This response was in relation to the huge community effort in hosting the Great Southern Colts Football Carnival over the weekend. It again highlighted what makes Kulin tick! That being the community's effort to band to together and host significant regional events that draw people from across the state and showcase our warm hospitality, facilities and great people that make our community.

This week is our June Ordinary Council Meeting. We also have our final Audit Committee and LEMC (Local Emergency Management Committee) meetings for the financial year.

Council have recently put forward a submission to the Ministerial Expert Committee on WA Electoral Reform. It needs to be ensured that Rural and Regional WA remains strongly represented and the Committee needs to be very aware of the potential representative imbalance within the rural regions. It also needs to be considered that the State

economic benefits derived from Agriculture, Mining and Pastoral regions were significant and to ignore that does not recognise the importance of our regions to the State as a whole. This submission supported a WALGA submission with recommendations as follows:

"That a regional system be retained, and the whole state electorate option be rejected."

"That the Ministerial Expert
Committee on Electoral Reform be
required to consider the importance
of political representation for rural
and regional Western Australia."

The month of June see staff and contractors frantically finishing the 2020/21 Capital Budget Projects funded via various sources. These projects include:

- New footpaths around town
- Replacement of soft fall in VDZ playground
- Aquatic Centre pool repairs
- VDZ Public Toilet Refurbishment
- Holt Rock Depot Refurbishment
- Kulin Cemetery Front Entrance(a joint CKC and Shire project)

KULIN WILDFLOWER SOCIETY

So much is popping up with the rain and sun patches: where should we look first?

TAKE A WANDER beyond the Caravan Park in the bushland. At a parking-turning spot there is a fabulous old magenta-pink-cream Salmon Gum, with thousands of stories to tell. When you see some markers look in under the paperbark myrtles. You will find tiny green glitter balls and micro-lettuces — they are both liverworts. The ball is Asterella drummondii and the frills are Fossombronia. The glitter ball opens like a star with white handbags of black spores. Despite being so small they prevent erosion and process minerals to feed the shrubs and trees. There are also many orchid leaves that will soon sprout flowers. The grey wings are lichens. There are many fungi from plate to fingernail size. Please do not touch the fungi.

Check out the airstrip road but park at the terminal and walk back as it is very narrow. The dense low shrubs are loaded with buds and will be flowering well ahead of normal or they may flower twice or even after every patch of rain through the year. There is an intriguing dense mound in **Price St parkland** that is worth watching as it is a great weed barrier, no buds yet.

The SUBARU4wdclubwa.asn.au stopped for a short break at Kulin on the last long weekend looking for a coffee, but too early, so they did the Macrocarpa Trail, Charcoal Pit and Sand Ring instead. They checked out the colours in the first 50m and were amazed by the Black Toothbrush Grevilleas. The trip leader, Trevor was able to explain how the charcoal was used at Wundowie Steel, for blacksmithing and to run MVs and tractors. The young drivers rolled their eyes when he described the charcoal burners that produced gas that was sucked into the carbi in the 1930s to early 1950s. **Do you have any photos** we can use for a sign please? They are returning in spring so call us if you have a Subaru & you can join in.

Have you seen the Horse Mushrooms and the Giant Inland Boletes yet? The latter can be a metre wide.

ORCHID REPORT: Echidna Snail, Green-banded Shells, Mallee Greenhoods & Frog Greenhoods are all *Pterostylis*. Winter Spiders are still braving the chill at Gnarming West.






