Welcome back to another CEO Corner for 2019, nearly the end of November and harvest is still ticking along.

Last week I represented Council at the ALGA National Local Roads Congress in Hahndorf, South Australia. Key points of note were that local government roads in Australia account for \$445B in non-financial assets which is 75% of the value of all road assets across the country. Approximately 9% of these are in very poor condition so are in need of immediate upgrade, repair or reconstruction. This equates to a value of \$40B of local government expenditure required across the country. Currently there is over a \$300M gap in infrastructure funding to address this issue, creating a backlog of work requirements. ALGA is in constant talks with the Federal government who are investing in local government road infrastructure projects via Roads to Recovery as well as Roads of Strategic Importance Initiative. The Federal Government is encouraging local governments with shovel ready projects to prioritise them and bring them forward in their works programs and bring forward the funding available. The purpose of this is two-fold in that it improves assets earlier as well as stimulates the local and national economies. The challenge across a lot of Australia at the moment is finding sufficient available water supplies to undertake such projects in a drought-stricken environment, as water is a key component of road building.

Next week is the WALGA Central Country Zone Meeting which will be attended by myself, President West and Councillor Duckworth. This is the regions opportunity to gather and put forward key issues affecting our area to the wider local government community.

The Kulin Aquatic Centre season is in full swing. Weekends have ranged from stifling hot to warm, ensuring the patronage is well up. Visitors from all across the south west have been making the journey to town to utilise our great facility.

Camp Kulin has been ticking along in Tanya's absence. From the beginning of November until the end of school term we have 3 school camps booked in. Amy Thomas has been stepping up to the plate running these camps. Amy has some great skills having just completed her degree in Youth Work. She's certainly learning on the run at the moment, but this will be experience for her and will stand her and Camp Kulin in great stead in the long run. I believe that Amy has also learnt some new culinary skills along the way. Thanks to the local volunteers who have also assisted in the kitchen across the camps, as well as our resident backpacker Maddi. As a famous AFL coach says "one solider out, another one in". It's been great to see the adaptability of the staff to continue this great component of the Shire.

Council and Shire are staff are still collating information to determine the viability of running the Camp Kulin school holiday summer camps. It was discussed at Council last week. We are in the process of identifying if additional appropriate resources are available to assist with these camps. Any previous volunteers, especially those with significant camp experience who are interested in assisting the Shire and Camp Kulin over the summer are encouraged to contact either myself or Amy.

Council has been in consultation with Ms MacPhersons Year 8 English class who wrote to the Shire expressing ideas for youth community infrastructure facilities. I was fortunate enough to address all of the high school a couple of weeks ago to discuss their ideas and commence a process for identifying the key priorities of the youth. There have been some quality ideas put forward along the themes of; teen playground, skate park, teen hang out building and heat the aquatic centre. There was some great discussion and questions from the students and I look forward to progressing their ideas further. Unfortunately, on the day I was upstaged by local AFL premiership star Liam Baker, who was much more interesting to talk to than me. It was great to see Liam in Kulin giving his time back to the kids and the community. It certainly reduced the risk of harvester fires for the day.

KULIN UPDATE

Water Supply in a Bushfire This information could save your life.

If you plan to stay and defend your home you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. Scheme water may not be available due to damaged infrastructure and cuts to electricity. Experience shows that when there is extreme demand water supply and pressure are at risk.

Water Corporation makes preparation for the bushfire season to cope with extreme conditions. Despite these efforts, it is likely there will be a reduction in water pressure, and scheme water supply tanks may run dry in the event of fire.

Use the Department of Fire & Emergency Services resources to develop a bushfire survival plan that is suitable for your family and personal situation: You can find more information online at: DFES Fire plan

To support bushfire plans, people with groundwater bores and surface water access can take and store emergency water without it counting against their entitlements. For more information on this and for the location of emergency bushfire water supplies in dryland agricultural areas visit the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation's website.

Drinking water

We recommend you keep a supply of drinking water available throughout summer in case your water supply is interrupted.

Assistance for customers affected by bushfire

After a bushfire we are able to assist you with issues such as damaged water meters and payment difficulties. If you have been affected by bushfire please call us on 13 13 85.

The Emergency WA website provides emergency information and community safety warnings. Call 000 in a life threatening emergency or the SES 132 500 for emergency assistance













What to do in an emergency...

When a bushfire event starts and before you hook into the water supply system, call us on 13 13 75 (24 hours a day/7 days a week).

If we know where your crews are headed, we might be able to provide you with a better location where you can maintain pressure for longer OR we might be able to do something to our water supply system which will mean that we can keep it running for a fraction longer.

HOWEVER, there is no guarantee that we can prolong supply or pressure, and experience has shown that once the town is threatened and there is mass demand, the supply will lose pressure and may empty.

Hydrants

Location – if you are unsure where your hydrants are located, please contact DFES or our Operations Centre on 13 13 75 who will provide you with the exact geographical locations.

Testing - If you intend to test hydrants in your area, please let us know first. Often a side-effect of using the hydrants is that nearby residences receive discoloured water.

If we're aware of the exercise beforehand, we can ensure our operators are prepared and ready to respond to any complaints.

Broken hydrants

Please note – any issues with hydrants should be reported up through DFES.

DFES will contact Water Corporation and a work order will be actioned immediately.

Reminder to residents in your Shire

Help us spread the word to people that they cannot rely on mains water in a bush fire when other critical infrastructure such as power has been damaged.



TOTAL FIRE BAN

A Total Fire Ban is declared on a day when a fire is most likely to catch and spread rapidly or if there are already widespread fires.

If you ignore a Total Fire Ban, you may receive an infringement up to \$2,500.00 with possible jailed time.

WHAT YOU CAN AND CAN'T DO

BARBECUING/COOKING OUTDOORS

You can NOT use any BBQ or cooker (including Webers) that requires solid fuel:

- Wood
- Charcoal
- Heat beads

You CAN use a gas or electrical BBQ or cooker if:

- It's a permanent BBQ in a public space
- It's in your home
- It has an enclosed flame
- You clear all material that could burn within a 5m radius around it

LOOKING AFTER YOUR FARM

If you're a farmer, you CAN:

- Harvest your crop
- Feed or water your stock in a paddock
- Operate or move an airplane or helicopter If you conduct any of the above activities, you must ensure:
- Your vehicle is mechanically sound
- The exhaust system is in good condition
- All reasonable precautions have been taken to prevent bushfire starting

During a total Fire Ban AND a Harvest and Movement Ban in place, you can NOT use a vehicle, equipment or machinery that is powered by an internal combustion engine on land covered by bush, crop, pasture or stubble.

ANYONE WHO LIVES IN WA

In open-air, you can NOT:


- Light, maintain or use a fire (even when camping)
- Burn leaves, garden waste or grass cutting
- Use an incinerator
- Grind, weld, solder, gas cut or use any other type of 'hot work'
- Use fireworks
- Operate a hot-air balloon
- Use an outdoor wood-fired pizza oven or stove

In any area where there is bush, crops, pasture, or stubble, you can NOT use equipment powered by an internal combustion engine, such as:

- A chainsaw or lawnmower
- A plant or grass trimmer
- Bobcats, excavators, bulldozers or other similar machinery
- A welder
- A car
- A tractor
- A motorbike or quad bike
- An angle grinder
- A dune buggy
- A generator

You CAN undertake these activities inside your shed ONLY IF it is fully enclosed on all sides.

HARVESTING - then

The first harvester was a stripper which removed and thrashed the heads and the result was dumped in a heap then bucketed into a winnower to separate the wheat from the chaff. H. V. McKay combined the two machines (which led to the modern header). Seventy years ago a harvester pulled by a tractor was the usual, with a 9' front with the grain bagged from a bin. The tractor was often driven from the harvester. A good days work was 8 to 9 tonnes of grain.



The photo, from the mid 1920's, (from a glass negative) shows a Taylor Header pulled by a McCormick Deering 15-30 tractor with solid steel wheels. (ouch). Pneumatic tires (soft ride) became available from 1933.




