GOOD THINGS TO COME FOR THE KULIN COMMUNITY HUB LET'S MEET CONNIE AND FRANCESCO



Anyone who has recently been to the Kulin Community Hub would have met Connie and Francesco Lo Drago, the new managers of the place where we all like to socialise to have a good meal and drink.

Today, I am interviewing Francesco and Connie. I am interested in their life story and how they found their way to Kulin. Francesco is a warm-hearted Italian who grew up on a farm in Puglia, South Italy. In 1973 he moved to Torino, located in the North of the boot-shaped country which is known for their culinary expertise in pizza and pasta. In Torino, close to the French border he spent most of his life operating and fixing machines to produce fresh pasta. At the age of 40 Francesco was considering a move to Australia. To experience life Down Under he spent a holiday with his relatives in Melbourne. The warm climate, the mateship and the lifestyle immediately attracted him and not long after he found himself operating pasta machines again – this time in Melbourne. Being very qualified and having many years of experience in his profession in Italy he recalls his employer liked him straight away.

In 1998 Francesco and his former wife moved to Perth, where he continued to work operating pasta machines for another 2 ¹/₂ years. Attracted by the natural wonders, the beauty of the beaches and the warmer climate, the passionate swimmer and his former wife both made up their minds that Western Australia is the place to be. He recalls very fond memories of standing on top of King's Park looking across Perth's city lights. "I fell in love with the bridge and the city lights. It looked a bit like little Los Angeles" Francesco notes with a smile on his face. After his holiday he continued working in Melbourne. When his wife sadly passed away in 2011 he decided to sell his house in Melbourne and move to Perth.

Connie was also born in Italy. She moved to Australia at the age of four and lived most of her life on a farm West of Mount Walker. She married her former partner at the age of 17, moved to Narembeen for 16 years, had 3 kids and then moved to Perth in 1988. She reflects parts of her life and continues, "My kids grew up over the years and

my husband passed away in 2009 on the ANZAC Day weekend. Four years later she fell in love with Francesco and they have been very happily married for 7 years. The couple lived in Perth and made a living driving an Uber. Then Covid-19 hit and the couple decided to move back to the country. Connie worked in Hyden in a café and as a general allrounder on a wildlife farm close to Wave Rock together with Francesco.

One day, Connie and Francesco's car needed a wheel alignment. As fate willed, the local mechanic's machine was out of order so they were sent to Tin Horse Automotive in Kulin. David Mead fixed their car. While chatting to the couple Dave pricked up his ears when he heard that Francesco loves making fresh pasta. He pointed out that "He would be great to work at the Hotel", the Italian remembers. Things got rolling and Francesco and Connie became the new managers of the Kulin Community Hub. Connie and Francesco have got plans to change a few things about the Kulin Community Hub.

They explained that they have never run a pub before and that they only had one week to take over the business to learn how to run it – which understandably is a challenge. They are trying hard to find out what the Kulin community values and welcome any feedback to accommodate the communities needs.

They look forward to introducing their own pasta, gnocchi, sauces and pizza in a traditional Italian way in future. They just need a little bit of time to set things up. They are currently researching new suppliers to purchase traditional mozzarella cheese and with some kitchen upgrades they will be able to run Francesco's pasta machine and they will roll some tasty gnocchi.

Pizza nights on Fridays will stay and there are plans to introduce an "All You Can Eat Buffet" twice a month. Connie and Francesco look forward to meet more locals as they love living in our town and value the bonding, warm and welcoming spirit of the Kulin community.

It sounds as if there is plenty of good things to come.

GENERAL RULES

[.] The spirit of friendly competition should apply throughout each of the races. Any non-sportsmanlike conduct constitutes grounds for immediate disqualification of you or your team

- · Competitors must obey all directions and instructions by officials
- [.] If you withdraw from the race, please notify the timing team at the finish line
- · It is the responsibility of each competitor to be familiar with the race course
- A top must be worn during the cycle leg and run leg of the event

• Competitors are individually responsible for following all traffic laws and road rules, and are solely responsible for the consequences of any infringements

• A race briefing will be held 10-15 minutes before the first race. <u>All competitors must be present for this</u> briefing regardless of their race time.

Swim

- No fins, paddles, snorkels, wetsuits or floatation devices are to be used. Regular swimming goggles are permitted.
- Competitors who warm up must be behind the start line at least two minutes before race start
- Competitors must start in the pool no diving. Any stroke is permitted during the swim leg
- The pool will be patrolled by qualified lifesavers

Cycle

- All competitors will be required to wear an AUSTRALIAN STANDARDS APPROVED HELMET throughout the bike course
- The helmet straps must be secured prior to moving the bike from the rack. At the completion of the cycle the bike must be racked prior to unfastening the helmet
- No drafting on the Cycle leg is permitted 5 metres between bikes unless passing
- Competitors must obey the instructions of police, course marshals and other volunteers
- MP3 Players, iPod's, Walkman's etc. are permitted whilst competing.

Run

- No form of locomotion other than running or walking is allowed no exceptions!
- All run legs will be on a bitumen or gravel surface
- No individual support vehicles or escort runners are allowed
- Runners are expected to follow the directions of all course marshals and race officials
- MP3 Players, iPod's, Walkman's etc. <u>are</u> permitted whilst competing.

Transition Area

- Once the race starts, only competitors who are racing can enter the transition area. This will
 apply until the last cyclist of the race has returned his/her bike to the area No exceptions!
- Make a mental note of your bike placement in the transition area so you can easily find your correct position. No flags, signs or tape can be used to identify a competitor's bike rack as it provides an unfair advantage over other competitors
- Relay change over for the Teams will take place at the Bike Racks
- Each competitor is ultimately responsible for his or her own gear

SAFETY & MEDICAL RECOMMENDATIONS

- Drink plenty of fluid before and during the event
- Ensure you have eaten something 1-2 hours before the event
- Bicycles must be in safe mechanical condition for the race and should be checked prior to the race

We would like to congratulate Sarah Reader for receiving a staff recognition award. Well deserved Sarah.







Bowel Cancer

Bowel cancer is the growth of abnormal cells in the large bowel (the colon or rectum). Bowel cancer is one of the top cancers affecting men and women in Western Australia. In 2017, 1307 people were diagnosed with bowel cancer and 390 died from bowel cancer. The chances of getting bowel cancer by the time you are aged 85 (lifetime risk) is 1 in 13. **Risk factors**

The exact cause of bowel cancer is not known however, there are a number of factors that are known to increase the risk of developing bowel cancer. Your risk is increased if you:

- smoke
- use alcohol
- have a poor diet, including inadequate fibre or too much red and processed meat
- don't exercise
- are above a healthy weight

Other risk facts that you cannot control but that increase your risk:

- age most people with bowel cancer are over 50, and the risk increases with age
- having a previous history of bowel cancer or polyps
- a strong family history of bowel cancer
- chronic inflammatory bowel disease (ulcerative colitis and Crohn's disease)
- a rare inherited genetic disorder, such as Familial Adenomatous Polyposis (FAP) and Lynch syndrome

Symptoms

Symptoms of bowel cancer may include one or more of the following:

- Bleeding from your back passage (anus) or any sign of blood after a poo/bowel motion (this could be red to black)
- A change in bowel habit, for example, straining to go to the toilet (constipation) and/or looser bowel motions (diarrhoea)
- Abdominal pain and bloating
- Loss of weight for no obvious reason
- Loss of appetite
- Symptoms of anaemia, including unexplained tiredness, weakness or breathlessness

If any of these symptoms are unusual for you, and they persist for more than 4 weeks, it's important to see your doctor right away.

The National Bowel Cancer Screening Program

invites eligible people starting at age 50 and continuing to age 74 (without symptoms) to screen for bowel cancer using a free, simple test at home. Do the home test when you receive it in the mail – it could save your life!

Water supply in a bushfire

This information could save your life

While leaving high-risk bushfires is the safest option, if you plan to stay and defend your home, you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. This typically requires water tanks of at least 20,000 litres, pump and generator.

This is required as mains water supply and pressure cannot be guaranteed during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.

Use the Department of Fire and Emergency Services resources to develop your personal bushfire survival plan: mybushfireplan. wa.gov.au. You can also download the My Bushfire Plan app via the App Store or Google Play to access your bushfire plan anytime even without an internet connection.

To support bushfire plans, if you have groundwater bore access to surface water, you can take and store emergency water without it counting against your annual entitlement. For more information on this, and for the location of emergency bushfire water supplies in dryland agricultural areas, visit the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation website: **water.wa.gov.au/fireplanning**.

Drinking water

We recommend you keep a supply of drinking water on hand throughout summer in case your water supply is interrupted.


