CEO CORNER

The recent sudden and substantial increases in fuel pricing nationally forced the Shire to reconsider its own fuel pricing policy. For the past two years the Shire has been gathering data on sales, so that we can transfer all “profits” (excess income over expenses) into a Reserve Fund to be used for the eventual replacement of the fuel facility. Two years of data has allowed a thorough look at the financial margins and the Shire’s plan is to recover the future replacement cost of the asset over the projected life of the asset.

As a result, the Shire has been able to reduce fuel pricing margins by approx. 5 cents per litre (at present) and if sales remain strong, these levels should still deliver the required annual transfer to Reserve.

I am sure this will be a welcomed benefit for those who do regular high kilometres. As an aside, the Shire also offers monthly accounts for approved clients who are regular users of the fuel facility.

As always, these matters are frequently under review and outcomes are generally driven by sales, so as the old adage suggests, we are able to support those who support us and many thanks to those who do. I look forward to doing another analysis of the results in a few months.



Footy Biscuits

Ingredients:

1 cup butter, softened
1 cup sugar
2 eggs
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
3 cups all-purpose flour
2 teaspoons cream of tartar
1 teaspoon baking soda

Icing:

4 cups confectioners' sugar
8 to 10 tablespoons hot water
6 to 8 teaspoons baking cocoa
Black paste food coloring



DIRECTIONS

In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in vanilla. Combine the flour, cream of tartar and baking soda; gradually add to creamed mixture and mix well. Cover and refrigerate for 3 hours or until easy to handle.

On a lightly floured surface, roll out dough to 1/8-in. thickness. Cut with a football-shaped cookie cutters. Place 2 in. apart on ungreased baking sheets.

Bake at 180 degrees for 8-10 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove to wire racks to cool.

In a large bowl, combine confectioners' sugar and enough hot water to achieve spreading consistency; beat until smooth. Divide icing into thirds. Add red colour to one third of the glaze; stir until smooth. Spread the red glaze over football cookies. Pipe white glaze for the football laces.

Growers support WA charities with over \$1.1 million in HMMS donations

The CBH Group has continued our strong support of Western Australian charities as total donations from voluntarily forfeited grain from the state's growers reach more than \$1.1 million.

Developed in conjunction with Main Roads WA, the Harvest Mass Management Scheme (HMMS) seeks to reduce the frequency of overloaded grain trucks arriving at CBH receival sites.

During harvest, growers can forfeit grain from overloaded trucks, which is then sold and funds provided to WA charities.

During the 2017-18 harvest, the HMMS generated \$148,000 from 496 tonnes of grain that was surrendered. Since the scheme started in 2012, a total of \$1,123,500 has been donated to charities active in regional WA.

This year, the HMMS will support the Kids Cancer Support Group, Country Women's Association of WA, RedKite, Ronald McDonald House, St John Ambulance and Camp Kulin. The charities are nominated by growers and the co-operative's employees.

CBH Chairman Wally Newman presented cheques of up to \$25,000 to each of the charities at an event this morning.

Mr Newman said it was gratifying to see a program that can generate much needed funds for charities while acting as a deterrent to overloading trucks.

"Never in the history of West Australian road transport has there been such an effective and practical deterrent to overloading, so much so that no one intentionally overloads delivery to CBH," Mr Newman said.

"The HMMS is unlike any other initiative. On one hand it seeks to reduce the amount of overloaded trucks during harvest which has long-term infrastructure benefits. On the other hand, it's a very effective reason not to overload.

“CBH is committed to safer roads and supporting rural communities, and through HMMS, growers are extending their support for charities that play a key role in their backyard.”

The six charities receiving a donation from the HMMS are focused on ensuring the health of rural communities including supporting sick children and their families that need to come to Perth for treatment, and supporting individuals and families experiencing financial hardship.

Details of the six charities receiving funding are below:

- Kids Cancer Support Group - \$25,000

KCSG support families whilst staying at Ward 1A at Perth Children's Hospital. Funds will be used to specifically support families from grain growing communities both financially and through programs such as the weekly toy delivery.

- St John Ambulance - \$23,000

Funds to go towards the inclusion of Automated External Defibrillators in grain growing regions

- Camp Kulin - \$25,000

The donation will go to help bring over 70 children from crop growing regions into Camp Kulin for the school holiday camp programs.

- RedKite - \$25,000

RedKite provides support to children and young people aged up to 24 years with cancer, and the family and support network who care for them. This donation will help five families with support for 12 months.

- Ronald McDonald House - \$25,000

The donation will go towards The Work of Heart program – a curriculum aligned session that supports sick children and their siblings living in the Ronald McDonald House with their homework and education.

- Country Women's Association WA - \$25,000

The funds will go towards the Sir James Mitchell Education and Welfare Fund Drought Relief, which supports individuals and families experiencing financial hardship, in particular with education.

CIVIC LEGAL SUPPORTS CAMP KULIN

Teens from across Western Australia, including those affected by trauma and torture situations, will receive a huge boost thanks to an announcement from Civic Legal that will see them fund the Camp Kulin Civic Legal Teen Leadership Camp in October 2018.

Children from 185 towns across WA currently attend Camp Kulin's Kids Camps for kids aged 8-12, with some families travelling in excess of 25 hours each way. While at camp, campers learn essential life skills such as leadership, respect, trust, confidence, self esteem, perseverance, anger management, communication and emotional regulation. The program has been recognised at State, National and International level for its short and long term results.

The Civic Legal Teen Leadership Camp will allow previous campers who have attended the kids camps the chance to keep attending the program once they are 13-15 years old. Campers who show leadership potential will be invited to attend, with the end goal of them becoming volunteers on the program themselves once they turn 16. They will further develop life skills, with a special focus on leadership, communication and perseverance.

"We are proud to continue our support of Camp Kulin and regional WA communities," Civic Legal Managing Principal Anthony Quahe said. "This camp will give the teens in those communities a valuable opportunity to further develop their leadership skills."

Many of the campers have been affected by trauma situations such as domestic violence, sexual assault, suicide bereavement or refugees who have experienced torture situations in countries overseas who have now settled in Australia. This program will provide a unique opportunity for them to receive individual skills training that will help them move forward from what they have experienced.

"We are very grateful for the ongoing support of Camp Kulin from Civic Legal," Camp Kulin Manager Tanya Dupagne said. "As a program that receives no ongoing State or Federal Government Funding, we rely on donations to help us change the lives of families across Western Australia, and that is exactly what the teen leadership camp will do."

A stunning DRB Nats excursion to Kulin

Kulin, in the Eastern Wheatbelt, approximately 280 km from Perth, was home to twenty-four eager DRB Naturalists and visitors over the June long weekend. The rich flora and fauna in the region had us entranced.

We started on Friday with bird walks and were immediately rewarded by seeing Regent Parrots, (*Polytelis anthopeplus*) close to Camp Kulin, where we stayed. This was only the start though, as we saw fifty-seven bird species in total, surely a DRB record? Others included Elegant parrots, (*Neophema elegans*), several different honeyeaters including the Spiny cheeked (*Acanthagenys rufogularis*), Tawny crowned (*Gliciphila melanops*), White cheeked (*Phylidonyris niger*), and White eared (*Nesoptilotis leucotis*).

Also, in the midst of a desolate landscape affected by both drought and fire at Paperbark Swamp, was this brilliant red-capped robin, (*Petroica goodenovii*), and on the Monday we added a Chestnut rumped thornbill (*Acanthiza uropygialis*) to the list. We saw plenty of water birds at the Corrigin dam, such as the Pink eared duck (*Malacorhynchus membranaceus*), and the Chestnut teal (*Anas castanea*). We were told there'd been no other recorded sightings of this, at the dam, for over 20 years.

We visited many places including the Macrocarpa Trail with its thousands of *Eucalyptus Macrcarpa* which although not in flower were still stunning. They were surrounded by *Banksia sphaerocarpa* in full flower. We also visited the Buckley's Breakaway and found the lunar-like landscape a photographer's delight. At the base were piles of quartz and bright white kaolinite, and at the top a deep orange cap rock of laterite.

Led by a local naturalist, Robin Campbell, we visited the Rifle Range in Corrigin and Jilakin Rock too where we saw a wild apricot tree (*Pittosporum phillyraeoides*) complete with inedible fruits. Robin was incredibly knowledgeable on the local flora and fauna for which we were immensely thankful.

Flowering plants of special interest included a *Hakea meisneriana*, and *Hakea incrassata* with large fruits on it, and four flowering wattles: *Acacia cowaniana*, *Acacia tenoptera*, *Acacia neorigida* and *Acacia erinacea*. In the main street were two abundantly flowering *Hakea laurinas* and a *Hakea scoparia*.

Late on Sunday we took time to admire a forest of gimlets (*Eucalyptus salubris*) and learnt how the fluted trunk made it strong enough for the wood to be used as building material. The deep brown of the trunks glowed in the setting sun.

And we saw so much more – frogs, fresh fungi including the Woody Layered Bracket Fungus (*Fomitiporia robusta*), lichen, butterflies, spiders, even a native bee - but with a limit of 500 words it's hard to do it justice. Needless to say, many of us will return.

Our thanks go to all the farmers who took time out especially to speak to us: you added a depth and richness to our visit for which we are truly grateful: Harold Proud, Michael Lucchesi, Allen Smoker and Barry West, thank you. It was a superb weekend, thank you to everyone involved. Kulin rocks!

Early arrivals were off on bird walks before unpacking and were delighted to find 21 different birds within 500m of the camp. Others walked around Kulin and popped into IGA. People acknowledged us and “complete strangers chatted to us”.

The words I often heard were fantastic, incredible, unbelievable, stunning, fabulous, magnificent, intricate, awe-inspiring, I've never seen this and OMG look at that!

Every town benefited as we refuelled, bought take-away, stayed in B&B, motel, Caravan Park and used Camp Kulin as a base. I went to their Kalamunda meeting [50] and many are coming back in small groups.

On the itinerary I had invited local people to meet the group at various places. Being from the metro they were expecting “addresses” from the farmers, so they were greatly impressed that you took the time out from seeding and related such interesting anecdotes and future plans. Be assured of future visits as many are returning for the spring colours. At Corrigin Rifle Range, an ever changing landscape as you move up the rise, half disappeared seeking birds, spiders and rocks. Another group checked every shrub, track and hollow log on the way up with Linda, Sonia and me.

If you are interested in discovering and learning about a particular place or birds or frogs or orchids or whatever; get a small group together and call me. Please email or ring me if you have ideas and/or specialist knowledge that we can use to promote our Wheatbelt towns. There is no financial reward for me; I just thrive on learning about and sharing the nature around us, creating a little understanding between the city and us and bringing people here. There are possibilities for commercial tourism here.
