CEO CORNER

Welcome back to another CEO Corner, as the festive season approaches at a rapid pace.

Plenty of community events are planned for the coming weeks, so hopefully harvest is wrapping up, your Christmas shopping is complete, school reports are written and all holidays booked. There doesn't seem too much time for day-to-day stuff with all the events happening! To name a few:

- Community Christmas Party

This week marks an historic occasion in the Kulin community with Mr Harold Proud turning 100 years young. This is a fantastic achievement for a person who is always effervescent in any conversation you would have with him, always thinking about what he can contribute to the community, and always willing to lend a hand to

any person or organisation seeking some assistance. I understand Mr Proud will be celebrating privately with the family on his birthday, no doubt doting on his newest great granddaughter. There is a community event to help Mr Proud really celebrate his milestone on Saturday 12th December at the FRC. Congratulations Mr Proud you have certainly led the way and epitomised community spirit in Kulin.

Next week is the final Council Meeting for 2020 and it has been pushed back until Thursday 17th December. The Details Design for the All Ages Precinct will hopefully be presented for endorsement. Other key topics for discussion will be how the Container Deposit Scheme will impact on the cost of kerbside recycling collection to Council, which at this stage looks to be minimal. Council will also be discussing options on how to invest a further \$400K of LRCIP funding on community infrastructure projects.

This week also sees the quarterly RoeROC meeting take place at the Shire of Kondinin. Waste management and the CDS will also be a topic on this agenda. RoeROC is an initiative where the Shires of Corrigin, Kondinin,

Kulin, Narembeen and Lake Grace collaborate on key regional initiatives and projects for the benefit of our shared region.

The Works Crew have completed sealing both Yealering Road and Dudinin-Jitarning Road. We are in the process of finalising design information for High Street Drainage, CBH Access Road as well as Jilakin Street for proposed works scheduled in early 2021. This will include intersection works with Kulin-Lake Grace Road. This work has been scheduled for the somewhat quieter month in town. There will potentially be minor inconvenience to traffic and local businesses, but traffic management will be in place. Judd will be contacting relevant businesses directly and further information will be published as required to keep people up to date of progress.

Speaking of the Works area, a really challenging issue that Shires have to work around is obtaining clearing permits to remove native vegetation associated with any proposed roadworks. Shires have to work within the stipulated guidelines set by State and Federal environmental departments and there are significant penalties for failure to comply.

CEO CORNER

One such issue is where the Works crew is looking to clear four gum trees for an intersection realignment, and we have received the following feedback as to what protocols are expected;

“...because of the significance of the vegetation in the area and the fact that about 0.42 ha of a federally protected threatened ecological community would be cleared for the works, and that DWER said that only DAWE (the federal Department of Agriculture, Water and Environment) could decide whether the clearing would be a matter of national environmental significance, a referral to DAWE will be needed for the department to decide whether the clearing proposed is significant or not. The referral document is quite complex and it takes quite a while to gather all of the information that is required to populate the online referral document. DAWE will take about 6 weeks from the time of submission of the referral until you would hear back from them whether it is significant or not. If it is deemed to be a significant action, the NVCP application would then have to be assessed under a bilateral agreement (DWER assesses the application on behalf of DAWE but with input from DAWE during the

assessment process). DWER’s assessment process would then take quite a few months depending on how much more information was required after the application was advertised for three weeks on DWER’s website”.

Given these potential issues Council will likely have to revegetate a significant area of land, or find a vegetation offset area, to accommodate the four trees within the 4ha project footprint. This seems a significantly arduous stipulation for a minor clearing project within a designated road reserve. The main reason being that this vegetation is classified as a salmon gum woodland which is deemed to be a ‘threatened ecological community’ of national significance and a foraging habitat for Carnaby’s black cockatoos. Many observers within the wheatbelt, particularly at this time, will notice that there does not appear to be a lack of foraging habitat for bird life given the hassles a lot of towns are having with white cockatoos. The logic behind the clearing regulations with regards to road reserves appears flawed and overly arduous for local governments, and this is something that I will be taking up further with both DWER and DAWE. This could be

local government’s ‘Daryl Kerrigan’ moment where we challenge regulation that is significantly impacting our infrastructure projects, considering infrastructure assets are the bulk of our Council costs and assets. I look forward to any local comment or feedback on this challenging and controversial issue.

Well done to CKC on the community cropping program this year. I believe a few locals banded together on Monday to harvest the crop. Council continue to work closely with CKC on a range of community initiatives which sees this income invested back into our community.

There is still plenty of local sport happening in the lead up to Christmas. Junior basketball and tennis have wrapped up, swimming club is kicking on, whilst bowls and cricket are well into their seasons. Next week is the Kulin Tennis Club Ladies Doubles Bash, so dust off your rackets and your best 80s pleated skirts as I hear there is a prize for best outfit.

HARVEST BAN INFORMATION LINE 9880 1511

This is a recorded message and is updated with current harvest ban information

IN CASE OF FIRE RING 000

If there is a fire you must call 000 immediately. Shire of Kulin staff are unable to register the emergency.

PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All burning is prohibited from 1 November 2020 to 15 February 2021.
NO burning permits can be issued in this period.

TOTAL FIRE BAN

A Total Fire Ban is declared on days when fires are most likely to threaten lives and property. This is because of predicted extreme fire weather or when there are already widespread fires and firefighting resources are stretched.

Total Fire Bans are put in place by DFES.

KULIN RE-USE WATER SUPPLY

The Shire of Kulin wish to advise that the town re-use water supply to the oval will recommence the week beginning 1st December 2020 and will be in use throughout the summer until 31st January.

This water will be applied between the hours of 10:00pm and 3:00am so will have no impact on normal oval use.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by your local government and are put in place when your local Bushfire Control Officer identifies the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery as high bushfire risk activities, during particular times of the day.

NOTICES FROM THE SHIRE OF KULIN

2021 Townsite Roadworks



The Shire of Kulin will be undertaking a significant amount of roadworks in and around the Kulin townsite in early 2021 (see map).

These works will be taking place on High St, Jilakin St, CBH Access Rd, Kulin Lake Grace Rd and Jilakin St Intersection, Kulin Lake Grace and CBH Access Rd.

Below is a brief summary of each job and the impact it may have.

High St

- Installation of new underground drainage and asphalt seal.
- High St will be closed to all vehicles for up to four weeks. Access to IGA will be via footpaths only, and parking will be on Day St.
- Fencing will be installed along the works where required for public safety.

Jilakin St

- Reconstruct and seal.
- Will be closed for approximately two weeks during construction and again to be sealed at a later date.

CBH Access Rd

- Will be closed south of McIntosh for the installation of new culvert pipes.
- Road will remain open during construction.
- Please be patient as you may be required to wait at times.
- **Pool Access will be off Lake Grace Road during construction.**

Intersection Works

- Signage will be in place to guide traffic through the roadworks at all times, with delays expected.

We have scheduled these roadworks to take place throughout January when the town is quietest, to minimise disruption to the community. We will be doing our best to have the majority of this completed by the end of January with minor works to be completed in February.

We ask for your patience and where possible to avoid the areas of works.

Contact Registers in Shire facilities

From 5 December 2020, Shire of Kulin is required to maintain mandatory contact registers for WA Health Department COVID-19 contact tracing. Individuals can either scan the SafeWA QR Code or manually sign in at each venue.

The following venues/buildings will have contact registers:

- Kulin Aquatic Centre and Waterslide
- Freebairn Recreation Centre
- Freebairn Recreation Centre Gym
- Kulin Memorial Hall
- Kulin Public Library (located at Kulin Post Office)

The WA Government has developed a free app, SafeWA, which is a digital contact register system. The SafeWA app can be downloaded from Apple App Store or Google Play. The app is not mandatory, and an alternative paper based system is also available.

-Failing to comply to the new requirements could result in fines and penalties of up to \$50,000 for an INDIVIDUAL and \$250,000 FOR A BODY CORPORATE or 12 months imprisonment.

- Any person aged 16 years and over who attends the facility, including patrons, staff, volunteers and contractors will be required to register their contact details. Records are not required to be collected for children under 16 years.

KULIN POOL AND WATERSLIDE

This has to be one of the slowest starts to a season I have seen. The cooler weather has not been helping much but the warmer weather will get here.

Interm swimming lessons are into their second week and hot and cold ambient temps mean the water is doing the same. They don't think its too bad but the wind isn't pleasant when they get out. Friday sees the end of Interm swimming lessons then a week of normality at the pool then school holidays sees Vacswim start up. It is a 7 day program so hopefully everyone has got their kids names in and can come and laze on a sunbed while the kids are doing their lessons. It's a great spot for a coffee and a catchup after harvest, or if you're still going, time for a chat.

This year we have a few more doing the Rotto challenge and the laps and kilometres are ticking along quite well. Along with the personal challenge of swimming the distance from Cottesloe to Rotto, I'm keeping a total town tally. The aim is to swim around Australia with total laps done over the season from everyone's laps combined, and add them to previous years until a full lap of the map is done. 

KULIN POLICE STATION

Your Local Police

Kulin Police Station is a two-officer station that predominantly polices the Shire of Kulin and provides an extended coverage into the neighbouring shires of Corrigin, Kondinin, Lake Grace and Wickiepin.

Although the police station isn't staffed 24/7 your local officers are available to respond to incidents at any time. Your local police can be contacted as follows:

- If you require police in an emergency then dial **000**.
- If you require police for a non-emergency then dial **131444**.
- If you wish to speak to an officer at the police station dial **9861 5800**.

Out of business hours the main police station number is diverted to Albany Police Station but the public and local community are encouraged to leave a message with staff there should they wish to speak to their local police.

If you have information regarding crime within your local community you can call your local police or if you wish to remain anonymous call Crimestoppers on **1800 333 000**.

Christmas Double Demerits Traffic Campaign

Please be advised that this year's Christmas Double Demerits campaign runs between 0001hrs on Friday 18 December 2020 until 2359hrs on Sunday 3 January 2021.

Bicycle Helmets

It is compulsory for bicycle riders to wear an approved crash helmet whilst riding on the road or footpaths around the town site. The penalty for failing to wear a helmet is a fine of \$50. Of particular concern is the number of children not wearing crash helmets and I would encourage all parents to ensure their child or children are suitably protected.

Williams Kondinin Road – Heavy Goods Vehicles

Drivers and users of B Doubles and Pocket Road Trains are reminded that there is maximum speed limit of 80 km/h (kilometres per hour) for these types of vehicle on the Williams Kondinin Road between Narrogin and Kondinin. This speed limit is set by Main Roads WA and is a condition of the RAV 4 permit required to use these vehicles on specified routes. The fine for breaching this condition is \$600.

Crime Prevention – Summer Holidays 2020/21

With the fast approaching summer holiday period upon us homeowners are reminded that many burglaries occur when premises are left vacant for long periods.

By taking some simple precautions you can substantially reduce the risk of burglary.

Some simple steps to protecting your home

- Ensure all doors and windows are securely locked, preferably with deadlocks and keyed window locks.
- Let your neighbours know you will be away and ask them to watch out for visitors.
- Consider installing automatic timing devices for lights and electrical appliances such as radios and televisions.
- Give your house keys to a trusted friend or neighbour rather than hiding them outside your home.
- Be sure to notify the keyholder when you return. This is especially important if you return home early.
- Give your friend or neighbour your contact address and telephone number.
- Consider asking your neighbour to park a car in your driveway.


