Haydn McInnes Receives Melvin Jones Fellowship

Haydn McInnes recently completed 3 years as the Lions Zone Chairman. Over this time Haydn has travelled between Kulin, Hyden, Esperance, Kondinin, Lake Grace, Narembeen and Pingrup racking up a total of 7,206 kilometres in the last 12 months. Haydn has contributed a huge amount of time and effort in his role saying he “enjoyed the challenges this year has brought”. A highlight of Haydn’s time as Zone Chairman was arranging the re-badging of the Meridian plaque at Ravensthorpe, 2km South on the Ravensthorpe Albany Road.

Haydn was formally recognised for his outstanding contributions, being presented with a Melvin Jones Fellowship. DG Grant described Haydn as being one of the most deserving Lions. The Melvin Jones Fellow award is only bestowed on those who have been recognised for outstanding work with Lions. When speaking with Haydn about his Fellowship and his extensive involvement with Lions he humbly said “I don’t do it for myself or the recognition but it is all for the benefit of the community”. We would like to congratulate Haydn on his well-deserved Fellowship and also thank him for his ongoing dedication and contribution to the Kulin & Kondinin Lions Club and our community.

Active members of the Butlers Garage recently came to me and asked if it was possible to do a monthly write up about what's happening at the Garage in the hope of sparking interest amongst locals. Once a month you will find a spread on what's happening at the Garage and some pictures to entice you into the Garage.

In recent weeks the Garage has been busy with general visitors, a school group visit and a group of kids during the school holidays. At the moment the men and women of the Garage have a number of projects underway including the restoration of the 1925 Chevrolet Truck (pictured below). They are rebuilding parts of the truck including the engine and redesigning the cab. They are also repairing a Simplicity engine out of an old chaff cutter.

When I visited the Garage today there is work being done to clear a large area in the back section of the Garage. This area is going to be concreted thanks to the funding by from Kulin Bush Races and in kind works by Sean Scadding. The concrete pad will be used to work on and display machinery. Butlers Garage recently acquired other donations they'd like to mention including a gas welding plant which was donated by The AG Shop and gas bottles by AOOBS.

Butlers Garage became incorporated with the Men's Shed Association about 4 years ago but encourage women to become members as well. Butlers Garage already has 4 women who are members and they welcome more to join. With plenty of projects on the go more helping hands wouldn't go astray.

WHAT CAN GO INTO MY RECYCLE BIN?



What NOT to put in your Recycle Bin



Green waste
(Belongs in the waste bin)



Nappies
(Belong in the waste bin)



Polystyrene
(Belongs in the waste bin)



Food scraps
(Belong in the waste bin)



Glass
(Recycling options available at your local transfer station, otherwise belongs in the waste bin)



Important changes to your recycling of Glass

Shire of Kulin advise that GLASS is no longer to be placed in the yellow-lid recycling bins. All glass is to be put in the household general waste bin (green lid bin). Glass placed in your general waste bin will be emptied by the waste truck, compacted with the other waste and taken to the Bending Landfill. The compaction will mean that the glass will be partially crushed and this will help reduce the amount of space that it takes up in the landfill.

If you are concerned that your green bin is already full each week and you cannot fit glass in too, Shire of Kulin have a glass bin at the transfer station. The glass will be collected by Avon Waste and will be taken to the Bending Landfill site.

Glass currently causes major issues when included as a recycled product. Broken glass contaminates the other recyclables, such as cardboard, which makes these products unable to be recycled also.

While glass is a recyclable product unfortunately the amount of glass being recycled is a lot more than the markets demand. This is especially true in Western Australia, where we have a lack of local markets and major transport costs to take the glass to a market. As such, most glass is taken out of the recycling stream by the materials recovery facilities and sent to landfill. We would love for this situation to change and there become a market to utilise the glass but at this stage there is just too much glass. Initiatives like the container deposit scheme (due to be rolled out in the next two years) will help to change the future for glass and we look forward to seeing what this situation will do for the product.

Don't miss the opportunity to get a better understanding of sustainability and recycling. Karla Hooper – Earth Girl, will be presenting a community workshop on Thursday 26th July (see flyer attached)

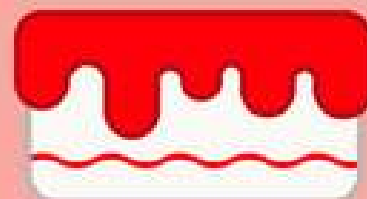
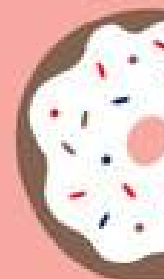

2018/2019 Shire of Kulin Budget

The draft budget was considered and adopted during the council meeting held on Wednesday the 18th of July, 2018. Rising utility, insurance and employee costs coupled with reductions in both State and Federal grant funding meant that a rate increase of 3.5% was unavoidable. As is usual for the Shire of Kulin, road maintenance and construction is high on the list of priorities and as a result make up a significant portion of our budgeted expenditure with the total cost of the program totalling \$2,615m. Other significant projects include the construction of staff housing, the replacement of the community bus, a contribution to the working group (Kulin Bush Races, Shire and Bendigo Bank) for a significant town project and upgraded town and boundary signage. More detailed information regarding the budget will be provided to you when rate notices are prepared and sent out.

Pingaring Tank/Standpipe

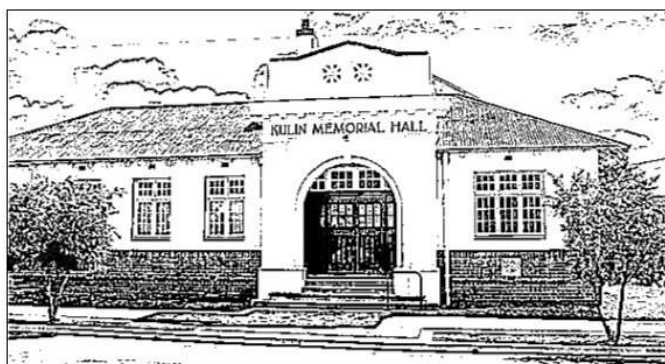
