the 28th Battalion. A party under Lance Corporal R Davies opened fire, killing the German commander, and forcing the withdrawal of the enemy. For his actions on 10 and 11th June, Reg was awarded the Military Medal Field France.

The citation reads:

"During operations at Morlancourt, near Albert, on the night of 10/11th June, this NCO was a member of a carrying party. After having made two trips under heavy shell fire, to the captured objective, he volunteered for a bombing attack with another party and did excellent work in assisting to repulse a German bombing attack. He then carried a wounded sergeant back to the RAP, a distance of one mile."

My grandfather was a small man so

this would have been an arduous task.

Reg was one of ten soldiers awarded the Military Medal for gallantry during the operations of Morlancourt. Overall, there were a total of seventy awarded to members of the 28th Battalion.

Major Mitchell submitted his monthly report, part of which stated: "Considering the amount of work all ranks accomplished under trying conditions, added to the unusual amount of strafing they have done and had to endure, the successful operations they have carried through and participated in, besides consolidating and improving trenches and captured positions at a most critical stage in the Western Operations, this battalion may well claim to have worthily assisted in building up and upholding the high reputation now enjoyed by the Australian troops and there is every reason to believe that this high standard will be maintained." (p. 405 Browning, The Blue and White Diamond 28th Battalion)

From the 8th of August 1918, the 28th Battalion participated in the joint British and French offensive that marked the beginning of Germany's defeat. The battalion was prominent in fighting to secure crossing points over the Somme River around Peronne, and in advance beyond Mont St Quentin.

On 27 September 1918, Reg was promoted to Corporal. This was exactly a week after his 21st birthday. The 28th's last actions of the war were fought as part of the effort to break through the Beaurevoir Line in the first week of October 1918. The first members of the battalion began returning to Australia in January and the 28th was disbanded in March 1919. The 7th Australian Infantry Brigade had the dubious honour of having the highest rate of casualties among the fifteen infantry brigades of the AIF. The 28th Battalion had the 5th highest casualty rate of the AIF with 787 killed and 2241 wounded (including those who were gassed).

My grandfather returned to Australia on the ship, the Winhok, and disembarking on 7th August 1919. He was discharged on 22nd October of that same year.

Although life was extremely difficult for the soldiers, there was a small amount of time for respite and during one of these periods, Reg took part in an Australian Rules Football competition for which he was awarded Fairest and Best. The medal he was given for this game is one of my brother Grant's proudest possessions, a wonderful keepsake of our grandfather.

Reg could not see himself returning to an office job. His previous job had been as

a junior clerk in the Supreme Court. As a result, he took up land at Jilakin under the War Service Settlement Scheme.

He named the farm Morlancourt after the place where he earned his Military Medal.

In 1931, Reg married Katherine Bessie Bullock from Kulin and they had 4 children – Dawn (my mother), Kenneth, Neville, and Donald (who with wife Sandra, their sons, daughter -in-law and grandchildren still live in Kulin). Reg rarely spoke about his personal experiences in the war although my cousin Debbie (Neville's daughter) has very fond memories as a young child of driving around the farm with Grandfather

Reg singing songs such as "It's a Long Way to Tipperary."

This presentation has been basically about my grandfather's war service, but I would not do him justice if I did not give you some sense of him as a person.

Mr grandfather Reg was a long serving member of the RSL and gave the ANZAC Day address at Kulin for many years. In 1957 he was awarded a Certificate for Service by the State Executive of the RSL and Airman's Imperial League of Australia, having been a member since 1923 and President in the years 1929-30, 1940 and 1951. Reg loved talking about politics and I do remember him trying to share with me, details about what led to the war. Despite

his enthusiasm, the very mention of the Dardanelles, made my eyes glaze over. How I wished I had listened now!

As a person, Reg was always kind and generous and loved keeping fit and healthy. He used to race my sister Les and me along the beach when he was in his seventies and we were in our teens. We struggled to keep up! Despite experiencing the horrors of war, he did not allow this to influence his outlook on life which was always positive.

My Mum Dawn, as well as other family members, are proudly wearing copies of Reg's military medals today. Like so many others who served our country, he is not forgotten.

# PETA VERCO - INDUCTED INTO...

In honour to the achievements of Peta Verco, a former Kulin local, we would like to acknowledge the athlete's career and motivation. This is her story, written by her sister-in-law Sharyn Cook:

"Peta Verco (nee Cook) was awarded at the Laurie Sawle medal night by the WA Cricket Association at the Crown Ballroom, Crown Perth on the 21st of April 2021 (Please see picture below).

Peta was inducted into the 'Gallery of Greats' and will have signage at the Optus Stadium and WACCA. Michael Hussey and Karen Read were also inducted into the Gallery of Greats. Peta grew up in Kulin and

attended Kulin District High School from Year 1 to Year 10. She did not get to play cricket, as that was what the boys played. The sport she mainly played in Kulin was tennis, winning the Kulin Tennis Club Singles Championship at the age of 15 years in 1971. It was not until Peta was 18 years of age and living in Perth and attending Teachers College, that she found out that women could play cricket and started playing cricket competitively.

Peta started playing in the U/21 & the W.A. Women's Cricket team at 18 years, playing in the W.A. state team from 1974 until 1984. She also played in the Australian Cricket team from 1977 to 1985, playing in Test matches and winning 2 World Cups. In those days, Peta had to finance

her cricket career. There was no payment or sponsorship like today. Peta has worked as a Physical Education teacher for 41 years at various schools, including at John Forest Secondary College, a sport specialist school for 16 years. In 2011 to 2013, she had organised school groups from John Forest Senior College to come to Kulin to coach various sports at the Kulin District High school as part of their education.

Peta said it was often a 'culture shock' for these Perth students to come to Kulin (no MacDonald's!), but they thoroughly enjoyed Kulin for the great sporting facilities, community spirit and the friendliness of everyone."

## Peta Verco (nee Cook)

b. 2 March 1956

Player, Coach, Administrator



A product of regional Western Australia, Peta went on to become the states most capped female Test cricketer. She made her Test debut against India in Perth in 1977 as a medium pace bowler, batting at number nine and later became a compact right hand opener while a shoulder injury resulted in her becoming an off-spin bowler. Peta's first century in Women's first-class matches, 100 not out against Queensland in 1979, was the first by a WA player in women's first class cricket. In 13 Tests she scored 765 runs at 40.26 and her highest score – 105 against India in Ahmedabad – came in a four-Test series where she averaged 61.16. Peta also claimed 21 Test wickets at 23.42 and played 20 one-day internationals, winning two World Cups in 1978 and 1982.

Peta was a stalwart of the Western Australian team for over a decade, many of them as captain, scoring 1956 runs at 29.33 and capturing 65 wickets at 26.08. She also captained and coached several women's clubs in Perth and was a leading administrator within the sport. Her outstanding contribution to the game saw her awarded Honorary Life membership of the MCC (Lords) in 2017, the fifth Australian woman to be accorded the honour. Peta Verco was awarded WACA Honorary Life Membership in 2017.

PETA VERCO'S (nee Cook) speech at the Laurie Sawle Medal Night by the WA Cricket Association at the Crown ballroom, Crown Perth on the 21st April 2021:

"Thanks Adam for those kind words. I am absolutely honoured to receive this award and I would like to thank the Gallery of Greats Selection Committee for this nomination.

Also I would like to thank Christine Matthews who has put women's cricket on the map in WA, So, thank you.

Growing up on a wheat & sheep farm at Kulin, south-east of Perth we would listen to the test matches & shield matches on the radio, not on TV. So I only knew men played cricket. I was 15 years old before I knew women played cricket. I came through an era where I wasn't allowed to play cricket at school because girls didn't do that.

The people who have played a large part in my career: My late parents who encouraged me to be successful at whatever I chose. Thanks for funding my cricket trips, equipment & uniforms at the beginning.

My brother Paul who has made the trip down from the farm tonight. We used to play test matches Aust Vs South Africa. Dad made our cricket bats out of jarrah. They were never light!! So Paul - thank you for bowling all those overs to me. I even thought you had to contend with wet slobber on the ball from my sheep dog. Games lasted until the dog gave up fetching the ball.

I had various coaches over time but those who had an impact on my career were:

Norm O'Neill who taught me how to play off the back foot.

Bruce Yardley helped with my bowling. Mainly we coached ourselves - no YouTube!!!

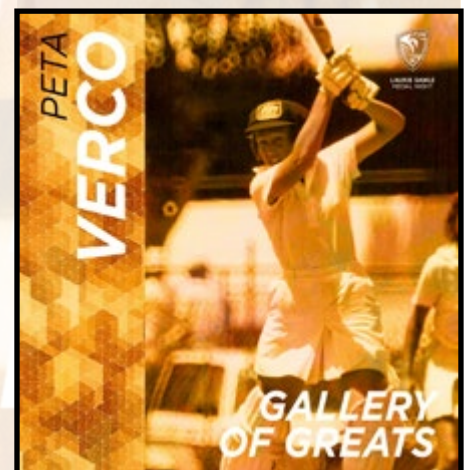
The Women's Cricket Association who assisted me in starting up various teams, in coaching, in particular Lyn Hollingsworth's who introduced me to game, Clare Papersergio who has worked on many committees to promote women's cricket.

Most of all would like to thank my husband Murray for his support

and advice he gave me along the way and for putting up with me, as I followed my dream of playing cricket at the highest level. Murray toured India with us, which was special as he saw my first test century. Our children: Corry, who was dragged along to games as a toddler. So it was easy to see what sport he was going to play; and Belinda who never saw me play - which she might think was lucky as her U/10 career ended with, "Mum cricket is a boring game." Netball took over.

Even though cricket was not financially rewarding, the sense of achievement and the life-long friendships forged have made it all worthwhile. So girls - follow your dreams.
