What we've seen over east the past week, how the conditions and dryness of the current season provides a timely reminder of how fragile and susceptible our environment is to devastating and destructive fire. Hopefully harvest continues this summer in a safe manner without too many fire incidents.

The warm weather has certainly brought a busy start to the Kulin Aquatic Centre season. From all reports Jones is starting to make his mark and getting to know people throughout the community. Many of you may be aware that our illustrious Camp Kulin Manager – Tanya – is unfortunately on extended personal leave for the next 3 months over summer. On behalf of all Shire staff, Council and the community I wish Tanya well in her treatment and recovery. Council, Shire staff and remaining Camp Kulin staff are in the process of determining an appropriate course of action regarding the operation of Camp Kulin over the summer of 2019/20 in Tanya's absence. At this stage no decision has been made regarding the operation of Camp Kulin over the summer, as the Shire continues to gather information over the next two weeks in its endeavours to make an informed decision.

Next week I have been asked to represent Council at the ALGA National Local Roads Congress. This will be in Hahndorf, South Australia. Issues discussed at this conference correlate directly to the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network Project for which I have been the Project Technical Director for the past 3 years. Specific items on the program that are of interest to myself and regional Councils such as Kulin are: The State of Australia's Infrastructure to be outlined by Infrastructure Australia, Heavy Vehicle National Regulatory Review and an address by the Deputy Prime Minister, who is also Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development and has been instrumental in seeing the Federal Government put upwards of \$80M of funding toward the WSFN.

Next week Council Meeting will be on Thursday 21st November instead of its originally scheduled date of Wednesday 20th November.

Firebreaks

Firebreak Inspections will be undertaken at the start of November 2019. Fines will be issued for noncompliance.

The section of the firebreak order that applies to townsite land is as follows: "Land Area less than 1 hectare:-

- All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;
- It be recommended that at least a 2m wide area, immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs."

For information any land of one hectare or above the rural provisions apply. Your support and cooperation on this matter is greatly appreciated.

VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION STICKERS

Shire of Kulin's Bushfire Brigade AGM agreed to investigate and arrange for supply of DFES VIS (Vehicle Identification Stickers) to be issued to all relevant Brigade members with appliances and all Fire Control Officers. These stickers on vehicles and water tanks allow bushfire personnel to pass WA Police road blocks when attending a fire incident. On those occasions when WA Police have been requested to create a road block – they are required not to let any personnel through. Instances where fire respondents have also been turned away from assisting in fire control measures resulted in DFES and WA Police adopting a sticker based system to ensure the correct vehicles are allowed entry.

The Shire has now obtained stickers which expire in Sept 2020. These are available by collection from the Shire Office, please call in to collect yours from Trish when you are next in town.

WAMAWARDS 2019 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES & PERFORMERS ANNOUNCED

'THE SCIENTISTS'

One of the most influential post-punk bands to come out of WA, The Scientists had 2 primary incarnations: The Perth based punk band of the late 1970's and the swamp-rock band of the 1980's.

With a sound that was swampy, primal and modern-urban all at once – as much in tradition of the rock'n'roll and punk rock as it was a rejection of those things, The Scientists formula was as universal as it was specific to their own experience. They were about the experience of being young and living in modern times in an Australian urban / suburban environment. The themes of getting wasted on alcohol and drugs, driving round in hotted-up cars, being trapped in mundane jobs and paranoia were their subject matter. Machine throb bass and drums with jagged car wreck guitars were The Scientist's modus operandi. Fitting into no place of time, they spurned all but the most rudimentary and elemental of rick structures along with other people's modes of embellishment. The Scientist rejected the contemporary sound and look, so consequently were never able to carry around baggage that would allow them to date.

Throughout The Scientist's legacy, there has been no shortage of bands who have paid tribute to them in their own music. Mudhoney, Nirvana et al, Jon Spencer, the Von Bodies, The White Stripes and The Drones are among a long list of artists to cite influence and




inspiration from The Scientist.

SHEARING - Now.

'Todays sheds are steel, with good pens and yards (that can keep the sheep dry overnight) and makes the shearing easier. The sheds are connected to the electricity grid. There are hydraulic wool presses





and electric shearing motor systems. Some sheds have raised boards to make the work easier for the shed hands. Shearers now use 'wide' combs and cutters which were introduced from New Zealand in the early 1970's and met locally by

farmers with considerable resistance. Shearers were used to 'narrow' gear and the wider gear require skill and different techniques. Most shearing today is done on a full contract basis where the contractor supplies shearers (full time professionals), shed ands, wool pressers, wool classers, and food (and accomodation) for the workers.' - Bill






