With the weather playing havoc with harvest, it is great to see headers are going again. The CKC community crop harvest was a huge effort by volunteers to get the canola crop off and delivered. Another fantastic display of volunteers working together to raise funds that will directly benefit the community.

In mid-October Main Roads representatives came to Kulin to meet with staff and councillors. The focus of the meeting was to discuss the conditions of the Williams-Kondinin Road (between Kulin and Kondinin) and Johnston Street and to ascertain their commitment to repairing these roads. Unfortunately, no firm commitment was made. We urge the community to continue to report issues and poor road conditions direct to Main Roads on 138 138.

Shire of Kulin is undertaking a review of its Councillor numbers and feedback received through the consultation process will assist the transition to the new requirements. machine on a public road and that you know the RAV rating of the roads you are using for harvest.

The Minister for Local Government has announced a package of reforms to the *Local Government Act*. As part of the reforms to strengthen democracy and increase community engagement, the Minister proposes to review Councillor numbers based on population.

The Shire of Kulin is undertaking a review of its Councillor representation. As part of reforms, local governments with populations of less than 5,000 are required to reduce the number of elected members to 5, 6 or 7.

This assessment will take into account the views of the community and outline any other matters that may be considered.

A Discussion Paper will be available from Friday 11<sup>th</sup> November 2022 outlining the current situation and alternative structures.

## Building Maintenance Officer

Applications are invited for the position of Building Maintenance Officer with the Shire of Kulin.

# COMMUNITY NOTICES

## PREVENTION IS BETTER THAN CURE

We need to prevent destructive fires because the cure is horrible in cleaning up and replacing the disastrous devastation with homes, workplaces, farms, towns burnt and sometimes people dead or injured. Loss of topsoil and dust storms are a risk too. Every year there are a lot of fires in the Wheatbelt. Now that we have changed our farming methods and the way that we deal with fires in the bush we need a better way of stopping them particularly on days when the wind is so strong, usually from a northerly or westerly direction, that it is impossible to see where the front of the fire is, and they can travel a long way in a short time.

When we came here about a hundred years ago to start farming lightning strikes and the Aborigines had prevented the build-up of litter by burning for various purposes. It was also Nature's way of rejuvenating. Then the way we farmed on a three-year rotation meant that a fire could not go very far before it came up against a ploughed paddock, this being done to conserve moisture and control weeds before herbicide spraying was introduced. The paddock was cropped the next year then grass in the third for the animals. Now with mainly direct seeding into uncultivated soil there is nothing to stop fires racing across the land on bad fire days.

What can we do about it? Using similar ways to those used earlier seems the only way to go until we find better ones and may not be all extra cost without some return. For instance, if the straw from the header is spread back and as soon as possible afterwards is mixed with any loose soil, such as in a sandy paddock, by shallow cultivation there could be moisture conservation as well as weed control. Things like that and a grass paddock eaten bare by sheep can help make up the at least a quarter of the farm that previous experience suggests is necessary with other farms doing the same thing.

In towns there is a lot more can be done to make them safe. In Kulin an elderly couple have shown what can be done by keeping the unused area opposite their house cleaned up and looking good in contrast to another area, over the road from nice houses, that is thick bush with wild oats growing out of it. The Shire has done some good work but a lot more is needed.

We spend a lot of money in providing the good services we have to fight fires including all the equipment that farmers have. What is needed is an organisation of fire prevention volunteers with a lot of the money spent that way to stop fires starting in the first place. Do you have any fire prevention ideas? Let's get into prevention and save a lot of trauma.

## MAIN ROADS HEAVY VEHICLE SERVICES NEW ROAD TRAIN SIGNAGE TRIAL

Main Roads Heavy Vehicle Services (HVS) wishes to advise the transport industry that new road train warning signs are being trialled. The trial signage provides motorists with a visual clue that indicates how long and what type of road train is in front of them.

This is a safety initiative designed to assist road users to make more informed decisions about how they share the road with, and overtake, road trains.

The existing 'Long Vehicle' and 'Road Train' warning signs are vague in terms of what type of vehicle is actually in front of drivers. The new signage being trialled will replace them and provide an illustrative example of the vehicle combination, and an indication of the length of the vehicle combination it is fitted to. The signs also align to the 'road train route' signs that are often seen on regional highways.

A suite of signs have been developed to cover the standard 27.5 metre, 36.5 metre, and 53.5

metre combinations, as well as Performance Based Standards (PBS) Scheme 30 metre, 32 metre and 42 metre combinations. A special sign is already in use for 60 metre PBS road trains.

Centurion Transport and Qube Bulk will participate in the trial by fitting the signs to some of their vehicles. Other operators are welcome to participate in the trial and require an approval letter from HVS. Operators can register their interest to participate in the trial by emailing [hvs@mainroads.wa.gov.au](mailto:hvs@mainroads.wa.gov.au). All operators will pay for their own signage.

Information about the trial will be posted to social media and our website. Feedback is welcome via our [survey](#) available on the trial page on [My Say Transport](#).

We're particularly interested in hearing from the general public to see if the signs are more informative and meaningful.

If the trial is successful, HVS

will also liaise with the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator to share the feedback received and encourage them to adopt the same signage.

It's important to note that interstate operators will not be disadvantaged or penalised. HVS will continue to recognise and accept 'Long Vehicle' and 'Road Train' warning signage requirements specified in other jurisdictions when RAVs travel across the border into Western Australia.





# SHOWERHEAD SWAP

## Water-saving offers available to Great Southern towns

Water Minister Dave Kelly has encouraged Great Southern residents to take advantage of free waterwise offers available as part of Water Corporation's 2022-23 Waterwise Towns Program.

The annual program was created to make it easier for regional Western Australians to use water more efficiently and save money on bills by making waterwise changes around the home.

Since 2013-14, the State-wide Waterwise Towns Program has saved an estimated 1.7 billion litres of precious water - equivalent to 756 Olympic-sized swimming pools.
