CEO CORNER

The welcome rainfall over Easter and subsequent weeks sees seeding in full swing. No doubt there is plenty of spraying happening as the landscape has quickly turned green. Wishing everyone a successful seeding without too many breakdowns!

There is plenty happening throughout the Shire from works, CRC and at the FRC. The Aquatic Centre has closed for the season and we thank Jones for continuing to present a wonderful facility that brings people to Kulin and back to Kulin. A big thank you to this years slide attendants also. Without the commitment of these staff the slide would not be able to operate and the many hours of fun enjoyed by locals and visitors would not be had. We urge anyone in the community who is interested in working at the slide over the summer months to get in touch with Jones and keep an eye out for training opportunities that will be advertised by the Shire.

Construction will commence again on the Kulin Holt Rock Road. This is a two year project funded through the Remote Roads Pilot Program. The project objective is to seal approximately 25km of the Kulin Holt Rock Road.

The Shire of Kulin will be starting culvert works on behalf of Main Roads on Johnston Street outside the Kulin Hostel. Works will be undertaken from Wednesday 26th April to Friday 28th April (inclusive). Please be aware that a portion of the road will be closed and detours will be in place. We also remind the community to call Main Roads on 138 138 to report any road issues on Main Roads infrastructure.

Shire of Kulin have partnered with Snap, Send, Solve to assist the community to easily report local issues (including roads) direct to the Shire. I encourage everyone to download the app and start using this platform to report issues as you come across them as it provides us with the actual location and you can also upload photos of your concerns/ issues. This additional and timely information makes it much easier for staff to prioritise the reports and act in a timely manner. 
paint marks.

The ANZAC Victoria Cross Story



The ANZAC Victoria Cross Story Exhibition is coming to Kulin.

The exhibition pays honour and tribute to 101 Australians and 22 new Zealanders who showed valour, courage and great bravery in the face of the enemy whilst serving their countries.

It explains the history and origins of the award and tells the individual life stories of these men.

The exhibition has been developed by Tony Banner. Tony is a fifth generation soldier who has lived a life filled with passion for community service and all things military.

With family military service stretching back to the Anglo Indian Wars of the 1840's, Tony's passion has seen him volunteer in a number of military exhibition roles including tour guide at The National ANZAC Centre and Spirit Of The ANZAC.

It was in these roles that he noticed the need to educate, preserve and pass on how our destiny has been shaped by our military.

The ANZAC Victoria Cross Story exhibition will be at the Kulin Memorial Hall.

The exhibition is proudly brought to Kulin by the Kulin Masonic Lodge in conjunction with the Kulin RSL.

THE KULIN MASONIC LODGE

THE KULIN LODGE No. 160 WAC

The Corrigin Lodge No. 120 WAC was the sponsor for a lodge in the Kulin district, A meeting was held on July 10th 1933 with 16 members forming the Kulin Masonic Lodge No.160 WAC.

The first installation was held on November 29th 1933 with W. Bro. W.N. Trembath as the first Master - 84 Masters have since been installed.

The Kulin Lodge met on the stage of the Memorial Hall on the third Monday of the month. with the installation being on the third Saturday in October of each year.

The first initiation was held on January 15th 1934, being Mr. CW Parker, farmer of Kulin. From that date until today many brothers have joined, associated or been initiated into the Kulin

It soon became apparent that the Kulin Lodge would survive and a committee was formed to build their own lodge room. One acre of land was purchased at the corner of Price and Gordon Streets for this purpose. sought, and on October 25th 1937 the temple consecrated.

Extensions of a kitchen and toilets were added and opened by M. W. Bro. C. A. Knuckey on October 17th 1992. The Lodge sponsored Kondinin to become a lodge in 1945. Kondinin No.191 WAC was consecrated on June 16th, and six more units

Unfortunately due to numbers, Kondinin, like many other lodges these days, surrendered their warrant to Grand Lodge, on March 31 1993.

Foundation Stone of the Building

On March 6th, 1948 the Golden Donations and loans were Fleece Chapter No 39 was formed and consecrated in Kulin. . In 1975 the Kulin Aged Homes Committee were looking for land close to the shops in Kulin and the Lodge donated half of the Lot at Gordon St. to them for this purpose. \$1 was the transfer fee due to Government tax.

> Four units were built on block A, and in September 1997 the land at the back of the lodge was subdivided off



These homes are now called Kulinda Village.

On September 20th, 1993 the Lake Grace Lodge No. 141 amalgamated with the Kulin Lodge No.160 WAC.

Kulin has been lucky with its members, who, over the years have worked hard and still maintain the goals set down by our early members. Wood has become the decor of the lodge room with pieces donated neighbouring lodges who have closed down and handed in their charters. .

We, the brethren of the Kulin Lodge will help and support this lodge and the lodges in WA to the best of our ability and as we go into the twenty-first century we hope to survive and carry on the principles of Freemasonry in this the Kulin Lodge No 160 WAC from year to year and from generation to generation.







AROUND THE WORLD

WORLD ART DAY

April 15th is World Art Day, for this year's celebration, we'd like to show you some of the AMAZING Easter eggs created by the kids in our community!



















MAKING A PAPER POPPY

There are lots of ways to make a commemorative poppy. Painted cupcake papers can produce lovely flowers. This craft activity can teach children about red poppies as a symbol of remembrance.

What you will need.

- > Cupcake papers (4 per flower)
- > Water-based red and black paints
- > Paintbrush
- > Craft glue
- > Scissors
- > Drying rack (e.g. a cake cooling rack)

What to do

- 1. Lay down some newspaper to protect the surface from paint and glue.
- 2. Flatten and paint 3 red cupcake papers.
- 3. Flatten and paint black another cupcake peper.
- 4. Lay the papers on a rack to dry.
- 5. Once dry, play around with crumpling and twisting the red papers to create a textured look. You can cut a petal shape from the papers if you wish.
- 6. Gather the first paper in your hand and pinch the middle.
- 7. Glue each paper at the centre of your pinch so they stick together in the middle.
- 8. Cut a piece of the black paper and roll into a ball, then glue it into the centre of the flower.
- 9. Play around with the papers to create your prefect 'petals'.

Other ideas

- > Secure a safety pin to the pinched middle of your poppy and attach it to your shirt.
- > Wind a green pipe cleaner tightly around the pinched middle to create a stem.

MAKING A CARDBOARD POPPY

What you will need.

- > Thin cardboard
- > Red crepe paper
- > Green pipe cleaner
- > Black paper
- > Scissors
- > Pencil or fine pen
- > Glue

What to do

- 1. Use scissors to cut out a poppy shape on cardboard to make a template.
- 2. Place the petal template on red crepe paper and trace around it with a pencil or pen.
- 3. Cut out the poppy shape with scissors.
- 4. To make the stalk, take a pipe cleaner and bend the end over twice at 1cm lengths.
- 5. Push the straight end of the pipe cleaner through the middle of the petal shape; continue to push until the bent and sits in the middle of the poppy.
- 6. Cut a small circle out of the black paper and glue it onto the centre of the poppy; it will secure the pipe cleaner to the crepe paper.
- 7. Bend and shape the petals of the poppy.

LIVE SHEEP EXPORT CONSULTATION A FARCE, DAVIES

19th April 2023

Member for Central Wheatbelt Mia Davies has called on the Federal Government's Live Export taskforce to add further dates to their regional consultation tour, saying they needed to visit the eastern Wheatbelt.

Ms Davies said the consultation schedule was poorly advertised, announced with minimal notice, and needed to be extended to allow more growers, business owners and communities impacted by the disgraceful decision to have their voices heard.

"The dates were announced with very little notice, right in the middle of seeding, and ignored the eastern wheatbelt completely," Ms Davies said.

"I personally believe the forums are just a tick and flick exercise for the Labor Government to say they consulted, but if they're going to do it, they should do it properly and give the people they're ripping a business out from under the chance to have their say."

Mia Davies said the feeling of helplessness, anger and frustration was palpable across the sector.

"They have every right to be angry with a Government that has made an arbitrary decision to shut down a legitimate industry," she said.

"What the Prime Minister and his east-coast colleagues fail to realise is how devastating this will be for hard-working farmers, truckies, small business owners, port workers - everyone along the supply chain.

"Pandering to the inner-city green vote while shutting down an industry that has met every regulatory hurdle, animal welfare practices and more should send shivers down the spine of other primary industries.

"The Prime Minister knows there is minimal political downside for Labor in shutting down live sheep export, but all this will do is embolden activists to move onto the next legitimate industry."

Ms Davies said the Premier and Minister for Agriculture's silence on the issue was deafening.

"Hiding behind the fact that it is a Federal decision is an excuse, and a poor one at that," she said.

"The Premier has proven again and again that he has a voice and is prepared to use it on State, Federal, and international issues when it suits him politically.

"He and his Minister for Agriculture could be champions for this industry and the people in it, but they remain silent.

"The fact Minister Jarvis is letting a billion-dollar industry slide away under her watch is an absolute disgrace.

"I hope they're prepared to spend a significant amount of their surplus that has been stashed away to support those that will be impacted, because the financial and mental impacts of having a legitimate business ripped from under you will be significant."
