# SHIRE WORKS NOTES

Works on the Fence Road are continuing with Western Stabilisers in to cement stabilise the floodways prior to Bitutek completing the sealing of 5.5kms last week. We are continuing to prepare the remaining 5.5kms for wet mixing from Monday 27th February and sealing to be completed on 20th March.

Works have started on Muller Road to re-construct the corner at the intersection of Kay Road and delays are expected with a lane closure to allow works to be completed at various stages. This will also be sealed at the same time as Fence Road.

You will notice that there has been some action on footpaths around the school, this will continue to progress over time and will have asphalt laid in the coming months when contractors are in the area. There are also several pram/access ramps to be installed and that will also happen in due time as contractors are available.

Kulin-Holt Rock Road construction works have commenced at the intersection of Allen Rocks Road, with Key Civil completing the culvert installation in the coming days before the works crew move out there to complete the 3km section that should be set in early May. Works will continue heading

towards the west in preparation for more bitumen later this year.

Denaro Nominees have been busy working on enlarging the dam located on the corner of Allen Rocks Road and Kulin-Holt Rock Road as a Strategic Community Water Source that has been funded by the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation. There will be a tank and pump installed in the coming weeks for the community to access.

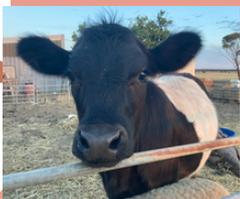

# COMMUNITY SUPERSTARS

---

## Welcome Sergeant Andy Dunn to the Kulin community as the latest member of the Kulin Police Force.

I had the pleasure of sitting down with Andy and getting some background on him, his family, and his career, hope you enjoy!

Sergeant Andy Dunn is Kulin's newest police sergeant, officially moving to Kulin on the 2nd of February, and starting in our force on the 6th of February.

Andy mentioned that his favourite thing about Kulin has to be how nice the people are, and in regards to the general close engagement of the community he remarked, "that stands out, believe it or not. Larger communities are less personable."

Andy has been on the job for about 37 years, and has done an array of operational positions. From being a general Officer, to a Traffic Officer, Detective, Officer In Charge at 4 stations, and now Sergeant. Andy was a Detective for 10 years, and recalled fondly of his achievements from his early years in the role.

Sergeant Dunn mentioned that in his line of work, highlights come in the little things, day to day, week to week, if the community is happy, then that's an achievement, and that's what he regards as the highlights of his career. In police work it's hard to ignore the fact that you see the worst in people, but it was during the most difficult of times, during the emergencies, and the ugly moments, that Andy affirms this is also when you see the best in people.

In his years of work, Sergeant Dunn has been involved in major fraud and murder cases, and in an abundance of long, complex, and drawn-out investigations. He commented that it's in moments like these when you become

completely invested in achieving the right outcome, and doing what is best for the community.

Andy grew up in Perth and spent his entire schooling years there too. After finishing school, he ended up completing an Advanced Diploma in Business, as well as a Diploma in Criminal Investigation. Andy has 5 brothers, all of which have served in the Police, Air Force, Navy, or Army, including one who has worked for both the Air Force and Police Force. Andy always wanted to be a member of the Police Force, ever since he was a child, and his dream became a reality, as he served 12 years working with City Police, then moving to regional WA, where he has done the rest of his years. His wife has stuck by his side the whole time, and when asked about his greatest accomplishments, his happy wife (and, therefore, happy life), his 3 kids all on the straight and narrow, and his detective work, were quick to be mentioned.

Sergeant Dunn commented that what made him happiest was when other people were happy, he enjoys meeting new people, travelling, and most importantly, going home without getting smacked by his boss. Don't we all! While Andy has made explorations to Singapore, Phuket, and the USA, his focus is our home country, Australia, with visits to Darwin, Gibb River Road, Cook Town, Tasmania, and many places in between. Andy has travelled all over, however, his plan is to stay in regional WA for as long as he continues working, as that's where he feels the most happy and in place. He says that it is his experiences that allow him

to bring a very even approach to policing, and reach community expectations.

I asked Andy the same 2 final questions I asked my last amazing interviewee- Gen.

1. What advice would you give your teenage self?

Andy's response was something pretty relevant to me, as I'm sure it will be to many other people. "In this country, you can be whatever you want to be, if you want it bad enough, work towards it, because you will achieve it."

2. How do you think you make the world a better place?

"Probably because I'm here to help and listen, not because it's my job, it's because I want to."

Of course, before I wrapped up the interview, I had to ask the big question, the one everyone wants to know. Has Sergeant Andy Dunn tasered anybody? He provided me a very diplomatic answer, "yes, once. However, the pen is mightier than the sword, and you can generally get around it."

I'd like to thank Sergeant Dunn for taking the time to talk to me, and taking time away from fighting the rampant criminals that line our pristine streets.

My name is Andy Dunn, and I hope to be a welcome and useful addition in your community.

About me...  the new Sherriff in town...

Well, they just call us all coppers in this country...and this copper started in Kulin January this year replacing Sergeant Dave BALL who served for around 4 years in the sub-district. Dave took up a new position in the city and I wish him all the best for the future.

As for me, I've served with WA Police for around 37 years now. Starting back in 1986 when mobile cordless talking devices were science fiction in movies like Star Wars and computers were only something NASA needed. Anyway, 37 years later I have lost some hair that is true probably while serving in various sections across Perth before heading to the country in 1999...and I have never looked back, although it made no difference to my hair.

Previously across Regional WA, I've served as the OIC at Kojonup, Denmark and Ongerup (when they had a cop shop) with a combined 13 years all up. I've also served at Albany, Carnarvon and Wagin relieving at other spots such as Narrogin and Katanning. My wife Sharon and 3 kids have been by my side the whole time and while the kids have now all flown the coop, the wife must love packing and

unpacking boxes because she's still with me and enjoying the Kulin life-style. (they already know her at the pub)

So, painting the picture, I've been around and know the Great Southern well. You'd be correct in assuming I like the place and having been around Kulin for about a month now, I'd put it out there and say it's a bit of a well-kept secret...lovely town and lovely people.

Thank you to all the warm welcomes so far and I look forward to working with individuals, groups and the agencies across the community who serve the community to keep it safe and ticking along.

I'd also just like to say thanks to Uncle Baz, who most of you will know as the 'other' copper in town, for his assistance in making my move inward smooth as possible. Thank Baz.

THE GOOD, THE BAD, THE UGLY

THE GOOD...first impressions fantastic. Great town.

THE BAD...well, we are the coppers of course. We have a job to do and a role to play in keeping this place safe. We don't always like what we have to do either but we are duty bound at the end of the day to enforce the laws across the state, and we will.

I don't believe there is a need to outline to anyone any law in detail because they are mostly just plain common sense, especially traffic laws, for example:

\* Don't speed you don't get an infringement,

\* Don't drive without a valid licence you won't get arrested,

\* Don't drink and drive and you may just save your own life or someone else's but ...

\* If you do DD and get caught, you WILL lose your licence, a lot of money in fines, possibly your job and the respect of many. There is no discretion in this regard and none will be given. The biggest message I have for anyone who thinks they may take the risk – DON'T.

THE UGLY – Crime

We live in a fortunate location, relatively crime free most of the time but some people just have no regard for the property or safety of others and they do live amongst us...or at least sweep in and out from other locations from time to time.

On that note, I will keep you informed of crime issues of relevance. I know the community likes to be kept informed and I will share with you what I can.

Town Fire – December 2022

The gentleman involved in burning down a shed in town and a bush fire near the school was arrested on the night, charged, and has been in custody ever since. His next court appearance is the 21st of February. I have no further info at this time however the charges proffered can carry long terms of imprisonment if convicted. It's in the hands of the Justice System now so watch this space for updates.

## Farm Stealing – December 2022

## Copper Stealing – Corrigin and Lake Grace

During the past weeks, offender/s have been targeting copper wire in areas around us. In some case ripping up already laid cable of high value. Again, please report any info to Police or contact Crime Stoppers.

However, there are some matters that may attract a payment for reliable information that leads to positive outcomes. You can discuss this with a call taker if you ever want to pass on information. ## FIREARMS BUY BACK SCHEME 2023

On 14 February 2023 the Minister for Police announced impending changes to the Firearms Regulations 1974. These changes will prohibit a number of firearms and ammunition, which could be licensed in WA. The changes will come into effect on 01 July 2023.

These changes mean that by 01 July 2023 existing Firearm Licence holders currently in possession of the affected firearms and ammunition must either:

1. Dispose of the firearms and ammunition by legitimate sale via a WA Firearms Dealer to a location outside of WA; or

2. Surrender the firearms and ammunition to a WA Police Station and provide the required supporting documentation to be eligible for a buyback payment.

All impacted Firearm Licence holders have been contacted by Licensing Enforcement Division advising them of their options. To surrender the firearm(s) and/or ammunition the Firearm Licence holder (owner) must attend a Police Station with the following: -

- The firearm(s) subject to the prohibition;

- Their firearms licence;

- Proof of purchase documentation such as an invoice or payment receipt (including purchase price) or a WA Firearms Dealer's Valuation dated on or after 14 February 2023; and

• Their banking details (to facilitate the buyback payment).

• BSB Number

• Acct Number

• Acct Name

We'll give you a receipt for everything and some time down the track you'll get a fat cheque in the mail.

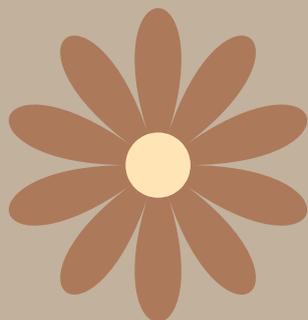

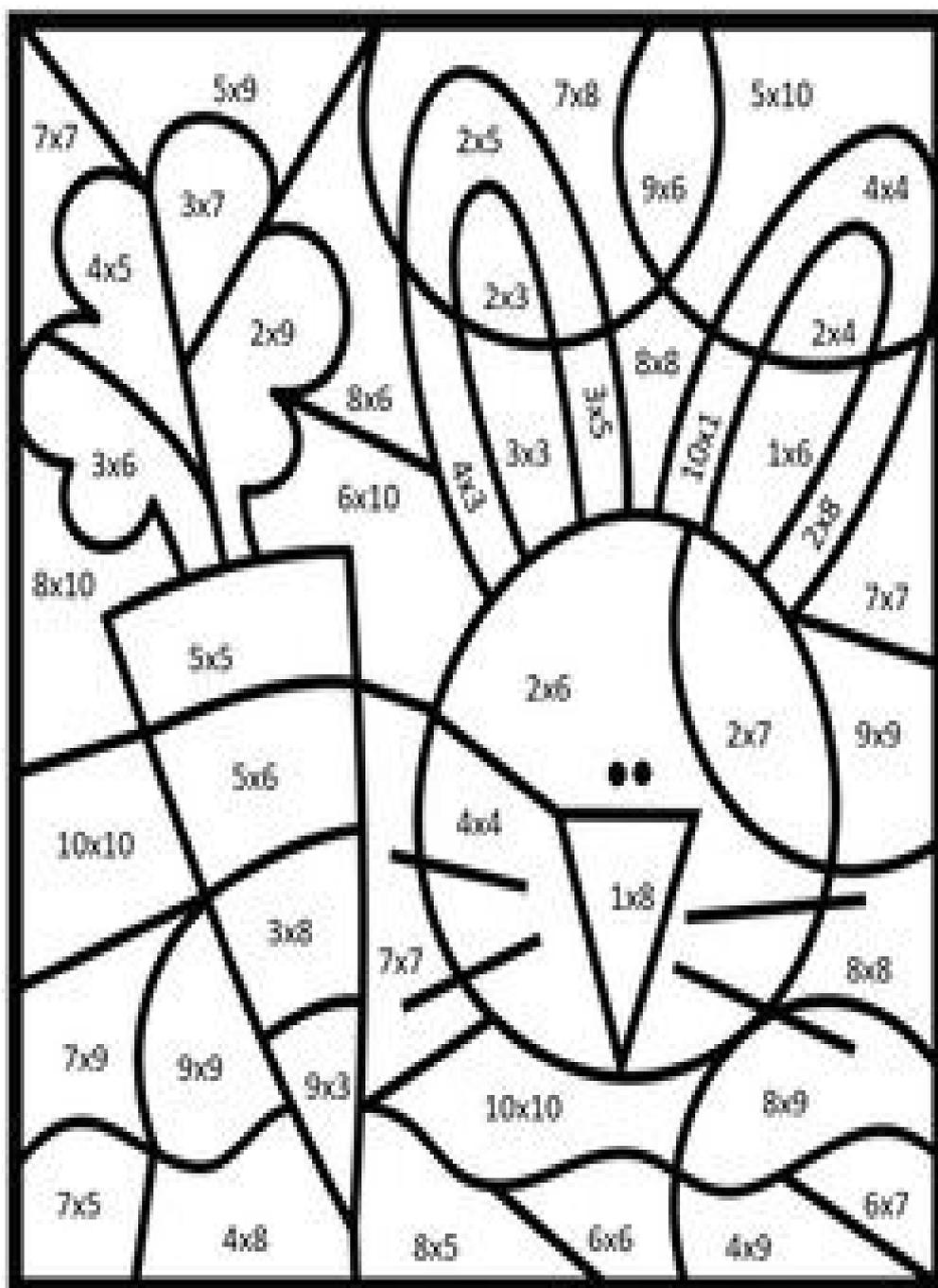

Lemon juice is mostly made of a variety of sugars, acids, and water. Normally, lemon juice is mostly clear, so when you dilute it even further in water, and paint that mixture onto some paper, you can't see it. However, heating up lemon juice causes some of its sugars to react with oxygen in the air (oxidation), which turns these sugars brown. Acids in the lemon juice can also react with fibers in the paper to make more sugars, which again turn brown in the heat. Your invisible ink might seem like magic, but really, it's all just chemistry.

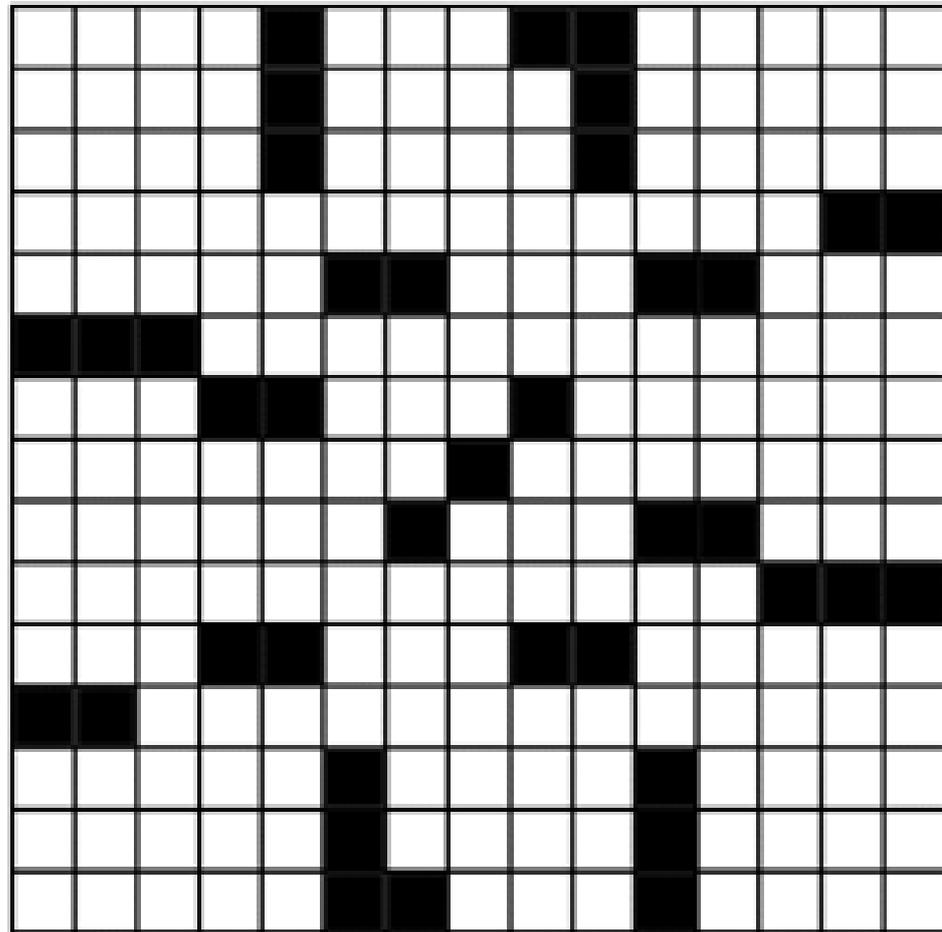

#### 24-HOUR ACCESS RELEASE OF LIABILITY & ASSUMPTION OF RISK

As a 24-hour secure-access fitness facility, FREEBAIRN RECREATION CLUB GYM FACILITIES (hereafter referred to as the "Gym"), has a few different policies and procedures. Please read the information carefully. If you have any questions, please ask.

#### Compliance with Rules

I understand and agree that the use of the Gym at the Freebairn Recreation Club is based on trust and is a privilege, which can be taken away for a violation of rules. As a gym user, I agree to abide by all membership rules and 24/7 gym access rules, which will be posted at the Gym, and may be amended from time to time at the sole discretion of the Freebairn Recreation Club Manager.

#### *The additional rules below apply to a 24/7 access of the gym:*

1. Sharing the code to the lock box is strictly prohibited and will result in immediate loss of membership.
2. Only active account members will be allowed entry.
3. Pre-approved members under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an approved member parent until they reach the age of 18.
4. Improper unauthorized use of the Gym may result in member suspension or cancellation.
5. The Gym reserves the right to suspend or cancel the rights, privileges, and membership of any member whose actions are detrimental to the use, safety, and enjoyment of the Gym.
6. Do not bring or otherwise allow a person that is not an approved member or guest of the Gym to access the facility without permission.
7. Do not bring or otherwise allow a person younger than 18 years of age to access the Gym without permission.
8. Athletes alone in the Gym should call 000 in case of an emergency.
9. All outside doors must remain closed during all non-staffed hours.
