Well I survived my first Council Meeting. There was certainly some rigorous discussion around a number of topical items. Council awarded the procurement of a new 3 x 1 Transportable Dwelling to be located on Ellison Street. The Concept Forum saw in depth discussion with regard to the on-going challenges with Water Corporation Standpipes and the proposed pricing structure. Water Corporation representatives will be present at the next Council Meeting to clarify queries from Council. The Shire is aware of the challenges facing local farmers as a result of the extended dry summer. Council is also commencing the planning process for a new dam in the vicinity of the Pingaring townsite for the purpose for stock water.

There has been some recent confusion with information that the Shire has received from DFES regarding burning permits. In late February there were concerns from DFES with regard to the extreme dryness of the landscape and the fact that they were fighting a number of fires in the south west, which were consuming a significant number of both DFES and volunteer resources. At the time the advice the Shire received from DFES was not to issue any burning permits until further notice. Correspondence this week has DFES reiterate their concerns regarding the dryness of the landscape, but burning permits can now be issued at the discretion of the local Fire Control Officers. The Shire apologises for any confusion regarding the issuing of burning permits and implores that any autumn burning please be done in a safe manner taking into account all environmental conditions.

This week we've had a few dramas with power going down in the CBH area of the Kulin townsite. Unfortunately this meant that the Aquatic Centre was out of action for some time. It is back up and running now and open in time for this Friday's local school swimming carnival. Good luck to all students involved and hopefully the weather warms up for it.

On Saturday 16th March the Aquatic Centre will also host the Kulin Triathlon. This poses to be an event drawing the fit and not so fit from towns near and far. For those brave enough to enter please get your entries into Ruth at the Freebairn Recreation Centre. It will be interesting to see which winter sports team has been undertaking the most arduous pre-season and takes local honours on the day. Now doubt there will plenty of lycra on display as everyone tests out the progress of their new Year's fitness resolutions. Please be aware that traffic management and road closures will be in place on the day near the Aquatic Centre and CBH.

I was fortunate to attend the AGM of the Dudinin Action Group, which provided an opportunity to meet more constituents within the Shire. The passion for their community and local facilities was most evident. I was especially interested to also see their passion for "men's health" within the community as I enjoyed an extended discussion with the local gentleman of the area after the meeting.

There are plenty of upcoming events around the Shire which certainly showcases how passionate and vibrant the community is. These will no doubt keep everyone involved whilst the local farmers play the waiting game for the season to break as they prepare for seeding. Until next time safe travels.

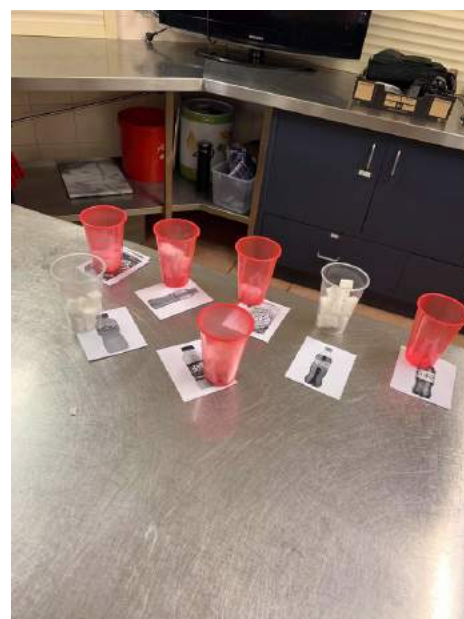

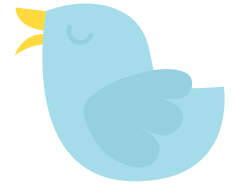

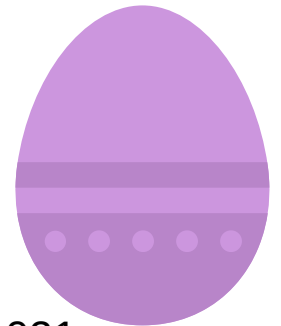

Childcare Happenings

Benefits of Block Play

Through block play children learn about sizes, shapes, numbers, order, area, length and weight as they begin to construct and build with blocks. Listed below are some suggested learning objectives that supports a child's overall development.

- ❖ Enables children to share and co-operate with others.
 - ❖ Facilitates development in spatial and mathematical realms, by helping children learn to understand concepts of length height weight and area.
 - ❖ Forces children to predict cause and effect relationships (seeing how high they can build before the blocks fall).
 - ❖ Involves solving problems related to construction (building a bridge).
 - ❖ Leads children to make use of physical principles (making towers of blocks for balance, creating supported bridges).
 - ❖ Involves children in making a sequence.
 - ❖ Involves classifying and sorting objects by size, shape and function (placing blocks of the same size together).
 - ❖ Leads children to utilize emergent reading and writing skills (making signs for building).
 - ❖ Provides children to demonstrate pride in accomplishments and develop a positive self-confidence.
- Involves the use of mathematical operations such as addition, subtractions and fractions (judging how many blocks are needed to fill a space).

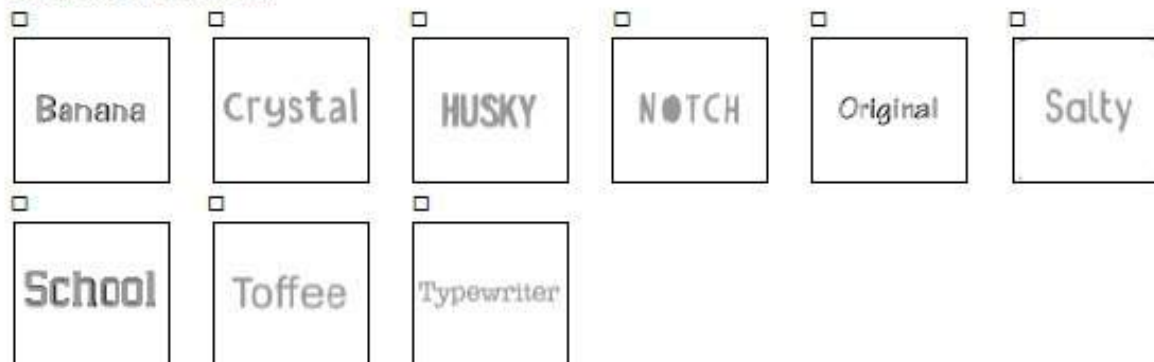
