TOWN HAPPENINGS

Hopefully the weather continues to warm up and there are not too many more weather interruptions to harvest. Having said that, the hot weather also increases the chances of Fire and Harvest Bans. There are two types of Fire Bans which may be imposed.

Total Fire Ban – imposed by DFES (Department of Fire and Emergency Services)

A Total Fire Ban (TFB) is declared on days when fires are most likely to threaten lives and property. This is because of predicted extreme fire weather or when there are already widespread fires and firefighting resources are stretched.

On a Total Fire Ban day, it is illegal to light an open-air fire or conduct any activity that could start a fire. Further information on Total Fire Bans can be accessed at https://www.dfes.wa.gov.au/hazard-information/bushfire/total-fire-ban

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans – imposed by Shire of Kulin

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by the Shire of Kulin during the Restricted and Prohibited Burning period (1st November 2022 – 15th February 2023) and are put in place when local Bushfire Control Officers identify the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery as high bushfire risk activities. It is your responsibility to find out if a ban is in place and the Shire of Kulin will communicate Harvest Bans via SMS, Harvest Ban line – 9880 1511 and broadcast on ABC radio.

Fire Danger Ratings

In addition to the bans the new Fire Danger Ratings have been developed. Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a bushfire start. Please refer to the graphic on this page and for more information go to https://dfes.wa.gov.au/hazard-information/bushfire/prepare

Roads and Operational Works

Works are continuing on the Fence Rd south of Dudinin with the culvert installation completed this week. More bitumen is being ripped in preparation for fresh gravel to be carted which should start the week of the 28th November.

Dudinin Jitarning Rd will see a contractor here from the 23rd November to mix the base and then will be final trimmed for bitumen sealing starting on the 13th of December. We remind all road users to take care when travelling through these areas as speed restriction are in place to keep everyone safe.

New fencing has been installed at the All Ages Precinct (in line with our legal agreement with arc infrastructure) while the renovations have been completed on the oval.





Women 40 years and over with no symptoms are eligible for a FREE screening mammogram.

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and 1 in 7 women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect 70-90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should contact her doctor immediately.
