ROADWORKS UPDATE

I am pleased to report the Shire road construction team have recommenced works on the Kulin - Holt Rock Road. The road upgrade works of \$3,840,000 are funded jointly between the Department of Infrastructure (Federal Funds) \$3,072,000 and the Shire of Kulin \$768,000.

Over the next few weeks formation works, sub grade works and culvert works will be undertaken. Road users are encouraged to abide by road signage and traffic management in place to ensure we can maintain a safe work environment.

Gravel sheeting works commenced on Monday 1 May 2023 on the Varley North Road. The sheeting works will be a total of 5km's.

On the week commencing 8 May 2023 footpath construction works will commence in Kulin along McInnes, Price and Gordon Streets. Pram ramps will also be installed across various locations as part of accessibility improvements in the town.

2023 SHIRE OF KULIN ELECTION INFORMATION

The next Shire of Kulin Local Government Election will take place on the Saturday 21 October 2023. For the first time the election will be conducted via a postal vote, with the election be managed by the Western Australian Electoral Commission. The WA Government Local Government Election Reform package is currently being finalised through the Local Government Advisory Board. Under the reforms the Shire of Kulin will no longer have wards and the number of elected members (Shire Councillors) will reduce by two from nine down to seven. The reduction will occur over two election cycles (2023 & 2025), with one Office of Councillor to be abolished in October 2023 and a further one Office of Councillor to be abolished in October 2025. Current Shire Councillors whose term expires in 2023 are:

- Cr Barry West

With postal elections, all enrolled electors are sent a postal voting package approximately two weeks before polling day.

VOTING IN A LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTION

All eligible electors must enrol to vote. When you enrol to vote, you are enrolled for Commonwealth, State and local government elections. You can check your enrolment online.

All residents in a local government district who are enrolled on the State Electoral Roll are automatically enrolled on the corresponding local government roll.

TOWN PLANNING AND BUILDING REQUIREMENTS

If you are thinking building a new house, house extension/renovation or outbuilding e.g. shed property owners are encouraged to contact the Shire regarding planning and building requirements.

Shire staff will ensure property owners have the correct information up front through their planning phase with a view to make the approval process under the Town Planning Scheme and Building Code as seamless as possible

GARRY WALKER - KDHS PRINCIPAL

If you are under the age of 16, you may know Mr Walker as the scary Principal that sits in the office at Kulin District High School. Or if you're slightly above 16, you may know him as one of the Bowls Champions. Either way, for this edition of the Update, I decided that Garry- or Mr Walker, was the person I wanted to talk to.

A Principal is an integral part of not only a school, but also of a community. Within our town, we are so lucky to have not only a school that runs K-10, but to have a school with so much initiative, so many opportunities for students, and such a positive growth mindset. It only took me finishing school to realise what a blessing it is to be in school and to be able to have an education.

Garry has been in Kulin for just over three years now, starting as Principal at KDHS in April of 2020. Prior to his move to our little town, Garry was Principal of another slightly less little, slightly more far away town- Norseman. 3 years at Norseman District High School as Principal followed a 25-year stint in the Goldfields. This included 16 years as a primary teacher, 8 years as a Deputy, and 8 years and counting as a Principal. While his scenery may have changed from gold mines and Nullabor plains to crops and grains, his career path definitely hasn't. Garry has worked in teaching since 1991, and moved to WA to pursue teaching after becoming aware of the fact that at the time, Victoria was in a surplus of 7,000 teachers, and there were approximately zero jobs going.

Backtracking a couple years, Garry is able to safely say that he loved school, especially his primary years. It was this love of school and learning that led him to do what he does now, even though he states he had no idea what he wanted to do until finishing Year 12. I believe this comment is really refreshing, because I think choosing your life path is so difficult, but its obvious that once you make the decision that is right for you, it makes it easy to stick to it for many years to come. Upon finishing HSC (or ATAR

in WA terms), Garry's score was good enough to get into teaching college, which was convenient given it was the closest to him in rural Victoria.

After the completion of his degree in Victoria, the realisation of the teacher surplus hit- something unheard of in 2023 it seems. Garry couldn't get a job straight away, so a big move across the country it was, his family packed up and moved to the big western state. Garry mentioned that this move was probably one of the biggest challenges he and his immediate family had to face, starting fresh in a new state, leaving friends and extended family, trying to become connected to new communities, and moving his son and wife through these challenges too.

Despite the challenges of moving across the country, Mr Walker recognises his biggest accomplishments as just simply- being a teacher. He loves teaching, loved being in a classroom and with the kids, and becoming a Principal was just an added accomplishment. Becoming Principal meant he was responsible for the whole school of students, and while this provided a challenge, it is something he truly enjoys.

Throughout many years of guiding and helping shape other people's lives, Garry has learnt some life lessons of his own. These mainly include just focusing on always doing the right things and being kind, he made the comment that "if you do good, good things come back to you," which is a very positive message for not only little ears, but big ears too. Other than focusing on doing good things and being kind, Garry reflected on what made him feel most fulfilled- seeing smiles on the kids' faces. It is seeing these happy and thriving kids that makes him remember what the job is all about. Outside of work, he thinks it is just the simple things that can really fulfil you; good health, happy family, and good friends.

When I asked where Mr Walker was headed in the future, his answer was pretty short and sweet- retirement. He hopes that Kulin will have him

for another 3 or 4 years, then he can escape back to Victoria and renovate his house on Phillip Island. Along with renovating his Island home, he hopes to spend more time with his extended family still in Victoria, spend a bit of time travelling, and of course, a bit of bowls and golf. I mean, you can't expect the Bowls Champion to not keep up his skills.

Garry wants to thank the Kulin community for being so supportive of not only him, but of the school as a whole. As he is reaching the twilight of his career (his words not mine), he is happy that he loves life in Kulin, loves his work, and the bowls group. Further reflecting on the strength of the Kulin community, he wants to thank everyone involved in helping fundraise for the Canberra camp for this year, with approximately \$30,000 being raised to help the kids go, and hopes that everyone in the community is so proud of all the things they do for the kids and youth in town.

Mr Walker believes that the school is running really nicely, and thinks that there are so many kids at KDHS that really help drive a positive culture, which in turn, means that when new students come, there is a real peer driven initiative to ensure that they contribute to this culture as well. If kids are leading positively, then he knows that it makes his job a whole lot easier.

Perhaps slightly unrelated to teaching, Garry is really looking to seeing Collingwood take the win this year in AFL, mentioning his lack of fingernails after the run of close games. Garry and I bonded over our support of Collingwood, a support that is not common in WA. I chose to purposely omit the fact I am also a day one Freo supporter while talking to Garry to save myself the embarrassment after our last few miserable attempts at a win.

Of course, I had to ask Garry my last 2 questions I ask everyone:

1. Quote relevant to his line of work- what advice would you give your teenage self?

“Don’t be so hard on yourself. You have got to work for a long time, so think about what you enjoy and what lifestyle suits you before making decisions, and always dream big”

2. How do you make the world a better place?

“I hope I do. My focus in work is to see kids happy and smiling, and for them to want to be at school. I want them to be enjoying life and feeling safe. Life throws curveballs and horrible things,

but I try to make the most of it and find the good.”

While I asked Police Sergeant Andy if he had ever tased anyone, I had to ask Mr Walker an equally important and juicy question that I think we all know the answer to- Do teachers have favourites? His response was “short answer-no.” There have been kids that he has worked with that are definitely still in his memory, that he wonders how they are going. He says that you just have to hope you had an impact

on all students, but “when old students reach out and tell you how they’re going or tell you the impact you had, that might make them the favourite, knowing you made a connection and an impact.”

I’d like to thank Garry for having a chat with me, and it is lovely to hear from all the different people in our community that make so many positive contributor in so many different ways. We are very lucky to have a Principal like you Mr Walker!

DAVID CARR - LIGHTNING FAST

David Carr is a World Record Breaker, runs a 5-minute kilometre, and is regarded as one of Australia's most remarkable track athletes, but what makes him most special? He was the principal of our very own high school from 1983-1985. While there is not much information about his time at Kulin specifically, it is recognised that David was a secondary teacher and Principal for many years, before he retired and put his full focus into athletics.

At just 90 years of age, Carr broke an impressive 6 world records last year, including 1500m, 2,000m, 3,000m, 5,000m and 10,000m. With no intention to slow down, Carr has renewed his passport for 10 years, and is set to compete in Poland soon.

Carr's family is no stranger to athleticism either, with his wife Patricia winning gold and breaking world records at the World Masters Athletics championships in 1987 for long jump and triple jump. As well as

his daughter, Therese, competing in World Athletics Masters events and becoming the fourth woman in WA to complete a full marathon in 3 hours and 30 minutes. Carr's other daughter is also known for being a marathon champ, taking out a few wins in the 'City to Surf' event in Perth.

While Carr may not have grown up or stayed in Kulin for very long, it is always nice to know the amazing things that can come out of our little community.

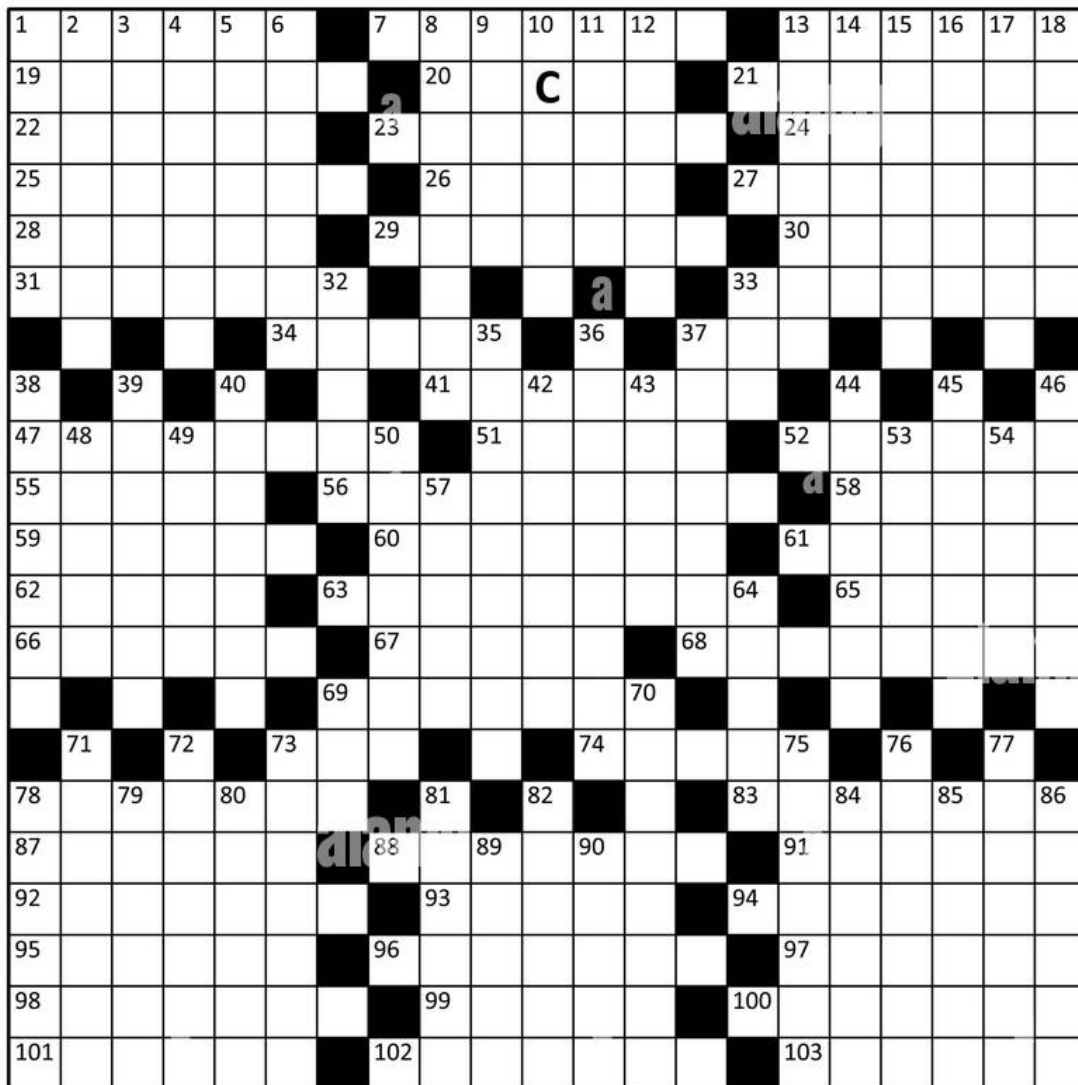

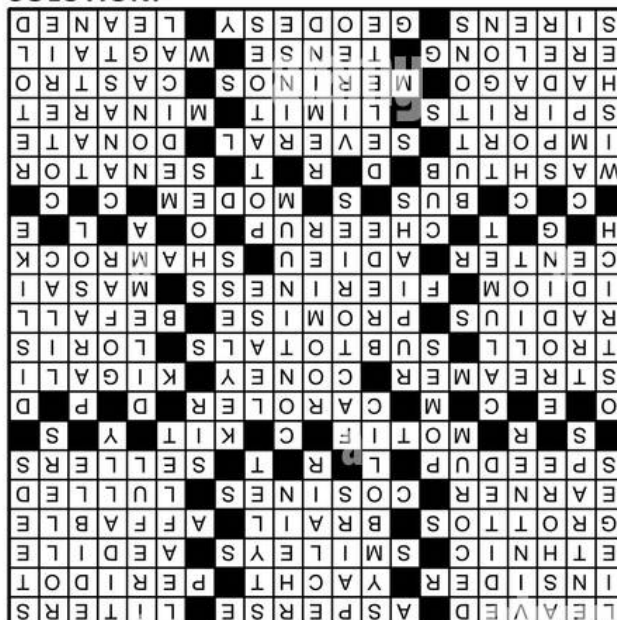

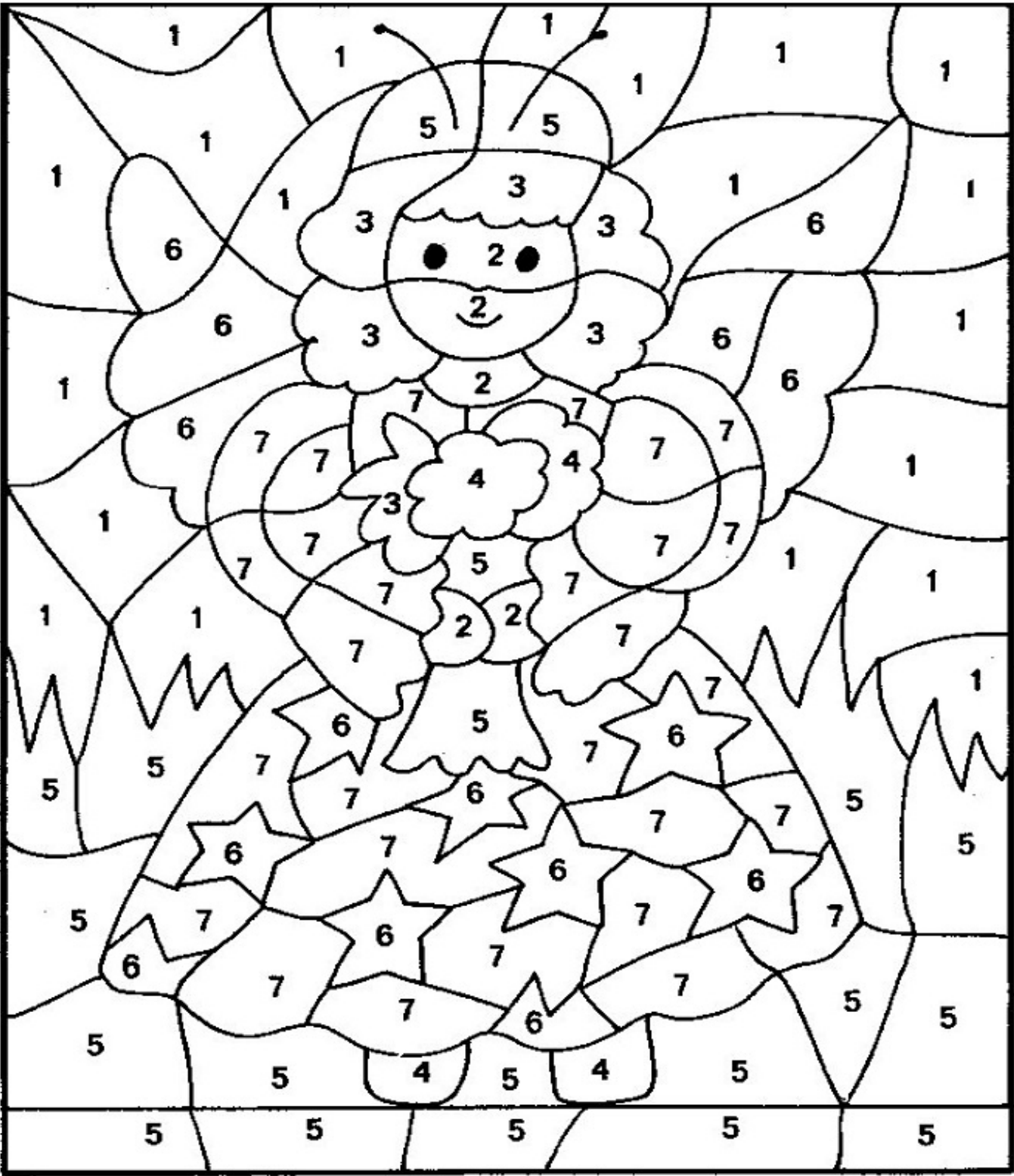

WORLD RED CROSS DAY AND RED CRESCENT DAY

WHAT IS WORLD RED CROSS AND RED CRESCENT DAY?

World Red Cross and Red Crescent Day 2023 is coming up. It's a special day that's celebrated annually, championing the main principles of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement.

The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement is a global humanitarian network of millions of members, staff and volunteers. Their aim is to be on the frontline where there is disaster, conflict, health or social problems and to help those in need.

2023 THEME

World Red Cross and Red Crescent Day is a time to celebrate the spirit of humanitarianism and recognise the individuals who make a difference in their communities.

This year, on the 8th of May, we want to highlight the universal, human, and diverse aspects of our movement by focussing on our volunteers and their involvement within our communities.

THE WORK OF THE RED CROSS

The provision of a blood collection agency is a main focus of The Red Cross. People are encouraged to support the Red Cross by donating blood. In the US almost 5 million people require a blood transfusion each year. The volume of blood donated to the Red Cross is enough for 21,000 blood transfusions a day.

The work of the Red Cross also includes first aid, emergency response, health and social care, preparing for disasters, refugee services and helping people find missing families. During times of war, the Red Cross helps to protect people in armed conflict.

HISTORY OF RED CROSS AND RED CRESCENT DAY

Prior to this observance and following the end of the First World War, there had been an initiative known as the 'Red Cross Truce'. Initially this was a three day truce in former Czechoslovakia which took place during Easter time.

At that time, there was a general consensus that people wanted peace following years of fighting.

The Red Cross Truce led the way for a global peace initiative to be introduced. After the Second World War, and following approval by the Red Cross Executive Committee, the proposal for a worldwide peace day was accepted.

The first Red Cross and Red Crescent Day was held in 1948 on the 8th of May. This date coincides with the birthday of Henry Dunant, the founder of the Red Cross. Each year, Red Cross and Red Crescent Day is supported by Red Cross organisations around the world.
