Welcome back to my fortnightly CEO Corner from the Isolation Bunker at 24 Johnston Street.

Obviously COVID-19 continues to dominate the landscape of our daily life and business operations. I'm sure everybody is aware of and up to date with the latest information, isolation and movement restriction requirements, so I'll try not to bore everybody with too many details they already are across. The only point I would like to make is that, as usual, it is great to see how well our community is taking this issue seriously, undertaking the necessary precautions and binding together as a supportive community to work through such an ongoing and unprecedented challenge. Whilst as a community Kulin is somewhat "naturally self-isolated", the information released yesterday revealing that one of our neighbours in Dumbleyung has a case, shows just how real and close to home this virus can easily spread.

As an organisation our staff and Council continue to heed the necessary advice and work with the Federal and State Governments as required. We have been informed that our operations are deemed an "essential" service and that we are to continue to operate as normal as possible whilst adhering to the relevant guidelines. As a leading organisation within the community we will continue to operate, whilst exhibiting the necessary social responsibility measures. Our office staff have moved to staggering their shifts and minimising the number of staff in the office and working from home where possible. Measures have also been undertaken to limit public access through the front doors.

The following areas of our business have been temporarily closed in-line with COVID 19 guidelines:

- FRC (open for take away only at designated times)
- Aquatic Centre
- CRC
- Caravan Park
- RV Area
- Playgrounds

We thank the community for their on-going understanding and adherence to these no-go zones. Staff within these areas of our business have been redeployed within the organisation to assist with dealing with COVID-19 challenges as required. I'd like to thank such staff members for their understanding and adaptability.

Our roadworks team and town maintenance crew will continue to work as normal whilst maintain adequate social distancing measures from each other and the community as large. We have been instructed by the State Minister for Local Government that continuing our operations is vital for the economy and the wider community and will continue to do so under such instruction, whilst minimising the risks.

This week we held our Audit Committee Meeting followed by a Special Council Meeting to receive our 2018/19 Annual Financial Report. This year we have had the Office of the Auditor General conduct our audit, which has been a somewhat drawn out and tedious process with their particular areas of focus and increased attention to detail. I'd like to congratulate Cassi for her tireless work in getting the audit finalised and her patience whilst working through the exhaustive process with the OAG. We can now set our ANNUAL ELECTORS MEETING which will be WEDNESDAY 15th APRIL 2020 at 12 NOON. This will be somewhat different considering the circumstances and details how community members can attend via a digital platform will be circulated over the next fortnight.

As a community we will get through this challenge in a manner we only know how — collaboratively, volunteering our support to others and being respectful of the necessary parameters, whilst soldiering on in a resilient manner. Until next time stay safe.

Bushfire Brigade Update

Extension of Restricted Burning Period

The Fire and Emergency Services Commissioner has extended all restricted burning times across Western Australia (excluding the Kimberley & Pilbara regions) until the end of April 2020. This extension came into effect on Wednesday 1 April 2020 and will be reviewed again before the end of April.

This approach is about reducing the Covid-19 risk to firefighters and the actions that shires were already undertaking with greater controls on the issuing of permits.

Restricted burning effectively means that no burning can be carried out unless you have a permit from your local Fire Control Officer.

Although there is provision for burning garden refuse during a restricted burning time providing the person complies with all requirements under section 24F of the Bush Fires Act 1954:-

- The garden refuse is on the ground and burned in accordance with the following requirements:
 - a) there is no flammable material (other than that being burned) within 5m of the fire at any time while the fire is burning; and
 - b) the fire is lit between 6pm and 11pm and is completely extinguished before midnight on the same day; and
 - c) least one person is present on the site of the fire at all times until it is completely extinguished; and
 - d) when the fire is no longer required, the person ensures that the fire is completely extinguished by the application of water or earth.
- The fire danger rating is not Very High, Severe, Extreme or Catastrophic (Section 24D)

To support our community we are gathering a list of community volunteers who are able to collect orders from Kulin businesses and deliver to your doorstep.



INTRASTATE TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS

Western Australians are not permitted to travel outside of their **regional boundary**. This is an important measure that will help stop the spread of COVID-19.

Western Australians will not be permitted to leave their regional boundary. Police have the power to enforce these restrictions and fines of up to \$50,000 can be issued.

Exemptions will apply for:

- · employment purposes
- medical reasons
- · health and emergency services
- people living in 'border communities', who may not have access to groceries or supplies within their region
- · freight
- · compassionate grounds.



- Keep fuel tank topped up (power outages or supply, may stop emergency travel)
- Check oil and especially water. (always when cold, so not to scold yourself)
 Best time in morning, on level surface to get correct reading.
- Always check the spare tyre is inflated (give it a thump or get it checked)
- Keep the battery in good condition, by driving once or twice a week.
 I suggest a pleasant 5-10 km trip during the day with lights off.
 If your house bound, let the car idle in the driveway for 10-15 minutes.
 (not in an enclosed garage, as this could be worse than the virus)
