Owning a pet is great fun, but is something that requires a lot of time, love and responsibility.

Much of being a responsible pet owner is understanding your pet's needs and being aware of community expectations about responsible pet management.

As an animal owner, it is your responsibility to provide for your animal's general welfare, as a matter of priority.

Dog owners, or anyone contemplating becoming a dog owner, should do a few simple things to keep their dog out of trouble and their neighbours happy:

- Make sure your dog is properly fenced in at home
- Use a leash when you are out
- Exercise your pet daily
- Provide adequate bedding
- Provide a balanced diet and access to drinking water at all times
- Provide veterinarian care when required
- Train them not to bark excessively
- Stop them from roaming or being aggressive
- Desex their animal if it is not required for breeding
- Pick up after them in public (you may be fined if your animal's excrement remains on any road, street, nature strip, reserve, and public or Council land)
- Make sure they are registered and identified so they can be returned easily if they do get out.

Farm Household Allowance Activity Supplements

Farm Household Allowance (FHA) activity supplements help pay for activities to improve your financial position. They're worth up to \$10,000 over your lifetime.

How this helps your Financial Improvement Agreement

Your Farm Household Case Officer (FHCO) works with you to develop a Financial Improvement Agreement. This is a plan for you to improve your financial situation.

If a couple gets FHA, each member needs their own agreement. Their goals and activities may complement each other or they may be different.

The agreement lists the activities you agree to do while you get FHA. We provide activity supplements worth up to \$10,000 in total to help pay for these activities. The amount doesn't reset each time you get FHA. This means \$10,000 is the total amount you can get in activity supplements for all periods you get FHA.

A farming couple in Victoria both applied for FHA when their farm was in drought. "Sharon" is the partner with full-time carer responsibilities for their children. She decided to go back to uni and improve her qualifications. She used activity supplements to help pay her uni fees.

"Christine," a dairy farmer in New South Wales, used activity supplements to pay for training courses to learn about organic farming practices. She got organic certification so she can sell organic milk at a higher price. She used an activity supplement to pay for advice on how to set up an organic milk processing plant.

For some people, their goal is to remain working on the farm. The Financial Improvement Agreement may include work to improve the farm's productivity.

"Ian" in Victoria wants to improve the production of his stone fruit orchard. He needs to learn more about disease management practices. He was able to use an activity supplement to pay for a course to learn about this.

For others, their goal may be to find work away from the farm. The agreement can include study or training linked to farming or a completely different type of work.

"David" in Queensland decided to work off the farm as it wasn't financially viable. He finds a TAFE course to get a qualification to help him find suitable work. David's FHCO tells him the activity supplement can pay for the training cost of \$2,800. It can also pay for his travel and accommodation while he studies. He finished the course and found a full-time job soon after.

Farmers nearing retirement age can get help with succession planning and arranging finances for the next stage of life.

"Jim" and "Mary," a dairy farming couple in Western Australia, used activity supplements to pay for advice to develop a succession plan. The plan helped a smooth transition of the farm business, divided among their 3 children. It also helped to secure the couple's own financial future through retirement.

PEANUT BUTTER CUPS AND WHITE CHOCOLATE LAVA CAKE

Peanut Butter Cups

Ingredients

- 200g dark chocolate drops
- 30g coconut oil
- 1tsp vanilla extract
- 125g peanut butter
- 40g icing sugar
- flaky salt

Method

Step 1

Place the peanut butter in a bowl. Sieve in the icing sugar. Use a spoon or spatula to combine both ingredients into a paste. This will take a few minutes to come together.

Step 2

Once the mixture has come together, roll in balls and flatten slightly to create thick disks. Set aside.

Step 3

Use a microwave or a double boiler to melt together the dark chocolate and coconut oil. Add the vanilla extract.

Step 4

Grab your moulds. Place a tsp or tbsp of melted chocolate in each mould. Place your peanut butter disk, then

cover with the remaining melted chocolate.

Step 5

Place in the freezer for 20 minutes to set.

Step 6

Remove the cups from the freezer and take them off the moulds. Drizzle any remaining melted chocolate on top and add a touch of flaky sea salt on top. Place back in freezer to set.

Step 7

Once your cups are set, you will need them in the fridge to avoid melting.

White Chocolate Lava Cake

Ingredients

Custard

- 1/3 cup store bought custard
- 2 tsp queen natural white choc flavouring paste

Cake

- 100g unsalted butter, softened
- 185g caster sugar
- two large eggs
- 2 tbsp + 2 tsp queen natural white choc flavouring paste

- 1/3 cup self raising flour, sifted
- 1/2 cup milk

Method

Custard

Step 1

Preheat oven to 160C (fan forced)

Step 2

In the bowl of a stand mixer or using a hand mixer, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time mixing to incorporate, then add remaining 2 tbsp of white choc flavouring paste and mix again.

Step 3

Add sifted flour and milk, mixing until just combined. Pour batter unto the ramekins until they are half full, leaving some remaining batter aside. Top with one frozen custard cube in each ramekin and pour remaining batter over the top of custard to cover.

Step 4

Bake for 20-22 minutes or until the top of the cakes are golden and bounce back when pressed lightly. Remove from oven and carefully turn the cakes out onto cake plates. Dust with icing sugar and serve at once.



GARDENING

Plain In A Pot Landscaping Design

Ever wish you could recognise your garden after seeing how mature plants look? Here's a clever way to do it. You'll need a bunch of pots of the same size, so they'll nest in each other. Put your plants in doubled pots, and then bury them at ground level. Whenever you want a change, lift out the top pot and put in a different one. This method is also really slick for bringing plants indoors over winter. This method is great for quickly changing out seasonal plants and allows for easy experimentation with colour and placement of plants and flowers.

Saving Soil With Old Cans

For deep planters, fill out the bottom with old cans and plant pots. The cans and pots improve drainage and create air pockets for better aeration and healthier soil.

Simple Lawn Edging

To edge your lawn, garden or flowerbed, lay down a 2x6. While holding the board with your foot, drive a flat garden spade along the boards

edge. Move the board as needed to create a clean straight line.

Micro Greenhouse

Do you have a hard time starting seeds or cuttings? Try soda bottle mini greenhouses. Cut the bottom off 2 litre soda bottles and remove the labels. Each seed gets it's own micro greenhouse. Remove the greenhouses once the seeds have germinated and cuttings are rooted.

Cardboard Seed Tubes

For an easy and green way to start seeds, save your toilet paper and paper towel tubes. Cut the tubes into 2 inch lengths and set them in a waterproof tray. Fill the tubes with potting soil and plant your seeds. When the seedlings are ready to move to the garden, plant them right in their cardboard tube. The cardboard will decompose. Be sure to keep the tube below the soil surface, so it doesn't wick moisture away from the roots.

Healthy Plant Hydration

Water settling at the bottom of pots can lead to root rot. To combat this

problem, cut up old sponges and put them in the bottom of the pot. The sponges retain moisture and create necessary air space. They also help prevent water from flushing out the bottom. The sponge acts as a water reserve and keeps soil moist longer.

Save Used Coffee Grounds For Your Garden Soil

Before you toss the leftover coffee grounds into the trash, you might want to think of your plants. Used coffee grounds can be used to improve the soil, adding nitrogen to help plants absorb water and nutrients. They can even help deter pests. However, there are some definite do's and don'ts when it comes to using coffee grounds in your garden, so be sure to follow the guidelines.

Control Your Climbing Plants With Zip Ties

To direct the vines, fasten zip ties around the stalks, strapping them to anything stable. Don't strap the vines too tightly, they need to be able to move and grow.


