Congratulations to the residents of West Kulin and our near neighbours in Corrigin and Wickepin Shires – finally the West Kulin Telstra tower is up and operational.

Typically nothing happens without effort and for Barry and Peta West and a number of the West Kulin residents; it's been 7 years in the making since the original "sale of Telstra" funding was announced as mobile blackspot improvements funding. At the opening on Friday 13th, Telstra and State Government staff confirmed that if it had not been for the constant intervention of Kulin residents, the tower would have been built in the original location. This would have reduced the footprint coverage by 33%. After much argie bargie over many a long year; the additional funding (\$100k) was found to place the tower on the Doyle Rd location.

The view from the Telstra site at Doyle Rd is outstanding, and it is easy to see why common sense prevailed. I am told that at night, lights of Kondinin, Corrigin and Yealering can be seen, so the value of going that extra kilometre up the hill makes a lot of sense and a real difference to reception.

An analogy of what happened really! Well done to all.



ANZAC DAY TREATS

Chewy ANZAC Biscuits

Ingredients

1 cup rolled oats
 1 cup plain flour
 2/3 cup brown sugar
 2/3 cup desiccated coconut
 125g butter, chopped
 2 tablespoons golden syrup
 1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

Method

Step 1: Preheat oven to 160°C/140°C fan-forced. Line 3 baking trays with baking paper.

Step 2: Combine oats, flour, sugar and coconut in a bowl. Place butter, syrup and 2 tablespoons cold water in a saucepan over medium heat. Stir for 2 minutes or until butter has melted. Stir in bicarbonate of soda. Stir butter mixture into oat mixture.

Step 3: Roll level tablespoons of mixture into balls. Place on trays, 5cm apart. Flatten slightly. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes or until light golden (see note). Stand on trays for 5 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. Serve.

Make Your Own Poppy For ANZAC Day

1. Turn the two cupcake cases inside out.


2. Cut a wavy edge — in about 1 cm from the edge — around the first cupcake case.

3. Cut a wavy edge — in about 0.5 cm from the edge — around the second cupcake cases.

4. Draw a black centre inside the smaller cupcake case and small lines coming out from the centre to give that Poppy-Centre look (refer to the image of a wild poppy below).

5. Glue the smaller cupcake case inside the larger one.

6. Glue the flower on to the bamboo rod (or paddle pop stick/straw). If your rod or paddle pop stick is not already green (you can buy them coloured), simply colour in with texta or paint.
