#### NOTICES FROM THE SHIRE OF KULIN

# TO THE HOUSEHOLDER COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP

With the coming spring and even though there are no Bush Races, many visitors will still be arriving/travelling in our Shire for a multitude of reasons, not the least that Kulin is quite simply a fantastic place to be.

With the above in mind the Shire is requesting all residents to set aside some time now to spruce up their little piece of heaven. Time to clean up around your home for the spring and to get in early to get rid of potential fire hazards that will exist once the grasses dry off. There is also the issue that long grass and rubbish makes an ideal home for snakes and other unwanted pests. In terms of Bushfire control, in past years Council has not seriously considered issuing infringements however this year there will be no warnings given to anyone not complying with the firebreak order.

## THE FIREBREAK ORDER THAT APPLIES TO TOWNSITE LAND IS AS FOLLOWS:

"Land Area less than 1 hectare:-All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It be recommended that at least a 2m wide area, immediately

within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs." For information any land of one hectare or above the rural provisions apply.

We look forward to your support and cooperation in helping clean-up Kulin.

## KERBSIDE RUBBISH COLLECTION

The Shire will be conducting a kerbside pickup throughout the townsite on Thursday 24th of September 2020.

This will be a great opportunity to get rid of any rubbish not suited to the weekly depot pickups.

#### SHIRE OF KULIN - BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

# NOTICE TO ALL OWNERS AND/OR OCCUPIERS OF LAND WITHIN THE SHIRE OF KULIN

PURSUANT TO THE POWERS contained in Section 33, you are hereby required on or before 31 October 2020 and thereafter up to and including 15 March 2021 to have a 3 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material on all rural and townsite rural land owned or occupied by you:

- Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
   In such other positions as is
- necessary to divide land into areas not exceeding 500 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak; and
- 3. Immediately surrounding any part of land used for crop; and
- 4. Parallel to and within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps on the land; and
- 5. Immediately surrounding receptacles used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not; the firebreak required to comply with this item shall be no less than 5 metres wide; and
- 6. Immediately inside land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not); the firebreak required shall be no less than 7

metres wide. Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after 19 September 2020 you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

#### TOWNSITES — AREA LESS THAN 1 HECTARE

All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It is recommended that at least a 2m wide area immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs."

(Note: any land of one hectare or above - rural provisions apply.)

#### FIREBREAK VARIATION

If it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impractical to clear firebreaks to comply with this notice due to soil erosion, the spread of salinity or for any other reason, a request for a variation may be made to the Council no later than the 1 September of each year. Such a request must be in writing and include a detailed plan showing the proposed location of firebreaks or of the alterative fire protection methods to be used.

## HARVESTING OPERATIONS - MOBILE FIRE FIGHTING UNITS

An operational mobile engine powered firefighting pump unit with no less than 500 litres of water shall be in attendance during grain harvesting operations. If the unit is trailer mounted the trailer must be attached to a vehicle at all times during harvesting operations and the unit must be in the paddock, or adjoining paddock, where the harvesting operation is being carried out.

#### **AUTOMATIC HARVESTING BANS**

A Harvest Ban will apply automatically on Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

#### OTHER MATTERS

If for hardship reasons, it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impossible to clear firebreaks required by this Notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to seek alternative options. Claimants of hardship, should do so with sufficient time to allow alternatives to be enacted. Claims of hardship does not automatically exempt owners and occupiers from the requirements of this Notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this Notice is a fine not exceeding \$5000. A person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of the Shire or a contractor performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the due date. If the requirements of this Notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

# VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION STICKERS

Volunteer Fire Fighters / Bush Fire Brigade Members please be advised that the grey Vehicle Identifier Stickers will expire on 30 September 2020; and need to be replaced with the new blue stickers (valid from 1 October 2020 – 20 September 2022). These stickers are available from the Shire Office. If you would like one posted out please email Nicole eso@kulin.wa.gov.au and provide your vehicle registration plate number and the make & model of your vehicle.

Please see below key information from DFES regarding these stickers:-

- DFES encourages the use of Vehicle Identifier stickers to identify private vehicles owned by persons pre-authorised by Local Governments to enter the fire ground and assist with emergency response operations;
- As emergency response is often supplemented by local farmers/land owners with private vehicles who may not be members of local fire brigades they assist to provide timely identification of private vehicles and persons suitable for access on the incident ground;
- Vehicle Identifier stickers are affixed to the lower left corner of the windscreen of a vehicle to identify it as a private vehicle owned by a person who is authorised by Local Government to assist with operations;

#### **CONDITIONS**

DFES has set minimum conditions which the person being issued a vehicle identifier sticker must agree to:

- It is the responsibility of the owner and driver of the vehicle to comply with the Road Traffic Act 1974;
- Appropriate Personal Protective Equipment and Clothing will be worn at all times; and
- The driver will ensure that the vehicle's presence at an incident is recorded on both arrival and departure. The vehicle identifier sticker does not infer that a vehicle is a fire fighting vehicle, but that it may be assisting or supporting an incident, or to enable passage of brigade members through a Vehicle Control Point for the purpose of deployment to the incident (e.g. to travel to a local brigade station or to crew an appliance deployed to the incident).



#### **COUNCIL DECISIONS SEPTEMBER 2020**

KULIN RETIREMENT HOMES - Council agreed to refund rates levied to Kulin Retirement Homes totalling \$2,860.51 for assessment number A1422, charged against Workman Estate; and \$6,992.36 for assessment number A95, charged against Kulinda, as they continue to operate as a not for profit community organisation.

DEVELOPMENT
APPLICATION – Council approved a development application submitted by Mr Damian Whitely requesting retrospective approval for an existing unauthorised warehouse development on Lot 303 (No.103) Day Street, Kulin subject to a number of conditions and advice notes.

WAIVER OF FRC HIRE FEES – HAROLD PROUD'S 100th BIRTHDAY – as a form of acknowledgement of this milestone birthday from Kulin's oldest community member Council agreed to waive all costs associated with hiring of the Freebairn Recreation Centre on Saturday 12 December for Mr Proud's 100th Birthday celebrations.

LONG TERM FINANCIAL PLAN – Council adopted the Long Term Financial Plan 2019/20 – 2028/29 and are now required to give local public notice of the reviewed plan as per the requirements of

#### WHAT ARE WE TRYING TO ACHIEVE?

We want to inspire young Western Australians to embrace the opportunity to have a working holiday in WA.

Our hard border is in place to protect Western Australians, however this has placed additional challenges on the agricultural, tourism and hospitality sectors in our regions that traditionally rely on interstate and international backpackers to fill short and long-term jobs.

Our priority is to employ WA workers. More than ever, it's vital that industry prioritises local workers to fill these roles.

This campaign will target 18-30 year olds living in Western Australia, and encourage young people to take action now and seize the opportunity to travel and work around WA.

The campaign will also encourage employers to re-think the way they employ workers and look to locals to fill jobs.

#### HOW ARE WE TRYING TO ACHIEVE IT?

We have been working with industry since March to develop solutions, with a focus on employing workers living in Western Australia.

We have invested \$57 million in the training sector, as part of the WA Recovery Plan, to upskill Western Australians and provide easier access to training. This includes two free and six subsidised TAFE courses to get people job-ready for roles in the agriculture sector, plus two free and three reduced-fee TAFE courses in hospitality.

**AFGHAN BISCUITS** 

Makes 30

Ingredients

1 cup butter3/4 cup sugar2 1/2 cups SR flour3 Tblspn cocoa3 cups cornflakes

Pecan nuts

Melt butter and blend in cocoa. Add icing sugar and water and mix until completely smooth. Spread a small amount of icing on each biscuit and top with a nut before the icing is completely set.

#### The four award categories

#### **Selection Criteria**

The winners will have been judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community.
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has brought about positive change and added value to community life.
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.

#### **Eligibility criteria**

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the local authority making the award.
- Awards may be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- Groups of people or couples will not normally be eligible except when meeting the criteria for a community group.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition of their particularly outstanding community contribution or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Nominations must be apolitical in their nature and should not in any way bring the awards program or local government area into disrepute.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.
