Propped open pool gates and faulty latches are a leading cause of drowning deaths in young children.

It only takes seconds for a child to drown, so regularly check that the latch is working and **never prop the pool gate open**.

Owners and occupiers are responsible for keeping the pool gate closed and maintained.

Remember...

-  **Don't prop the gate open.** Keeping it closed will help prevent young children from drowning – a gate that is propped open will not.
-  **Keep the pool gate maintained** and make sure it is self-closing and self-latching.
-  **ALWAYS supervise** young children around swimming and spa pools.

Rules for Pools and Spas: A guide to the requirements for safety barriers in Western Australia

Section 1: Introduction

This publication is intended as **general guidance**, primarily for owners and occupiers, on the safety barrier requirements for swimming and spa pools in Western Australia within the:

- Building Regulations 2012 (the Regulations);
- Building Code of Australia, being the Volumes One and Two of the National Construction Code (Building Code); and
- relevant referenced Australian Standards.

It is not appropriate to rely on this publication as legal advice or for the purpose of demonstrating compliance or non-compliance with the pool safety laws.

'Rules for Pools and Spas' was initially developed following a report tabled in the Western Australian Parliament in 2002 by the Standing Committee on Environment and Public Affairs in relation to 'Swimming Pool Fencing' which, among other things, recommended a user-friendly guide on the requirements in the Regulations and relevant Australian Standards.

This edition of 'Rules for Pools and Spas' replaces the previous 2016 edition. It introduces a new format that outlines one set of rules applicable to all swimming and spa pools and, where relevant, specific alternatives for older swimming and spa pools (pre-May 2016 and pre-November 2001).

Legislation that mandates the installation of safety barriers is intended to protect children under the age of five (young children) by restricting their access to the area containing the swimming or spa pool.

Safety barriers form part of a broad strategy, to prevent and reduce deaths of young children by drowning, that primarily relies upon adult supervision. Other important elements include public education, safety barrier inspections, water familiarisation, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and first aid.

Statistics

Drowning is a leading cause of accidental death for young children.

For Western Australia, in the 10-year period between July 2012 and June 2022, there were 19 fatal drowning incidents and 174 non-fatal drownings recorded for young children in swimming and spa pools. Reference: [RLSSWA Drowning Report 2022](#).

The percentage of young children who have died by drowning in swimming and spa pools has reduced over time. This has been largely attributed to the introduction of safety barrier requirements and community education initiatives.

From January 1988 to December 1996 there was an average of 4.9 drowning deaths per year, whereas from July 2012 to June 2022 there was an average of 1.9 drowning deaths per year. The difference between average drowning deaths is more significant when the increase of both the population and number of swimming and spa pools is considered.

Rules for Pools and Spas: A guide to the requirements for safety barriers in Western Australia

Section 1: Introduction

What is a swimming or spa pool?

For the purposes of this publication, swimming and spa pool means:

Any excavation or structure containing water and principally used, or that is designed, manufactured or adapted to be principally used, for swimming, wading, paddling or the like, including a wading pool or spa pool, which has the capacity to contain water that is more than 30 cm deep and is associated with:

- a) a Class 1a building; or
- b) less than 30 sole-occupancy units in a Class 2 building; or
- c) a Class 4 part of a building.

Class 1a – Single dwelling such as a detached house, row house, terrace house, town house or villa unit.

Class 2 – Building containing two or more separate dwellings such as apartments.

Class 4 – A part of a building that is a sole dwelling or residence within a building of a non-residential nature such as a caretaker's residence connected to a shop or office.

Information on building classifications can be found in the Building Code which is freely available from the [Australian Building Codes Board \(ABCB\)](#).

Swimming and spa pools include above-ground, in-ground and portable swimming and spa pools, but not spa baths. A spa bath is typically located within a bathroom and only filled immediately prior to being used then drained after each use.

Swimming and spa pools that are not covered by the above (such as public swimming pools) are generally controlled under the ['Health \(Aquatic Facilities\) Regulations 2007'](#). More information can be found in the ['Code of practice for the design, operation, management and maintenance of aquatic facilities'](#) available from the Department of Health (WA).

When do you need a safety barrier?

All swimming and spa pools that have a depth of water of more than 30 cm require safety barriers that comply with the technical requirements (see Section 3) to restrict access by young children. This includes temporary and portable swimming and spa pools.

Failure to provide a compliant safety barrier risks the lives of young children and may lead to significant fines.

Adults should never wholly rely on safety barriers as they are only intended to **restrict** access by young children, not prevent access, and are secondary to supervision.

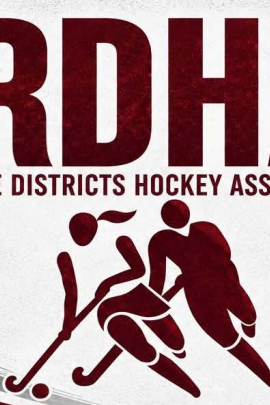

Celebrating World Indigenous Cultures between 10/08 & 17/08 we explored a culture very dear to us through our lovely Educator Moureen who originates from Eldoret near Nairobi in Kenya.

Moureen has been part of the KCCC team for 12 months now. Time has truly passed so fast but the staff and children feel like we have known her for so much longer as she shares her warm bright personality with each of us everyday. We are so glad Moureen chose to find our centre out in the regional area! Being able to explore and learn about a culture from a person who is willing to share and teach has been such a valuable experience for the children and staff. Thank you Moureen!



We learnt about The Nairobi National Park and the animals who live there. We went into our digital resources watching a video called the Giraffe Centre, a story about an endangered animal sanctuary located in Kenya where people work to protect the wildlife through education.

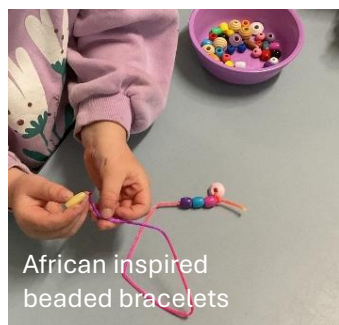


We did a craft activity on MPORORO - a multi-strand beaded collar/neck ornament necklace

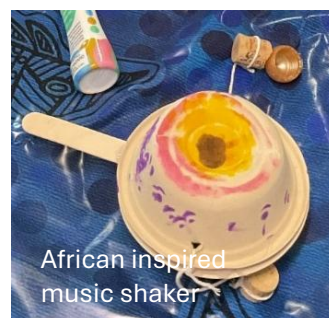
or a traditional collar-style necklace crafted from vibrant glass beads that signal age, social standing and marital status among the Maasai and Samburu people of Kenya. The necklace colours also have symbols, red stands for bravery and blood while blue for sky and energy.



Other craft activities included these beautiful bright flamingos. The children learned about the flamingos found in Kenya around the Great Rift Valley and how they get their bright colours through eating brine shrimp and algae and other microscopic organisms found in their wetland habitat.

A special story borrowed from the Narrogin Library called 'Good Hair' by Yvonne Sewankambo explores the topic of different hair and how getting ready in the morning can be hard. The story follows Birungi learning about the secret to celebrating hair with the help from her Dad. From this book we talked to the children about hair and the different ways which people's hair can look, the different styles, textures, colours and how people choose to wear their hair.



During the week we also spent some time cooking in the kitchen. Our meals included Kenyan-style chapati, a light flat bread traditionally enjoyed with savoury foods. The children included carrot and lemon in their chapati for a delicious flavour twist. Our second recipe was a vegetarian styled fried rice called Pilau which is rich in herbs and spices. The children thoroughly enjoyed all the food experiences and eating their goods. Cooking covers so many learning topics and life skills it's great to incorporate these experiences into our program.



Lastly, we borrowed some African drums – Djembe a rope-tuned, skin-covered goblet drum. Sue and Moureen did a breakout session at the Early Year Development Conference in March where they joined a large drumming circle. It's great to have access to these instruments and explore them with the children. Drumming reduces stress, boosts moods and is grounding experience. Drums such as the Djemba are a long-standing part of culture and history for people in Africa.

EIGHTEEN YEARS AT THE TABLE



There are moments in life that I believe stay with you forever, never really fading. Memories so clear that, even years later, it feels as though you could reach out and touch them. Some are hard moments, the ones that scrape you raw. Others are moments of utter joy, when your cup is overflowing with bubbles of happiness. And then there are the odd, quiet ones. Everyday moments that somehow settle into a corner of your memory and stay there.

I've been thinking about a lot of those moments this week because my baby, the youngest of our children, turned eighteen. Officially, he is now a man, yet eighteen years don't quite equate in my mind. Scattered amongst them are fragments of time that feel like they happened five minutes ago. A little boy's face. A particular laugh. Something he said. A mess we made in the kitchen.

And somewhere in my head, despite all evidence to the contrary, he is still my little boy.

Now, as you probably know by this point, food is one of the ways I care for the people I love. And my boy shares that with me. So naturally, when it came time to plan his eighteenth birthday feast, food was a **PRIORITY**.

There were so many things we've made together over the years, plenty he'd happily gorge himself on without proper (and occasionally intense) supervision, and now all the things he is learning for himself. Given that he is training to be a chef, Mum had a standard to live up to. In the end the birthday menu sprawled across the table, but one particular platter disappeared remarkably quickly. These wings.

Even making the marinade had that smoky, sweet, garlicky smell drifting through the house and drawing everyone towards the kitchen. Then they came out of the oven sticky, glossy and scorching hot, and the familiar shuffle

began between desperately wanting to eat one and knowing it would probably remove several layers from the inside of your mouth.

A few burnt tongues later, the platter was clean, right down to the swipe marks where enterprising souls had wiped up the last of the sauce.

I'd say that's a fairly solid endorsement.

The recipe began as something I'd played around with over the years, but this version is now locked in. Sweet and smoky, with just a little warmth rather than serious heat, and absolutely finger-licking good. Serve them with salad and veggies, add chips or wedges and call it dinner, or put a massive bowl in the middle of the table for finals footy and watch them disappear.

This week's recipe comes from an eighteenth birthday table, one of those milestones that makes you look backwards as much as forwards. Because somehow, when you look at your now-grown child, you can still see the baby, the little boy, the teenager and the young man standing in exactly the same place.

We don't always know which moments are going to stay with us while we're living them. So, from my table to yours, enjoy the moments, big and small, and savour the memories.

FIRECRACKER MAPLE WINGS

Smoky • Sticky • Gentle Warmth

Makes approximately 750ml lacquer – perfect for 2 kg chicken wings

INGREDIENTS

- 2 kg chicken wings
- 375 ml pure maple syrup
- 90 ml honey
- 120 ml light soy sauce
- 45 ml Worcestershire sauce
- 3 tbsp Dijon mustard
- 1 1/2 tbsp chipotle in adobo
- 3 tsp smoked paprika
- 1 1/2 tsp smoked chipotle powder
- 8–9 cloves garlic, finely grated
- 75 g unsalted butter
- 3 tbsp apple cider vinegar
- Freshly ground black pepper
- Good pinch smoked sea salt

METHOD

1. Add the maple syrup, honey, soy sauce, Worcestershire sauce, Dijon mustard, chipotle in adobo, smoked paprika, smoked chipotle powder, garlic, apple cider vinegar, black pepper and smoked sea salt to a saucepan.
2. Bring to a gentle simmer and cook for 10–12 minutes, stirring occasionally, until slightly reduced and beautifully fragrant.
3. Remove from the heat and whisk in the butter until the lacquer is smooth and glossy.
4. Allow to cool completely.
5. Before adding

the chicken, reserve approximately 180 ml (3/4 cup) of the lacquer. Set aside 90 ml for finishing the wings and 90 ml for making the Firecracker+ dipping sauce. Keep both portions refrigerated and completely separate from the raw chicken.

6. Place the chicken wings into the remaining cooled lacquer and toss thoroughly to coat. Cover and refrigerate overnight.

7. When ready to cook, remove the wings from the marinade and arrange in a single layer on lined baking trays. Discard the marinade that has been in contact with the raw chicken.

8. Roast until the wings are cooked through, golden and beginning to caramelize around the edges.

9. Toss the cooked wings with the reserved 90 ml finishing lacquer, then return them to a 220°C oven for 5–8 minutes, until deeply caramelised, sticky and gloriously glossy.

To Finish

Scatter generously with toasted sesame seeds & finely sliced spring onion.

Serve immediately, with plenty of napkins and perhaps a warning to let them cool down before diving in.

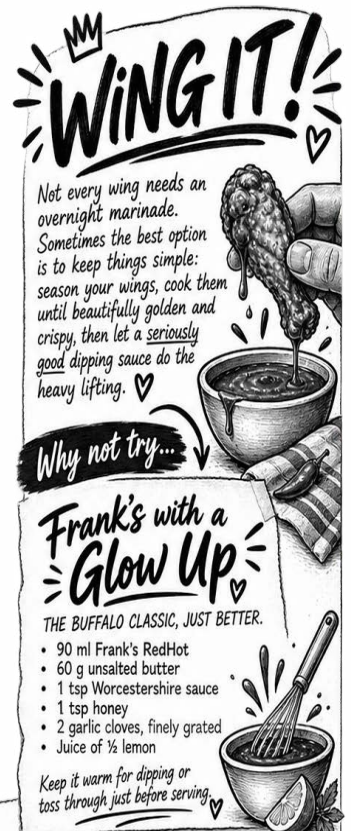

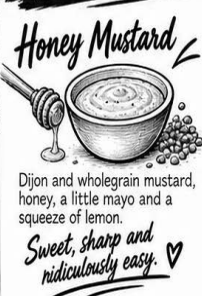

METHOD

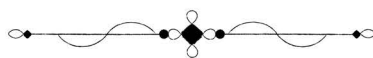
1. Stir everything together until well combined. Serve alongside the wings for dipping, allowing those who like a little more heat to level theirs up.

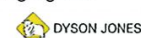
