CEO CORNER

Welcome back to another CEO Corner. Seeding is drawing to a close, hopefully a bit more rain late this week and it looks like FOOTY is back on TV. This week saw us resume even more of a normality around the community. The Caravan Park and RV area have been opened for a few, CRC services are back to normal and now the FRC, gym and playgrounds have reopened in accordance with relevant restrictions.

June and July pose a bit of hectic month for Shire staff in the preparation of Council budget for 2020/21. An additional spanner has been thrown into these processes with COVID-19, but one such challenge is ability to determine how Kulin Shire Council is going to allocate and spend an additional \$1.1M of funding grants allocated by the Federal Government towards community infrastructure. These are in the form of the following grants.

- Drought Community Funding Program \$500,000
- Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program \$570,000
- Heavy Vehicle Safety and Productivity Program \$550,000

There are also various opportunities through State Government funding for community and recreation infrastructure and economic development, available that Shire staff are investigating, these include:

- Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund
 - Annual and Forward Grants \$2 million
 - Small Grants \$100,000
- Regional Economic Development Fund (\$100,000)
- Community Water Grants
- Bicycle Network Grants

As part of the project development process Council is seeking community input and feedback regarding projects identified to determine the key priorities for community infrastructure requirements that resonate within the community. Council are proposing to engage with the community via a proposed Community Workshop on Thursday 11th June 2020. The purposes of this proposed Workshop are:

- Funding provide overview of potential sources and opportunities.
- Projects outline proposed ideas and how they fit with each funding source.
- Survey identify community priorities.
- Conversation allow community to provide feedback to Council and Shire staff.
- COVID 19 provide update on how Council and the community have managed the challenge.

The Community Workshop will also contribute towards the initial stages of Council updating its Strategic Community Plan and Corporate Business Plan, both of which are due for a major review in 2020/21 financial year. It will allow the community members the opportunity to put forward ideas for consideration as part of the review process.

Next week sees our June Council Meeting. A key component of this will be Council discussing potential inclusions for 2020/21 Budget in preparation for adopting this budget at the July Meeting.

Friday 29th May 2020 marked a very special milestone for Shire staff. It was with great pleasure that we were able to hold a surprise celebratory morning tea to recognise Taryn Scadding's 20 years of service with the Shire of Kulin. On behalf of Council I'd like to publicly acknowledge this achievement and length of service from Taryn who, as our Community Development Officer, is an active driver within the organisation for community engagement and understanding and implementing the wider initiatives of the community and Council. Congratulations Taryn and I think the highlight of the morning was being able to keep it a secret from her. Council will further celebrate Taryn's service with a formal function at a later date to be determined along with other staff milestones.


We continue to thank the community for their on-going understanding and adherence to the COVID-19 restrictions. Until next time safe travels.

KULIN HOLDS THE REINS ON 2020 BUSH RACES EVENT

After a complete sell-out in 2019, the Kulin Bush Races Committee has regrettably announced the cancellation of its iconic regional event in 2020 due to COVID-19 restrictions.

For the past 25 years, the not-for-profit event, which is held every October, has attracted around 4,000 punters to the small Wheatbelt community. The event has raised much needed funds for local projects and communities in Kulin, such as, medical facilities, youth programs, the RFDS and other community facilities.

The Kulin Bush Races Committee, a group of local voluntary community members, waited for as long as possible in the hope that circumstances may have allowed them to bring yet another amazing race experience. However, with the uncertainty surrounding COVID-19, a decision was made at their last meeting to formally suspend what would have been their 26th event.

The newly elected Chairman, Tom Murphy, said, "Whilst the committee was incredibly disappointed, the strange new world was forcing the Kulin community and committee to slow down and use this break to focus on other important aspects of our event. We are putting our efforts into a new website and refreshing our branding, as after 25 years, both of these need a facelift and it will also create a better online experience for our race-goers."

Other initiatives would include getting involved in town projects and revamping some of the race-track amenities. Most importantly, the committee were continuing their planning of how to come back bigger and better in 2021.

"The whole reason for the Bush Races is to make Kulin a better place to live and visit," stated Tom.

"We want our patrons to be well looked after when they visit and whilst our committee have already been working tirelessly on an event we will have to cancel, some of the team are actually looking forward to a year off after 25 busy years!"

In the meantime, they urged Western Australians to get out and explore our amazing region, support local businesses and most importantly, start planning their trip out to Kulin in October 2021 because the community would be ready for them!

Tom Murphy said, "From a personal perspective, it has been a bizarre situation, as I have just taken over the reins from Graeme Robertson who, after 25 years of service to the committee as Chairperson, stepped down after the 2019 event."

"I would never have thought I'd have to cancel my first event as chairperson?"

"But it's such a privilege to be part of a dedicated and community minded committee who, given the opportunity to have a year off, just want to keep going."

Former Chairman Graeme Robertson said, "In all honesty, it has been a difficult decision for all involved, but the committee and community would learn some great lessons from this and would only add to its resilience."

And on reflection of his decision to hand the gauntlet to Victorian-born Tom, Graeme laughed that, "Regardless of COVID -19, the committee has learnt a really valuable lesson in handing over the chair to a Victorian!"

"But in all seriousness, we love running such an iconic event and seeing the joy it brings to our patrons, so bring on 2021!"

In the meantime, the Kulin Bush Races Committee are urging people to keep an eye on their social media as they still have a bit of fun planned for later in the year. They also encouraged all event goers, past and future, to stay safe and they looked forward to welcoming them back to Kulin in the near future.



RUNDLE WELCOMES FEDERAL FUNDS FOR STATE BARRIER FENCE

Member for Roe, Peter Rundle MLA has welcomed the \$1 million Australian Government investment towards the construction of the wild dog exclusion fence.

Mr Rundle said he was pleased to see this additional investment by the Federal Government towards such an important project.

"The Nationals WA have been strong advocates for this fence since its inception. It is especially rewarding to see that our proactive advocacy with Federal Minister David Littleproud has contributed to this result." Mr Rundle said.

Federal Minister David Littleproud visited Ravensthorpe in 2019 with Mr Rundle and Member for the Agricultural Region, Colin de Grussa MLC where he saw firsthand the issues being experienced by local farmers.

The Nationals WA Agriculture Spokesperson Colin de Grussa also welcomed the funding from the Federal Government.

"Having farmed in the Esperance region, I know full well the havoc being wreaked by wild dogs on agricultural and pastoral properties, as well as the significant efforts by farmers in the region in working tirelessly to progress this project over many years," Mr de Grussa said.

Mr de Grussa said it is absolutely vital to assist pastoralists, producers and farmers to increase productivity in sheep and other grazing operations to ensure that they are globally competitive, especially during these challenging times.

The \$1 million provided by the Federal Government will go towards the delivery of a 183 kilometre segment of the wild dog exclusion fence, which is an additional link to the 660 kilometre Esperance Extension project.




