CEO CORNER

The State Government review of the Local Government Act 1995 has produced the first set of recommendations after an extensive public and industry consultation process.

Remembering that there have been numerous high profile local governments under investigation in the recent past with both Councillors and staff being questioned for their ethics and actions.

The first phase of the LG Review recommends;

- Universal training of candidates and council members, including ongoing professional development
- Revised gift framework (\$300 max gift) that provides clarity and meets community expectations
- Modernised public notice requirements and provide greater flexibility for local governments to better inform their community
 - Reforms to better manage behaviour, including;
 - Mandatory codes of conduct for council members, candidates and staff and new sanctions; and
- Reporting requirements associated with breaches to drive cultural change
- Improvements to ensure greater consistency in CEO recruitment, performance management and termination through mandatory standards developed in consultation with the sector.

As is the way, the additional cost of this governance will be left for Local Government and ratepayers to bear.



Healthy Eating Kulin Echidna Guides Style

We have been discussing and experimenting with different foods to create simple healthy snacks and meals we can make ourselves. With the recent purchase of a small electric oven we have been able to even do some cooking without having to find an oven in another venue. We have made pita bread pizzas (baby spinach and pine nuts were a new addition for everyone), super sandwiches (really not sure about pineapple in a sandwich) and 4 Ingredient Banana Oat Slice (without nuts so it can be made for school snacks). Next term we will be looking at simple main meals and desserts that are low in sugar and follows the healthy eating food pyramid.

























4 Ingredient Banana Oat Slice

2 large, very ripe bananas

2 cups old-fashioned rolled oats

1/4 cup chopped dried fruit

1/4 cup chopped nuts (for nut-free version use extra 1/4 cup of dried fruit)

- * Pre-heat oven to 180°C
- Peel the bananas and mash very thoroughly until no large chunks remain - the bananas should be essentially liquid.
- Add the oats and stir them in. Stir in the fruit & nuts.
- Transfer to a greased baking dish and use a fork to press down.
- Bake until the edges just begin to crisp up, about 30 minutes.

Important changes to your recycling of Glass

Shire of Kulin advise that GLASS is no longer to be placed in the yellow-lid recycling bins. All glass is to be put in the household general waste bin (green lid bin). Glass placed in your general waste bin will be emptied by the waste truck, compacted with the other waste and taken to the Bendering Landfill. The compaction will mean that the glass will be partially crushed and this will help reduce the amount of space that it takes up in the landfill.

If you are concerned that your green bin is already full each week and you cannot fit glass in too, Shire of Kulin have a glass bin at the transfer station. The glass will be collected by Avon Waste and will be taken to the Bendering Landfill site.

Glass currently causes major issues when included as a recycled product. Broken glass contaminates the other recyclables, such as cardboard, which makes these products unable to be recycled also.

While glass is a recyclable product unfortunately the amount of glass being recycled is a lot more that the markets demand. This is especially true in Western Australia, where we have a lack of local markets and major transport costs to take the glass to a market. As such, most glass is taken out of the recycling stream by the materials recovery facilities and sent to landfill. We would love for this situation to change and there become a market to utilise the glass but at this stage there is just too much glass. initiatives like the container deposit scheme (due to be rolled out in the next two years) will help to change the future for glass and we look forward to seeing what this situation will do for the product.

2018/2019 Shire of Kulin Budget

The draft budget was considered and adopted during the council meeting held on Wednesday the 18th of July, 2018. Rising utility, insurance and employee costs coupled with reductions in both State and Federal grant funding meant that a rate increase of 3.5% was unavoidable. As is usual for the Shire of Kulin, road maintenance and construction is high on the list of priorities and as a result make up a significant portion of our budgeted expenditure with the total cost of the program totalling \$2,615m. Other significant projects include the construction of staff housing, the replacement of the community bus, a contribution to the working group (Kulin Bush Races, Shire and Bendigo Bank) for a significant town project and upgraded town and boundary signage. More detailed information regarding the budget will be provided to you when rate notices are prepared and sent out.



Pingaring Tank/Standpipe

Pingaring town standpipe will now require an access card for water - please contact the office if you require a card. Also note that the water level is low and people are advised to use other standpipes where possible. The mains connection to this standpipe is only a temporary short term fix until the tank on the hill has sufficient amount of rain water.
