Welcome to my first CEO Corner for 2020, and welcome back to all those community members returning from a well earned summer vacation. 2019 was certainly a busy year for the Shire and wider Kulin community and 2020 promises to be just as active and no doubt at times challenging. I managed to enjoy a few weeks off over the festive season, thanks to Cassi, as Acting CEO during this time, and all the staff for holding the fort. A few friends and community members may have noticed our dogs escaping whilst I was away, my sincere apologies for this as we had a few issues with the fence containing them in my yard. Please be rest assured that this fencing issue is in the process of being rectified, whilst the dogs are friendly and harmless, it certainly wasn't great to hear of them roaming the streets in our absence.

Key topics and community challenges at the moment continue to be the extremely dry summer and ongoing water security issues. There have obviously been measures undertaken by Water Corporation to maintain continuity of supply to major towns within the region such as Kulin, Lake Grace, Kondinin and Hyden. Feedback from Water Corporation is that residential town supply is their priority and this has somewhat been at the expense of standpipes. They have taken additional measures to keep the standpipes operational as much as possible, but this has not always been feasible.

Shire staff continue to regularly liaise with Water Corporation and Department of Water and Environmental Regulation staff to ensure continuity of water supply in such times and identify and activate strategic water resources where available. At the moment such resources are just coping, but the next month will be tough. All parties are aware that on-farm water supplies are at their lowest point in quite a while and many farmers are carting immense amounts of water for stock. Can I please ask that farmers and community members continue to be considerate of each other when accessing the limited standpipe supplies within the district. As indicated by Water Corporation, such standpipes are generally available for domestic farmhouse consumption as well as moderate use for on-farm requirements such as stock and spraying. The system is not specifically set up to cater for significantly dry years or uphold the whole district's stock water requirements. It is definitely not set up to cater for intensive cattle feedlots and I would encourage such operators to not abuse the standpipe supplies and seek their own on-farm alternative supply sources, to ensure continuity of supply for all users.

Last week the Federal Government announce that the Shire of Kulin is eligible for up to \$500K worth of "Drought Communities Programme Extension" funding to complete local infrastructure and other drought relief projects. Council is most grateful for this opportunity and Shire staff will be working with Council and the community to identify projects to put in submissions for such funding. This will provide a great opportunity to identify and implement further significant community building projects, which is one thing the wider Kulin community has a great track record in delivering.

Congratulations to the Camp Kulin staff who successfully delivered a scaled back version of 2 camps during the month of January. Early feedback is that these camps were a great learning and development experience for staff and volunteers. Thank you to all local volunteers who pitched in and assisted our staff during these periods, especially Ash Buttigig who volunteered to run the kitchen for both camps. Your efforts are much appreciated.

On a staff note it is great to see Owen Jenks on the mend and back home. Owen obviously suffered a traumatic traffic accident in late November and has endured an arduous recovery. Our best wishes remain with Owen and his family as his recovery continues. I believe a couple of Owen's kids enjoyed some time at Camp Kulin over the summer which hopefully assisted the family's recovery process.

Our Works Crew have continued to deliver capital projects over summer. The major project taking place is the widening of Dudinin Jitarning Road, as well as various new footpath construction around town and reconstruction and resurfacing on Price Street. The new electronic shutters at the FRC have also been installed. Investigative works have recently commenced on the new water supply dam at Pingaring, with construction expected to take place in the coming months.

On Friday 24th January Council were fortunate to host the WA Minister for Transport Rita Saffioti in town. Discussions were held with Minister Saffioti regarding reinvigorating Tier 3 rail in the eastern wheatbelt, specifically the line to Kulin, as well as Main Roads and other transport issues. It also gave Council an opportunity to showcase our flagship attractions such as the Aquatic Centre and Waterslide as well as Camp Kulin. Many thanks to President West for his ongoing tenacity and lobbying of Minister Saffioti to make the visit to Kulin.

Congratulations to all award winners at Kulin Shire Council Australia Day Awards and thanks to Shire and CRC staff for coordinating the event.

## **Citizen of the Year Brendan Sloggett**

Brendan has been nominated for his significant volunteering contribution in Kulin. Brendan had volunteered with the Kulin St John Ambulance sub centre for 32 years. He has held the role of President for 22 of those years. Brendan is the sole member who is on call 24 hours a day to coordinate a team of volunteers to attend a call out.

Brendan has held his Certificate 4 in training and assessment for many years and has been the coordinator and provider of first aid courses for the Kulin community. He has been a first aid trainer for 29 years.

Brendan coordinates volunteer crews for the Kulin Bush Races and the Blazing Swan. Brendan is involved in coordinating local men's health nights, which include volunteer ambulance officers, local nurses and the districts doctor.

Brendan's dedication and commitment to the health and safety within the Kulin community is highly valuable; his voluntary service greatly appreciated throughout the region.

Brendan has also been very involved as a volunteer with the Kulin Bush Races for 25 years. Since the beginning of the Kulin Bush Races, Brendan has volunteered his services to implement and maintain the electrical equipment that runs the event. Brendan's hours of volunteering to set up and maintain the electrical systems at the Kulin Bush Races events has seen all areas be able to access power, backed up by extensive generators. His tireless work over the years has been seen a more professional and permanent set up so the track facilities are able to be utilised by the local community and other people for functions.

Brendan has been a Justice of Peace since 2002. He has achieved the first and second bar of service.

## **Young Citizen of the Year Shayley Rennie**

Shayley is a kind and compassionate girl whose contribution to the Kulin community is extensive and astounding for one so young. She is an active volunteer with many different groups in the Kulin community, regularly assisting with events run by Kulin Arts Council Inc, Kulin Community Markets, Camp Kulin and the Kulin Bush Races.

Shayley has attended many events at Camp Kulin as a participant and has now taken on the role of Junior Counsellor. She has also helped out being the 'Camp Kulin Dog' mascot, wearing a large dog outfit and interacting with children and adults at local events, including the Kulin Bush Races. Camp Kulin have also asked her to speak at local group meeting (Kulin Lions Club) on their behalf.

Shayley is a frequent volunteer at Kulin Arts Council Inc. events. From cleaning up after workshops to assisting workshop attendees at the Kulin Community Arts Centre. She also helps out with fundraising events. She is a regular volunteer at the Kulin Community Markets, helping with sausage sizzles, setting up and packing away, and assisting stall holders. Shayley is a Student Councillor at Kulin District High School, taking on leadership roles across the school community.

She is an active record-breaking athlete in all school sport events, the Narrogin Little Athletics club and frequently fundraisers and participates in various 'fun runs' in Perth and locally. She has been a member of the Kulin Echidna Guides (a Girl Guides of Western Australia unit), where she took on the role of patrol leader and participated in many service activities helping local senior citizen, Kulin Bush Races, Kulin CWA and Kulin Arts Inc.



## *Australian Honours List 2020*

Congratulations to Graeme Robertson who has been awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) in the Australia Day 2020 Honours List.

The Order of Australia recognises Australians who have demonstrated outstanding service or exceptional achievement. The Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) is awarded to for service worthy of particular recognition. Graeme has been recognised for his service to the community of Kulin.

Following is the biographical notes that accompanied the submission for the award.

Graeme is a leader in our community and has been a a key contributor to the success of Kulin. Graeme has had an immense impact on the development and direction of Kulin's identity and establishing community pride to create a vibrant community that remains proactive to ensure a socially and economically sustainable environment for businesses, families and visitors alike.

Elected to the Kulin Shire Council in 1983, Graeme served 26 years as a Councillor, 3 of which as President, prior to retiring in 2009. During that period Graeme was integral in creating a Council that was, and still is, very forward thinking. Community initiatives such as the Cultivating Kulin Committee, Kulin Bush Races and Kulin Community Bank were all supported by Council and driven by Graeme Robertson.

Graeme was awarded Local Governments highest honour in 2009 - Honorary Freeman of the Shire of Kulin. His certificate acknowledges his outstanding and dedicated service to the community, noting *"Graeme Robertson willingly and wholeheartedly gave his time, with the support of his family, to ensure the Shire of Kulin continued to develop and progress for the benefit of the whole community. His commitment, enthusiasm and support of the wider community is further emphasised through his absolute dedication to groups and organisations such as the Kulin Bush Races, the Kulin Football Club and Kulin Community Financial Services."*

Graeme was the inaugural President of the Cultivating Kulin Committee. This group was formed following a community meeting in 1993 at a time when Kulin required a leader and forward thinker to promote the town and ensure that existing businesses did not disappear all the while attempting to attract new ones. Graeme stepped up into the challenge and lead CKC to establish Kulin's identity and promote activities within the town through a local newspaper. This committee continues to be the community body through which further initiatives were established (Kulin Bush Races, Kulin Cultivator) and also has provided invaluable infrastructure to the community.

The iconic Kulin Bush Races remains the pinnacle event in the region and is set to continue long into the future. Taking on the role of inaugural Chairman, Graeme Robertson still holds the position today, since inception in 1995. His progressive and proactive leadership has seen the Bush Races gain momentum and grow over so many years. Graeme has been a driving force in the success of the Kulin Bush Races and continues to run the committee with his positive energy and creating a team environment. The event attracts 4000 people annually and provides a significant financial boost to the local economy, with funds from the event distributed back to community groups and initiatives.

The Kulin Community Bank was WA's first community bank opening its doors to Kulin in October 1999. At that time, many country banking services were disappearing from country towns with virtually no prospect of recovery, but Kulin bucked the trend, led by Graeme Robertson as Inaugural Chairman of Kulin Community Financial Services Ltd, who was one of three key members who were responsible for organising the Due Diligence and Prospectus for potential shareholders. Graeme was instrumental in securing banking services through the Kulin Community Bank, which has not only provided a banking service but improved the long-term prospects of the community through greater control over the districts resources as any profits made are retained by the local community. Graeme held the position of Chairman until 2005 and still remains a Board Director.

Graeme Robertson is a Life Member of the Kulin Football Club and a long serving member of the committee as well as coaching numerous teams over many years. He has many personal achievements including multiple Fairest and Best Medals and playing over 400 games with the Club. Graeme played a leading role in ensuring the football club remained strong and worked towards a successful amalgamation to create the Kulin Kondinin Football Club, of which he remains an active member and continues to volunteer as Club Trainer.

What makes Graeme stand out from the rest? Not only has he contributed to the Kulin Shire Council for over 24 years, Graeme has voluntarily been a key driver in many success stories within the community. The many committees that Graeme has been a representative on have been in his own time and at his own cost which is significant seeing as he manages a farming business and lives 35km from town. Many of the projects he has been integral in instigating have required travel to meetings and appointments throughout the region, to Perth or the Eastern States and he has managed to continually drive these initiatives whilst juggling family, personal and work obligations.

It is rare that one person can have such a profound and significant effect on a community. Through his proactive and visionary leadership, his commitment and dedication to the Kulin Community he has improved the long-term opportunities for our region like no other. And for the record, he is a bloody good bloke!

Graeme will be presented with his Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) Medal at an official ceremony at Government House, Perth undertaken by the Governor of Western Australia in March/April 2020.





## Novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV)

### What you need to know

*Health authorities have identified coronavirus cases in Australia in January 2020. The virus originated in Wuhan, Hubei Province, China. The majority of cases have been in mainland China and there is clear evidence of person-to-person transmission.*

*Currently in Australia, people most at risk of contracting the virus are those who have been in mainland China recently, or have been in close contact with someone who is a confirmed case of coronavirus. If this applies to you, this fact sheet will let you know what to do.*

### What is this coronavirus?

Coronaviruses can make humans and animals sick. Some coronaviruses can cause illness similar to the common cold and others can cause more serious diseases, including Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) and Middle East respiratory syndrome (MERS).

The virus originating in Hubei Province, China, is called 'novel' because it is new. It had not been detected before this outbreak.

### How is the coronavirus spread?

The coronavirus is most likely to spread from person-to-person through:

- direct close contact with a person whilst they are infectious;
- close contact with a person with a confirmed infection coughs or sneezes; or
- touching objects or surfaces (such as door knobs or tables) contaminated from a cough or sneeze from a person with a confirmed infection, and then touching your mouth or face.

Most infections are only transmitted by people when they have symptoms. These can include fever, a cough, sore throat, tiredness and shortness of breath.

There is now some evidence that people could be contagious before showing symptoms. This means anyone who has been in mainland China recently or been in close contact with someone who is a confirmed case of coronavirus, must take the following additional precautions, even if they don't feel unwell.

### Travellers from mainland China

Travellers are advised that special restrictions apply if:

- They have left Hubei Province less than 14 days ago (until 14 days after they left Hubei)
- They have been identified as close contacts of proven cases of novel coronavirus (until 14 days after the proven case became unwell)
- They have left, or transited through, mainland China on or after 1 February 2020 (until 14 days after leaving China).
- Close contact of a confirmed case of Coronavirus

If you think you may have been a close contact of a confirmed case of novel coronavirus, you must isolate yourself in your home for 14 days after last contact with the confirmed case.

### What does isolate in your home mean?

People who must be isolated should not attend public places, in particular work, school, childcare or university. Only people who usually live in the household should be in the home. Do not allow visitors

into the home. There is no need to wear masks in the home. Where possible, get others such as friends or family, who are not required to be isolated to get food or other necessities for you. If you must leave the home, such as to seek medical care, wear a surgical mask if you have one.

## What do I do if I develop symptoms?

If you develop symptoms (fever, a cough, sore throat, tiredness or shortness of breath) within 14 days of leaving mainland China, or within 14 days of last contact of a confirmed case, you should arrange to see your usual doctor for urgent assessment. You should telephone the health clinic or hospital before you arrive and tell them your travel history or that you may have been in contact with a potential case of novel coronavirus. You must remain isolated either in your home or a healthcare setting until Public Health authorities inform you it is safe for you to return to your usual activities.

## Who is most at risk of a serious illness?

Some people who are infected may not get sick at all, some will get mild symptoms from which they will recover easily, and others may become very ill, very quickly.

From previous experience with other coronaviruses, the people at most risk of serious infection are:

- people with compromised immune systems, such as people with cancer
- elderly people
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- very young children and babies, and
- people with diagnosed chronic medical conditions.

## How is the virus treated?

There is no specific treatment for coronaviruses. Antibiotics are not effective against viruses. Most of the symptoms can be treated with supportive medical care.

## How can we help prevent the spread of the virus?

Practising good hand hygiene and sneeze/cough hygiene is the best defence against most viruses.

You should:

- wash your hands often with soap and water before and after eating as well as after attending the toilet;
- avoid contact with others (including touching, kissing, hugging, and other intimate contact); and
- cough and sneeze into your elbow.

## Should I wear a face mask?

Face masks are not recommended. A face mask will not protect you against becoming infected. While the use of face masks can help to prevent transmission of disease from infected patients to others, face masks are not currently recommended for use by healthy members of the public for the prevention of infections like novel coronavirus.

## Messages for volunteer fire fighters and fire brigades

### What to do in an emergency...

When a bushfire event starts and before you hook into the water supply system, **call us on 13 13 75** (24 hours a day/7 days a week).

If we know where your crews are headed, we might be able to provide you with a better location where you can maintain pressure for longer OR we might be able to do something to our water supply system which will mean that we can keep it running for a fraction longer.

HOWEVER, there is no guarantee that we can prolong supply or pressure, and experience has shown that once the town is threatened and there is mass demand, the supply will lose pressure and may empty.

### Hydrants

**Location** – if you are unsure where your hydrants are located, please contact DFES or our Operations Centre on 13 13 75 who will provide you with the exact geographical locations.

**Testing** - If you intend to test hydrants in your area, please let us know first. Often a side-effect of using the hydrants is that nearby residences receive discoloured water.

If we're aware of the exercise beforehand, we can ensure our operators are prepared and ready to respond to any complaints.

### Broken hydrants

Please note – any issues with hydrants should be reported up through DFES.

DFES will contact Water Corporation and a work order will be actioned immediately.

### Reminder to residents in your Shire

Help us spread the word to people that they cannot rely on mains water in a bush fire when other critical infrastructure such as power has been damaged.

## TOTAL FIRE BAN

A Total Fire Ban is declared on a day when a fire is most likely to catch and spread rapidly or if there are already widespread fires.

If you ignore a Total Fire Ban, you may receive an infringement up to \$2,500.00 with possible jailed time.

### WHAT YOU CAN AND CAN'T DO

#### BARBECUING/COOKING OUTDOORS

You can NOT use any BBQ or cooker (including Webers) that requires solid fuel:

- Wood
- Charcoal
- Heat beads

You CAN use a gas or electrical BBQ or cooker if:

- It's a permanent BBQ in a public space
- It's in your home
- It has an enclosed flame
- You clear all material that could burn within a 5m radius around it

#### LOOKING AFTER YOUR FARM

If you're a farmer, you CAN:

- Harvest your crop
- Feed or water your stock in a paddock
- Operate or move an airplane or helicopter

If you conduct any of the above activities, you must ensure:

- Your vehicle is mechanically sound
- The exhaust system is in good condition
- All reasonable precautions have been taken to prevent bushfire starting

During a total Fire Ban AND a Harvest and Movement Ban in place, you can NOT use a vehicle, equipment or machinery that is powered by an internal combustion engine on land covered by bush, crop, pasture or stubble.

#### ANYONE WHO LIVES IN WA

In open-air, you can NOT:

- Light, maintain or use a fire (even when camping)
- Burn leaves, garden waste or grass cutting
- Use an incinerator
- Grind, weld, solder, gas cut or use any other type of 'hot work'
- Use fireworks
- Operate a hot-air balloon
- Use an outdoor wood-fired pizza oven or stove

In any area where there is bush, crops, pasture, or stubble, you can NOT use equipment powered by an internal combustion engine, such as:

- A chainsaw or lawnmower
- A plant or grass trimmer
- Bobcats, excavators, bulldozers or other similar machinery
- A welder
- A car
- A tractor
- A motorbike or quad bike
- An angle grinder
- A dune buggy
- A generator

You CAN undertake these activities inside your shed ONLY IF it is fully enclosed on all sides.


