Welcome to my fortnightly CEO Corner as 2020 gathers momentum.

This week sees our first Council Meeting for 2020 on Wednesday 19th February. The meeting commences at 1.00pm with an opportunity for public question time right at the start of the meeting. Unfortunately, our Annual Electors Meeting has been delayed again, due to hold ups with the Office of the Auditor General, who is undertaking our audit of 2018/19. Hopefully this meeting will be held in April.

This week, members of Council and staff will be meeting with the Camp Kulin Inc Committee. This is the Committee responsible for managing the charity fund raising component of Camp Kulin. Key topics of discussion will revolve around how Council and CK Inc can work through the challenges of continuing to make Camp Kulin an operationally sustainable long-term proposition.

Council and staff continue to work closely with Main Roads WA Wheatbelt Region regarding key road and transport issues around Kulin. On Tuesday 18th February, we met with the Regional Manager to discuss issues such as Johnston Street resurfacing, blackspot at Jilakin Street and Lake Grace Road intersection, resurfacing of Lake Grace and Kondinin Road intersection, speed limits south of town towards Wickipin, as well as recent resurfacing works on the Kondinin Road.

Water security and water supplies continue to be an ongoing challenge throughout the district. Whilst some recent thunderstorms may have provided some runoff in places, there still remains a shortage throughout. Staff and Council are investigating a number of projects through the Community Water Grants Scheme and continue to have regular discussion with both DWER and Water Corporation during these challenging times.

Recent fires in the Holt Rock and Varley areas have posed further challenges on water resources, local property holders and volunteers. Commendation to all who assisted in some way or another over the course of these events. A reminder to all FCO and general public to report all fire events to 000, as this allows DFES to keep a record of fire locations. Long term this also enables DFES to make investment decisions regarding fire trucks and other relevant infrastructure such as storgae sheds.

Our Works Crew major project of widening the Dudinin - Jitarning Road is near completion, as is the construction of various new footpaths around town and the resurfacing on Price Street. Our Works Crew also recently completed the culvert replacement in Johnston Street for Main Roads WA.

On a sporting note, congratulations to Mr Len Hobson on his bowls singles championship win over the weekend. The Roodogs enjoyed a spirited win in the cricket over arch-rivals Narembeen, and are pressing for what should be a hard-fought finals series. This week sees the Kulin Tennis Club host their event of the season with the Mixed Doubles Day. Well done also to the Kulin Bowling Club who recently hosted the Ladies Bowls Carnival.






