CEO CORNER

Welcome back to another CEO Corner and doesn't the weather continue to be fickle. Start harvest and get an inch of rain that would have been handy in August and September. Who'd be a farmer?

The Aquatic Centre has been open for the 20/21 season for a couple of weekends now. I see a few fanatics are braving the conditions for an early morning swim in a race to be first to Rottnest. Well done to the local community members who have been running the Bronze Medallion courses over the first two weekends. Assisting the youth of the community to gain such a qualification provides much needed skills, and allows the Shire to provide casual employment for 'Slide Operators' over summer helping them earn some Christmas pocket money.

Last week members of Shire staff had a meeting with KDHS regarding potential School Based Traineeships for Year 10 students in 2021. Such a positive initiative has been in the pipeline for some time and looks to be coming to fruition. The Shire will hopefully be working with KDHS students to provide a number of Traineeship opportunities. I believe there are other local businesses working closely with KDHS Principal Mr Garry Walker in developing

other Traineeship pathways. This is a great example of business, the Shire and KDHS working together on a great community initiative.

This week sees Judd and Grant Jenks represent the Shire at the Local Government Supervisors Association's annual conference. Judd is Vice President of this Association and a passionate asset to the sector in his role here. I will also be giving a presentation at this conference regarding how Shire's can expect to incorporate the significant funding of the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network program into their annual works program over the next 5 years. Upon his return next week, Judd will have a crew wet mixing the recently widened and reconstructed Dudinin-Jitarning Road prior to sealing in a couple of weeks.

Shire staff are also in discussions with Main Roads WA Wheatbelt Region regarding specific design requirements for upcoming projects around Kulin townsite. These requirements affect both local roads as well as State roads, with such ongoing consultation key to ensuring the works are implemented appropriately. The roadworks will hopefully be undertaken between January and April in the new year and will be on the following roads:

High Street
Johnston Street
Jilakin Street
CBH Access Road.

After last week's controversial topic post to stimulate some debate about vacant business premises on both Johnston and High Streets within the town centre, I have already had an enquiry regarding a potential premises and what steps need to be undertaken to activate that property. This is certainly a pleasing start to a challenging issue in the community. Hopefully this and other ventures can come to fruition in the short term for long term benefits to all stakeholders.

From a Development Services point of view, in recent weeks Shire staff have received quite a significant number of Development Applications and Building Applications. The Shire engage external contractors to review and process these applications, which are hopefully being done in a timely manner. From a community perspective it is great to see people working on initiatives to improve or upgrade their properties and assets. Should you have any questions on such processes please contact myself or Cassi directly and we can assist where possible, or seek an answer from our specific contractors.

Last Friday the Department of Local Government, Sporting and Cultural Industries released amendments to Regulations applying to local governments 2019-20 audited financial statements. The outcome for this is that it will delay the Office of the Auditor General in being able to process our annual audit. This will mean that our Annual Report will not be released until early 2021 and hence our Annual Electors Meeting will not be held until at least February 2021. Council will provide updated information once we know more regarding the audit process timeframe.

A few personal messages this week. Congratulations to Maureen Gillbard on her birthday celebrations over the weekend. Maureen brought a new business to town that is certainly having a positive impact within the community, which is all the more touching after the initial health challenges she had to endure shortly after moving to town.

Sadly, condolences go to our Shire President Barry West and family on the recent passing of his father. Our thoughts are with you and your family.

Shire of Kulin will be undertaking roadworks in the Kulin townsite from January 2021 and expected to end in March 2021.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN

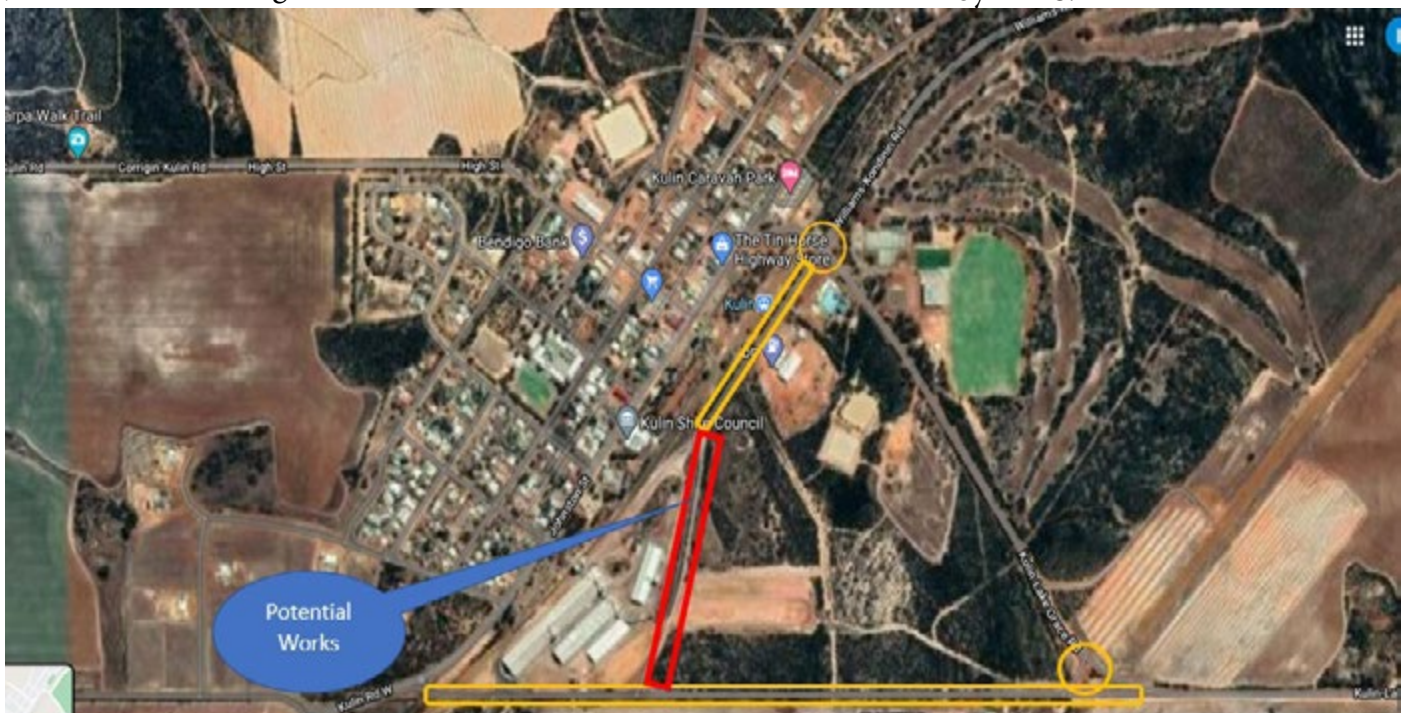
Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by your local government and are put in place when your local Bushfire Control Officer identifies the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery as high bushfire risk activities, during particular times of the day.

Kulin Shire will distribute this information via SMS and the harvest ban information line.

TOTAL FIRE BAN

A Total Fire Ban is declared on days when fires are most likely to threaten lives and property. This is because of predicted extreme fire weather or when there are already widespread fires and firefighting resources are stretched.

Total Fire Bans are put in place by DFES.

Road Maintenance / Plant Operator

Applications are invited for the position of a full time Road Maintenance/Plant Operator with the Shire of Kulin.

The successful applicant will be required to hold a HC licence (MC will be held in high regard) and completion of appropriate training as required by the *Code of Practice on Fatigue Management for Commercial Vehicle Drivers*. Applicants will be encouraged to undertake on the job training to become proficient in operating other items of Council plant and machinery, while appropriate off the job training will be provided as required. You will be responsible for the day to day running of council's machinery and equipment, while working an 8½ hour / 9 day fortnight.

Conditions of employment are in accordance with the Local Govt. Industry Award 2010. The successful applicant will be offered a total cash remuneration package of between \$60,000 - \$65,000 for an 84-hour fortnight spread across nine days and includes an RDO and housing allowance. There is the potential for higher earnings should the applicant be willing to complete further hours of overtime. Subject to availability at the time of the offer, subsidised housing may also be available to the successful candidate.

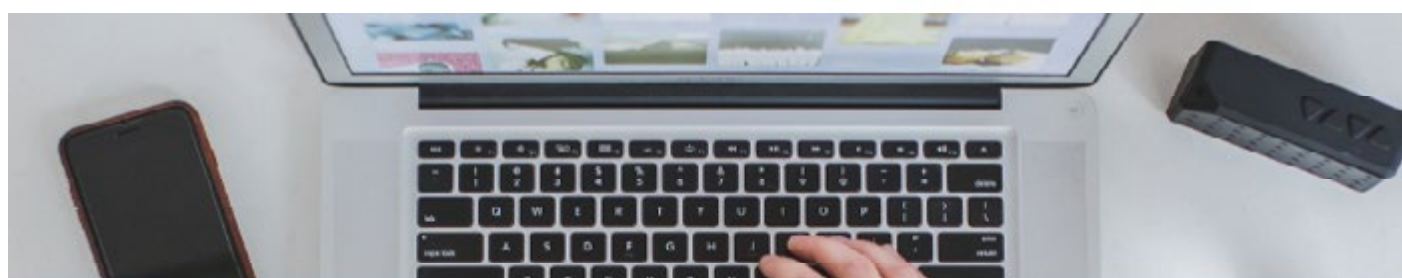

Hello from The Kulin Aquatic Centre

Thought I'd start up a bit of a write up for anyone interested in what's happening down here at the pool over the summer. This being my second season running this facility and think I've got my head around how it all works now!!

Last season was a bit of an eye opener for me with the numbers through the gate on weekends. Numbers were huge and that's great for the town. Big thanks to Oksana, Jay and Bro for the work they have done in and around the gardens near the slide and out around the fence. It looks great. Not sure Oksana appreciates my style of gardening with Roundup so she came to the rescue. Also to Ambrose who has spent quite a bit of time down here making the lawns what they are now. Anyone can push a mower but it's getting it to this point that takes time so thanks mate.

People might have noticed a bit of work going on down here from Sep through to about 2 weeks ago. Last year we found that the slide pool had a leak so we did some investigating with Travis in April then started the work to try to find it in Sep. We had success and have found and fixed the leak so that's a plus, as it was just a bit of an eyesore with all the water lying around last season.

We have also done a refurb on the slide pool to resurface this and also inside the Flumes of the slide to make it a bit friendlier to users. We had a test run last Fri with the invitation to a few shire staff who seemed to enjoy the ride judging by the amount of times they went up and down. I had to give it a go purely from a safety point of view and with a few not so flattering dismounts I decided it was fine.

This year I am doing early morning swimming again from 6am to 8am Tue to Fri so if you feel the need for a refreshing early morning swim, now is the time as it is a bit fresh but nice once you are in. We have had about 7 crazy's (sorry keen!) swimmers in the morning so far and they keep coming back so it can't be that bad. They are heading towards Rottnest and beyond again so who knows where they will end up. I think last season Bec swam almost to Brookton from here, some 5760 laps or 144km and she aims to beat that this year so go you. Rottnest is 19.7 km from Cottesloe beach and the same distance in the pool is only 788 laps then a couple extra to get to the Quokka's arms so come down and take on the challenge. You've got until the end of the season to complete it but think of the fun you can have getting fit for the winter sports.

Swimming club has started up again and are already pumping out the laps so keep up the good work kids and you will be at Rottnest before you know it

Come down relax have a cuppa or an ice cream and chill.

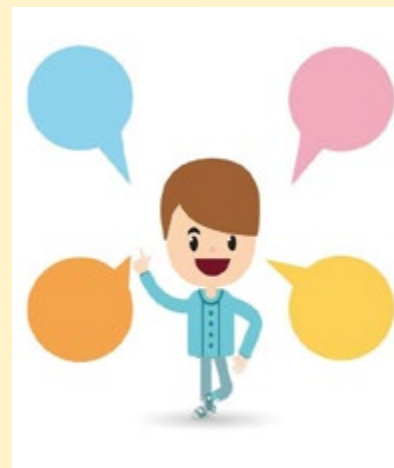

KULIN BENDIGO BANK AWARD

Recently the Kulin Community Bank branch was awarded the *Rural Bank Best All-Round Branch Performance of the Year 2020*.
