Well I think harvest is upon us, a couple of warm weekends have certainly brought it on quite quick. A few water cooler discussions suggest that it will likely be a short harvest, weather permitting, but let's keep optimistic of some good yields across the district. We've already had our first harvest ban, but that's unsurprising given the fickle weather across the year. Lucky we are a resilient bunch!

The Kulin Aquatic Centre has opened for the 2019/20 season. This year the Shire is encouraging all people seeking "Season Passes" to pay them directly at the Aquatic Centre. This will allow our new Manager "Jones" to get to know everyone and assist with payment processing. Jones has taken the initiative to open for early morning swimming from 6am to 8am. I dragged myself down there this morning and pumped out an energetic 500m. Jones is keeping a log for all keen swimmers to see if they can cumulatively get to Rottnest over the course of the summer. I think my 500m so far means I got to the Cottesloe Pylon and made it safely back to shore. All jokes aside, it's a great initiative and let's see who gets there first. Maybe there could be an incentive for "The First to Rotto 2019/20" in the form of a complimentary season pass for 2020/21?

Last night I was fortunate to attend the "Kulin Development Co-operative" Meeting. It looks like another great community initiative is taking shape at a rapid rate. This group is investigating and implementing ideas for business incubation within the community. Potentially their first idea might be taking off before Xmas and they'll be seeking expressions of interest for investment in the coming weeks. Kudos to Barry West and Graeme Robertson and all others involved for driving this forward.

The summer sports season is well underway. Some mixed results for pennant tennis and bowls, whilst the Roodogs are yet to register a win in the cricket. Hopefully this week against arch rivals Narembeen presents an opportunity for the Roodogs to get on the board.

On Sunday evening, myself and Councillors West and Varone attended the official opening of the Holt Rock Tennis Club court resurfacing project. Council has contributed \$27,000 towards this project in conjunction with the local Progress Association, Shire of Lake Grace and Tennis Australia. It was great to see so many people at a vibrant community event which showcased how multiple partners can deliver community infrastructure projects. Well done to Graeme Atkins and Clare Hyde and the team at Holt Rock.

Last week Camp Kulin was fortunate enough to be awarded \$100,000 grant from Impact100 WA to undertake a "Counsellor in Training" program. This is great fillet and exciting opportunity for Tanya and the team.

The Works crew have been ever busy with their capital roads program. The past few weeks have seen them undertaking works on Karlgarin – North Lake Grace Road, Pope Road, Mallee Valley Road and Gregson Road.

The FRC Committee AGM and Combined Sports Club Meetings were held last week, congratulations and thanks to the volunteers associated with these committees. There have been some concerns raised regarding the FRC court surface. Shire staff will investigate this in conjunction with the committee and relevant sports clubs. Over the next month the gym will also undergo a refurbishment with new equipment and finally getting the floor level and new carpet. During this time the gym will likely be out of service.

Great to hear of the "Business After Hours" group and Cultivating Kulin Committee meetings taking place last week, further examples of community collaboration to continue to build upon the great fabric of the Kulin community. Garrick Yandle CEO

Firebreaks

Firebreaks must be done by TODAY, 31st October 2019.

Firebreak Inspections will be undertaken during the first week of November 2019. Fines will be issued for non-compliance.

The section of the firebreak order that applies to townsite land is as follows: "Land Area less than 1 hectare:-

- All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;
- It be recommended that at least a 2m wide area, immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs."

For information any land of one hectare or above the rural provisions apply. Your support and cooperation on this matter is greatly appreciated.

VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION STICKERS

Shire of Kulin's Bushfire Brigade AGM agreed to investigate and arrange for supply of DFES VIS (Vehicle Identification Stickers) to be issued to all relevant Brigade members with appliances and all Fire Control Officers. These stickers on vehicles and water tanks allow bushfire personnel to pass WA Police road blocks when attending a fire incident. On those occasions when WA Police have been requested to create a road block – they are required not to let any personnel through. Instances where fire respondents have also been turned away from assisting in fire control measures resulted in DFES and WA Police adopting a sticker based system to ensure the correct vehicles are allowed entry.

The Shire has now obtained stickers which expire in Sept 2020. These are available by collection from the Shire Office, please call in to collect yours from Trish when you are next in town.

EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

Kulin Community Cropping "Airstrip" farmland Loc 165 & "Proud's" farmland Loc's 13765 & 9838 Kulin Shire Council is seeking Expressions of Interest from local community groups for "Kulin Community Cropping Lease" for the following parcels of land immediately adjacent to the Kulin townsite.

Airstrip - \$10 per hectare (approx. 50 ha) Proud's - \$10 per hectare (approx. 110 ha)

Lease Terms and Conditions

The following conditions and management practices shall be adopted over the term of the lease:

1. Commercial Details

- a. All income from the cropping land is to be retained by the lessee.
- b. The lease period is to be for 3 or 6 years.
- c. Lease period commences February 2020.
- d. The lease will be reviewed within 6 months of expiry.
- e. In years 1, 2, 4 and 5 any crop can be planted.
- f. In years 3 and 6 a break crop is to be planted, this is classified by one of the following; lupins, peas, canola or chemical fallow.

2. Agronomy

- a. An agronomist is to be consulted to assist with the cropping program
- b. A written record of cropping procedures is to be maintained, eg chemical, fertiliser and crop rotation.
- c. Soil testing is required in the first month of the term, the results of which should be provided to the Shire for historical purposes.
- d. All test results and written records must be forwarded to the Shire annually for record keeping purposes.
- e. A minimum of 10 units / hectare of phosphorus and potassium is to be applied each year.
- f. In the first year of the lease a lime application of 2 tonnes / hectare is to be applied.
- g. Summer spraying is to be carried out by the lease in the last 6 months of the term.

3. Maintenance

- a. All burning, removal of chaff heaps, water consumption, picking of rocks etc, and other operating costs associated with the cropping program are the responsibility of the lease.
- b. Firebreaks will be the responsibility of the Shire as the lessor.

Camp Kulin Update

IMPACT 100





Camp Kulin is very excited to have been awarded a \$100,000 grant from Impact 100 WA, a sub fund of the Australian Communities Foundation. We started our journey 6 months ago when we were one of 67 applicants. We were invited to submit a full application, where we then got shortlisted to the Top 10. Tanya, Amy and some of our board members, camp counsellors, campers and their parents then made a two hour presentation to some of the Impact 100 WA donors. Donors met to select the final 5 - Type 1 Diabetes Family Centre, One Voice Mobile Toilets, Earbus Foundation, Ishar Multicultural Women's Health Services and Camp Kulin.

Each of the final 5 then had six minutes to make a pitch to 250 donors and guests at the State Reception Centre in Perth. The Camp Kulin presentation was made by Tanya and one of our campers, Billy, who spoke about how camp has impacted him and his family. Following all the presentations, each donor was given two pebbles to put into voting jars. The two organisations with the most pebbles - Camp Kulin and Earbus Foundation - were then awarded a \$100,000 grant each. The remaining organisations were all awarded \$10,000 each.

The grant will go towards a counsellor-in-training (CIT) program for our teen campers. We will identify teens aged 14-15 who have come through our kids camp program and show leadership potential. Over a two year period, they will then be put through an intense leadership development program incorporating residential workshops, becoming a junior camp counsellor, group activities and one-on-one mentoring. At the end of their training, they will have the skills they need to become camp counsellors themselves.

We would like to say a huge thank you to everyone at Impact 100 and all the donors for selecting us for this grant, it is going to make a huge difference to so many kids across WA, including here in Kulin.



SHEARING - Then ...



'Shearing in the old days...

The shed was the old stables with a straw roof & posts standing side by side for walls

with a dirt floor covered by old bags sown together. No mechanical press, just four

wooden sides with a fixed top bale pack tramped by feet. Pieces, bellies & locks were in loose



packs hanging from the roof on

packs hanging from the roof on wires. Part bales were accommodated by two jute bags opened on one

side then sown together to form a big bag known as a fudge.

Two shearers with what was called a semiportable shearing plant. This was unloaded from an old truck after sinking the



wheels in holes and sliding the plant down a plank' - Clarrie.





Kulin Police Station is a 2 person station and operates on a shift basis. We also attend calls when required out of hours. For this reason the Police Station will NOT always be manned.
