CEO CORNER

Welcome back to another CEO corner for 2021 and after a slowish start harvest seems to be ramping up. Hopefully some good yields and not too much hail and frost damage around the place.

Last week our KULIN 25 SCP – COMMUNITY CAPTURE SURVEY closed after a 2 week submission period. Thank you to all those that contributed with over 121 responses received back from the community. Staff and Council will now work through a process comparing the community responses to that of Council in order to determine a finalised KULIN 25 SCP list.

From a Council perspective this week we have Council Meeting as well as WALGA's Central Country Zone Meeting in Wandering. Next week we have Regional Road Group. This is my first CEO Corner since the last Council Meeting and I would like to congratulate Cr Grant Robins on being elected Shire President for the next two years, as well as Cr Brad Smoker for being elected Deputy President.

I would also like to acknowledge and thank Cr Barry West for his efforts as Shire President for the past six years. Barry is very passionate about the Kulin community, whilst also being an advocate for succession at Council where he has openly conveyed that this was the right time to step aside and bring new people into Council's leadership in a very magnanimous manner. No doubt Barry will continue to passionately advocate for Council with rail being at the top of his advocacy list.

You may be aware of the recent announcement by WA State Government local regarding government reform and changes in legislation. Council will work through these relevant changes and adapt as necessary, providing feedback to the community as relevant, as well as a response to the WA State Government during the consultation period. If any members of the community have any specific queries on the proposed reform, please contact me directly for clarification or inclusion in our response to the Government.

The summer months is a busy period for our Works Crew with optimum weather conditions for road reconstruction and sealing. Unfortunately, this generally coincides with harvest and more trucks on the road, making it frustrating for all parties. However in order to get through our scheduled works program we need to continue on with these major projects during this busy period. Key projects on the go at

the moment are Dudinin-Jitarning Road, Jilakin Street intersection as well as the Muller Road intersection. All three of these roads are schedule to be sealed during the same week in December as this is the most efficient way for the sealing contractor to deliver their component of the works, rather than having to mobilise multiple times. Good luck to Judd and his crew over this busy period.

The Skate Park, Pump Track and Hangout Zone of the All Ages Precinct seem to be getting regular use since its opening in late October. The obstacle Zone is scheduled for installation in February 2022 which will nicely complete this stage of the area.

Summer sports are in full swing. Well down to Kulin Tennis Club on make the EDTA Grand Final last weekend. Unfortunately, they went down by 2 sets, in an intense contest which saw the result go right down to the last match of the day. I believe this was their first grand final in many years so well done to the team on their efforts this season.


Council would like to thank the community for their contribution to the process as part of both the Workshop and Survey process.

Shire of Kulin invites you to nominate an outstanding individual or group for one of this year's Community Citizen of the Year Awards to be presented on Australia Day 26 January. The awards foster, recognise and celebrate significant contributions to community life and active citizenship in all local government areas of Western Australia.



Guidelines and criteria

Each year three local citizens and one local community group in each local government area will be eligible for the Community Citizen of the Year Awards. The recipients will be selected from people and groups who have made a noteworthy contribution during the current year or given outstanding service to the local community over a number of years through active involvement.

Auspire - Australia Day Council WA provides four awards each year for presentation in each local government area. These prestigious awards are provided to your local government for presentation during Australia Day celebrations.

Nomination Process

Shire of Kulin invites nominations for the awards from community groups and private citizens. At the council's discretion, a committee will be appointed to encourage and promote nominations. The committee or your local council may also make nominations based on local knowledge and experience.

Nominations close on 10th December and can be received in hard copy or the nomination form online.

Selection Criteria

The winners will have been judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community.
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has brought about positive change and added value to community life.
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.

Eligibility criteria

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the Shire of Kulin.
- Awards may be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- Groups of people or couples will not normally be eligible except when meeting the criteria for a community group.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition of their particularly outstanding community contribution or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Nominations must be apolitical in their nature and should not in any way bring the awards program or local government area into disrepute.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

SHIRE OF KULIN

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Kulin

PURSUANT TO THE POWERS contained in Section 33, you are hereby required on or before 31 October 2021 and thereafter up to and including 15 March 2022 to have a 3 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material on all rural and townsite rural land owned or occupied by you:

- 1. Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land; and
- 2. In such other positions as is necessary to divide land into areas not exceeding 500 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak; and
- 3. Immediately surrounding any part of land used for crop; and
- 4. Parallel to and within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps on the land; and
- 5. Immediately surrounding receptacles used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not; the firebreak required to comply with this item shall be no less than 5 metres wide; and
- Immediately inside land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared for clearing by burning (whether you
 intend to burn the bush or not); the firebreak required shall be no less than 7 metres wide. Where the land is
 prepared for clearing by burning after 19 September 2021 you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

Townsites - area less than 1 hectare

All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm, and;

It is recommended that at least a 2m wide area immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs."

(Note: any land of one hectare or above - rural provisions apply.)

Firebreak Variation

If it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impractical to clear firebreaks to comply with this notice due to soil erosion, the spread of salinity or for any other reason, a request for a variation may be made to the Council no later than the 1 September of each year. Such a request must be in writing and include a detailed plan showing the proposed location of firebreaks or of the alterative fire protection methods to be used.

Harvesting Operations - Mobile Fire Fighting Units

An operational mobile engine powered firefighting pump unit with no less than 500 litres of water shall be in attendance during grain harvesting operations. If the unit is trailer mounted the trailer must be attached to a vehicle at all times during harvesting operations and the unit must be in the paddock, or adjoining paddock, where the harvesting operation is being carried out.

Automatic Harvesting Bans

A Harvest Ban will apply automatically on Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

Other Matters

If for hardship reasons, it is considered by the owner or occupier to be impossible to clear firebreaks required by this Notice, you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to seek alternative options. Claimants of hardship, should do so with sufficient time to allow alternatives to be enacted. Claims of hardship does not automatically exempt owners and occupiers from the requirements of this Notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this Notice is a fine not exceeding \$5000. A person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of the Shire or a contractor performing the work directed in this Notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the due date. If the requirements of this Notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.


Bush Fire Brigade Protective Oothing

A duty of care exists for a Fire Control Officer to ensure that persons attending an incident has appropriate PPE (personal protective equipment), the same responsibility rests with those attending so please ensure you wear the required clothing, otherwise insurance issues may arise.

We have some Protective clothing on hand at the Shire office already, call in and see us now to collect your set now or alternatively you can email eso@kulin.wa.gov.au or call Fiona Jasper 9880 1204 to place an order (if we don't have your size available). You must be a *registered member of a bushfire brigade* within the Shire of Kulin, and have not placed an order in the past 5 years.



Do you need to show proof of your COVID-19 Vaccination?

Your COVID-19 digital certificate and immunisation history statement both show proof of your COVID-19 vaccination status in Australia.

The quickest and easiest way for you to get proof of your COVID-19 vaccination is by downloading the Express Plus Medicare app. All you need to do is make sure you have a myGov account set up with Medicare linked.

The Express Plus Medicare app will allow access to:

- your or your child under 14 COVID-19 digital certificate
- your or your child under 14 immunisation history statement
- add your COVID-19 digital certificate to your state check in app
 - Victoria and New South Wales are live
 - South Australia to launch November 2021
 - More states to be announced
- and, save your International COVID-19 Vaccination Certificate offline

If you are unable to obtain your proof of COVID-19 vaccination online, you can ask your vaccination provider to send you a copy or you can ring the Australian Immunisation Register on 1800 653 809.



COVID-19 VACCINATION PROOF

Your immunisation history statement and COVID-19 digital certificate both show proof of your COVID-19 vaccination status.

After you get vaccinated, your vaccination provider adds your details on the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR). They have 10 days to do this, but most get your details to us sooner.

- 2. Select Immunisation history from Services.
- Select your name, and then select View immunisation history statement (PDF) or View COVID-19 digital certificate (PDF).

PROOF OF YOUR COVID-19 VACCINATION

IF YOU DON'T HAVE A MEDICARE ONLINE ACCOUNT

You need to link Medicare to your myGov account to set up your Medicare online account.

Sign in to, or create, your myGov account at my.gov.au

You can then link Medicare using either:

- your Medicare card number and information from your Medicare history
- a linking code issued by Medicare.

For help linking Medicare to myGov, go to servicesaustralia.gov.au/medicareguides

You can also get your vaccination proof through My Health Record. You can link My Health Record to myGov.

KEEP YOUR CONTACT DETAILS UP TO DATE WITH MEDICARE

You can view and update your details using your Medicare online account or the Express Plus Medicare mobile app.

IF YOU'RE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR MEDICARE OR DVA

You can get proof of your COVID-19 vaccinations using the Individual Healthcare Identifiers service through myGov.






