Welcome to my fortnightly CEO Corner and isn't the world in an interesting predicament at the moment.

The outbreak of COVID-19 and its impending infiltration into the wider Australian community has been at the forefront of the media the past few weeks, with the advice changing daily and rapidly. Whilst Kulin may seem a somewhat isolated and safe place at this point in time, it only takes one infection to potentially infiltrate the whole community. The swift response and measures currently being put in place by the Federal and State Governments is to ensure all community members have an understanding of the measures they can take to minimise the effect of COVID-19 in their individual communities as well as across wider Australia.

The Shire of Kulin continues to monitor the growing concern about the coronavirus (COVID-19) and are taking action in accordance with the advice provided by the relevant health and government authorities. Slowing the spread of the COVID 19 is essential in order for our health system to cope in the coming months. In such a rapidly changing environment, it is important that our community is kept informed about how the shire is responding to COVID-19 and the challenges it presents. The Shire will continue monitoring the level of risk associated with COVID-19 and responding to the changing situation as quickly as possible while keeping you informed and updated on a regular basis.

The most effective ways to prevent the spread of the disease are to:

- § Wash your hands often with soap and water.
- § Clean and sanitise high touch objects such as door knobs, light switches, fridges and rails.
- § Cover your mouth with a tissue or the inside of your elbow when you cough or sneeze.
- § Stay at home if you or your family members feel unwell and do not go to work, school or daycare.
- § Practice social distancing by leaving space between yourself and others.
- § Reconsider non-essential public gatherings.
- § Call ahead before attending medical appointments if you are feeling unwell or for testing.
- § Self-isolate for 14 days if you have returned from travelling overseas.

The Shire of Kulin met with Blazing Swan representatives this week to discuss how this issue would impact their impending scheduled Easter 2020 event. On Monday 16th March the WA State Government declared a State of Emergency in Western Australia due to COVID-19. This declaration reiterated that "non-essential, organised gatherings of 500 or more people can no longer go ahead". Based upon this information the Shire of Kulin has requested that the Blazing Swan event scheduled for 2020 is cancelled immediately.

Unfortunately, other local events have also been cancelled this week due to the ongoing risk of COVID-19 and the social isolation measures being requested by the Government. These include the Interschool Swimming Carnival as well as the Kulin Triathlon. I understand this will be most disappointing to sections of the community, but from a risk management perspective at this stage these decisions are in line with what other similar organisations are doing across the country.

Over the past fortnight the Shire of Kulin made the challenging decision to put Camp Kulin in recess for an indefinite period. This decision was not taken lightly and many alternatives were investigated in order to continue delivering this fantastic program to the Kulin community and wider state. On behalf of staff and Council I'd like to wish both Amy and Cathy well in their new ventures and thank them for their hard work, especially over the challenging summer months. Our best wishes also remain with Tanya with her ongoing recovery.

Council staff continue to work with Office of the Auditor General in finalising the 2018/19 Financial Year Audit. The process of review via the OAG has been a challenging process and continues to drag out, however we are ultimately at the mercy of their various queries and requests, which have been significantly more onerous than in previous years. Unfortunately, this continues to delay our Annual Electors Meeting, which we will be endeavouring to hold in April.

KULIN UPDATE

Preparations of the 2020/21 Council Budget will commence in the coming month. As part of this process we are hoping to undertake consultation with the community through various public meetings to investigate potential budget items and identify key projects to be considered as part of the Drought Communities Funding Programme Extension. Exactly when and where these meetings take place will be subject to the ongoing restrictions of COVID-19.

On a positive note, the sealing of widening work on Dudinin - Jitarning Road was completed last week. Congratulations to Judd and the team who have worked tirelessly on this project for the past few months, well done crew.



- Being socially responsible: not panic buying, helping to make sure there's enough of everything to go around, not spreading misinformation and unofficial advice, and showing kindness and compassion in all my interactions (on and offline)
- Saying "thank you": showing gratitude to others who are taking action to help keep us well and safe





Economic Response to the Coronavirus

The Government's economic response addresses the economic impacts of the Coronavirus outbreak. It is intended to support confidence, employment and business continuity. It is designed to support business investment, help small businesses manage short-term cash flow challenges, provide targeted support to individuals and assistance to the most severely affected communities and regions.

1. Delivering support for business investment

The Government is backing businesses to invest to help the economy withstand and recover from the economic impact of the Coronavirus. The two business investment measures in this package are designed to assist Australian businesses and economic growth in the short term, and encourage a stronger economic recovery following the Coronavirus outbreak.

Increasing the instant asset write-off

From today, the Government is increasing the instant asset write-off threshold from \$30,000 to \$150,000 and expanding access to include businesses with aggregated annual turnover of less than \$500 million (up from \$50 million) until 30 June 2020. In 2017-18 there were more than 360,000 businesses that benefited from the current instant asset write-off, claiming deductions to the value of over \$4 billion.

Backing business investment

The Government is introducing a time limited 15-month investment incentive (through to 30 June 2021) to support business investment and economic growth over the short term, by accelerating depreciation deductions. Businesses with a turnover of less than \$500 million will be able to deduct 50 per cent of the cost of an eligible asset on installation, with existing depreciation rules applying to the balance of the asset's cost. These two measures will support over 3.5 million businesses (over 99 per cent of businesses) employing more than 9.7 million employees.

2. Cash flow assistance for businesses

This assistance will support businesses to manage cash flow challenges resulting from the economic impacts of the Coronavirus and help businesses retain their employees. These two measures are designed to support employing small and medium enterprises and to improve business confidence.

Boosting cash flow for employers

The Boosting Cash Flow for Employers measure will provide up to \$25,000 back to small and medium-sized businesses, with a minimum payment of \$2,000 for eligible businesses. The payment will provide cash flow support to businesses with a turnover of less than \$50 million that employ staff. The payment will be tax free. This measure will benefit around 690,000 businesses employing around 7.8 million people.



Supporting apprentices and trainees

The Government is supporting small business to retain their apprentices and trainees. Eligible employers can apply for a wage subsidy of 50 per cent of the apprentice's or trainee's wage for up to 9 months from 1 January 2020 to 30 September 2020. Where a small business is not able to retain an apprentice, the subsidy will be available to a new employer that employs that apprentice. This measure will support up to 70,000 small businesses, employing around 117,000 apprentices.

3. Stimulus payments to households to support growth

This measure will assist around 6.5 million lower income Australians, which will support confidence and domestic demand in the economy.

Stimulus payments

The Government will provide a one-off \$750 payment to social security, veteran and other income support recipients and eligible concession card holders. Around half of those that will benefit are pensioners. There will be one payment per eligible recipient. For example, if a person qualifies for the one-off payment in multiple ways, they will only receive one payment. The payment will be tax free and will not count as income for Social Security, Farm Household Allowance and Veteran payments.

4. Assistance for severely affected regions

This measure provides \$1 billion to support regions most significantly affected by the Coronavirus outbreak.

Support for Coronavirus-affected regions and communities

The Government has set aside \$1 billion to support those regions and communities that have been disproportionately affected by the economic impacts of the Coronavirus, including those heavily reliant on industries such as tourism, agriculture and education.

This will include the waiver of fees and charges for tourism businesses that operate in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park and the waiver of entry fees for Commonwealth National Parks. It will also include additional assistance to help businesses identify alternative export markets or supply chains. Targeted measures will also be developed to further promote domestic tourism.

The Australian Tax Office (ATO) is also providing administrative relief for some tax obligations for people affected by the Coronavirus outbreak, on a case-by-case basis. The ATO will set up a temporary shop front in Cairns within the next few weeks with dedicated staff specialising in assisting small business. In addition, it will consider ways to enhance its presence in other significantly affected regions, making it easier for people to apply for relief. The ATO is considering further temporary shop fronts and face-to-face options.

PACKAGE IMPLEMENTATION

The Government will move quickly to implement this package. To that end, a package of Bills will be introduced into Parliament in the final Autumn sitting week in March 2020 for Parliament's urgent consideration and passage. Following passage of the Bills through Parliament, the Government will then move to immediately make, and register, any supporting instruments.

Subject: Camp Kulin - Operational Status Update - Going Into Recess

Date: 11th March 2020

Kulin Shire Council and Staff have worked through on-going challenges regarding the operation of Camp Kulin over the Summer of 2019/2020. During the Summer School Holidays we operated a scaled back version of 2 camps, as opposed to the originally proposed 7 camps. These camps were successfully delivered via existing Camp Kulin staff as well as a range of casual staff and volunteers. Camp Kulin staff have also continued to deliver School Leadership Camps for a range of schools within the region during Fourth Term of 2019 as well as First Term of 2020.

As many people are aware Camp Kulin Manager, Tanya Dupagne, remains on extended personal leave for an indefinite period of time as she undergoes intensive medical treatment. The Shire of Kulin continues to wish Tanya all the best with her treatment and ongoing recovery.

The permanent Camp Kulin staff are a small team who are supplemented with casual and volunteer staff during peak camp seasons. At this point in time the Camp Kulin team do not have sufficient resources to adequately deliver the Camp Kulin Program.

Council and Shire staff have continued to work through various challenges regarding resourcing and the ongoing sustainability of Camp Kulin, but we've come to the decision that Camp Kulin will have to go into recess as of Friday 13th March 2020. This decision was not taken lightly and involved consultation with a range of stakeholders. Whilst Camp Kulin is in recess, staff and Council will endeavour to work through the various challenges to determine a suitable resourcing and sustainable operational delivery model for the future.

Kulin Shire Council trusts that this provides a comprehensive update of the operational status of Camp Kulin, until further information comes to light and an appropriate decision is made. We thank everyone in advance for their patience as the Kulin Shire Council, Shire staff and Camp Kulin staff work through this challenging situation.

Even though we may not be able to train together I would still like to send some drills out for you to practice at home each week in preparation for when we are able to play.



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


