As part of the role you will oversee the running of the Community Resource Centre as well as providing specialised administrative support to the Shire administration in tourism, desktop publishing, event management and media and community engagement. The successful applicant will possess excellent time management skills, will have relevant experience in an associated field and will be committed to working closely with Council to ensure potentially viable projects are fully developed.

Council are prepared to offer an annual salary in the vicinity of \$50-\$65k dependent upon qualifications and experience. The package also includes access to Council's superannuation matching scheme, salary packaging options and subsidised housing.

Trainee Finance Officer

What is involved?

As a Councillor you would be involved in running an organisation with the responsibility of making decisions that have a major impact on our lifestyle. As a representative of your community you will find the role enjoyable, challenging and stimulating with involvement in matters as diverse as recreation, the environment, town planning, health, roads and many more. Meeting fees and some expenses are paid.

Who can nominate?

Any person who is an Australian Citizen over the age of 18 years who is an elector of the district and is not disqualified under the *Local Government Act 1995* may nominate for council. It is not a requirement that a candidate lives or owns property in the ward for which they nominate.

When are elections held?

Local Government ordinary elections are held on the third Saturday in October every two years. The next local government ordinary elections will be held on 19 October 2019.

Councillors are elected for terms of four years in Western Australia. Elections are held every two years for half of the council, and candidates are elected using the first-past-the-post voting system. If a vacancy occurs within a term, an extraordinary election is held.

What training is available?

To ensure the Council members have the necessary training to understand and carry out their role, universal training for candidates and council members is being introduced, part of this training is to complete an online induction prior to nominating for election.

More information will be out soon in regards to Shire of Kulin Local Government elections, in the meantime, if you have thought about nominating to become a Councillor, but aren't sure if the role is for you please register for a free webinar to have all your questions answered!



We are loving exploring our finally completed new fort and beach sand play area and practicing our gross motor climbing, balancing and sliding skills as well as lots of sand play. The sand is wonderful and though its winter, feels like we are at the beach each and every day. When the fort was delivered it was in thousands of pieces, not in pre-fab form unfortunately, but many many thanks to Rob Doust and Sarah Reader, they spent long afternoons/evenings carefully piecing it all together, a very daunting task considering the amount of pieces to puzzle piece together. Then once it was ready, they were joined by generous volunteers who built the surrounds for the fort and sand to be placed. We are so very grateful to you all for all your hard work, the fort is certainly getting lots of use every day:-)







We would like to thank the AOOB'S so very much for their generous donation to the centre that will be used to replace the old beds and cot mattresses, and also a new mat for our change table. We appreciate your continued support of the centre and thankyou for your many years of generous support.

We have also been exploring different foods in our restaurant home corner experimenting picking up foods such as sushi with chopsticks, and learning roles of waiters, chefs and customers in a restaurant setting. This is to continue with our programme of occupations in our community and what type of equipment they might use. We are also planting our own crops in the garden area and are planning to ground our own grains to make our own flour to cook with. We have also been harvesting our home grown silverbeet, kale and eggs and creating lots of yummy treats on our cooking days such as spinach muffins – quite delicious in spite of the colour \square







We are also learning about printing with different objects such as fruit and vegetables, letter blocks, tools and large Lego blocks which help manipulation skills, the ability to move and position objects within one hand without the help of the other hand and to recognise symmetrical objects.









Our new fort/sand pit area seems to be an attractive area for cats to visit, so to keep our area natural and child friendly, we are planning to plant strong smelling plants completely around the area that are repelling to cats. We would appreciate any cuttings anyone can spare for us to plant as we will need a lot. These plants include rosemary, lemon balm, curry pants, lavender, thyme. We are sure there are many more plants that you all know that work as well, so if you are pruning back your plants please save some cuttings for us please.







The forum will allow plenty of time for sharing grower experiences and peer discussion between growers as well as specialist soil scientists.

The forums will spend time out in the paddock at soil pits as well as providing plenty of time for discussion in the shed and over lunch.

During the forum you will have opportunities to discuss the main constraints of local relevance including:

- Refresher on water holding capacity and root depth
- Sodic sub soils
- Alternative lime sources, morrell lime research
- What's happening at depth with heavier soils
- Managing shallow duplex soils
- Dry soils, poor performing gravels
- Waterlogged lake bank country
- Nematode activity in soils
- Deep ripping




