unrestricted burning

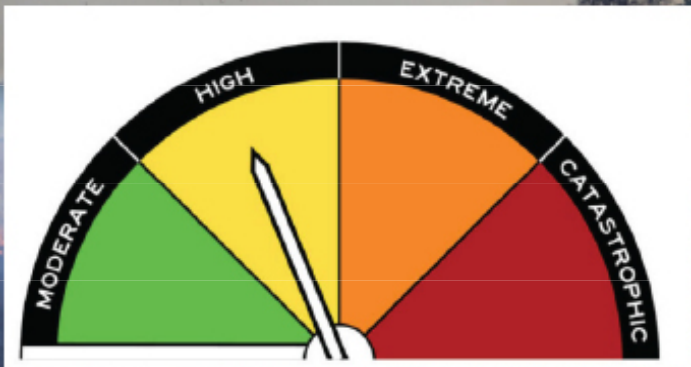


Shire of Kulin is now in the Unrestricted Burning Period (commenced 16th March 2024).

Hello all,
Welcome back to another edition of the Kulin Update.

Late last year we nominated the Tin Horse Highway for the 'Australian Street Art Awards', for best street art trail. We were selected as a finalist for our category, however, we didn't take out the win this time. Even being selected as a finalist is an amazing achievement, that recognises every member of the community who has made a horse, or has been involved with the Bush Races in any way. Collie took out first place with their Mural Trail.

We have also nominated our town for the 'Perth Airport Tiny Tourism Town' awards, the outcome of these will be announced Tuesday, 11 June 2024.

Some may remember in April of 2023 we held workshops for Youth Week WA. In these workshops youth got to come and create artwork around what made Kulin special to them. From all the amazing art created, a group of people selected 10 pieces to be turned

into banners for the main street. These have arrived and are expected to go up in early May.

In the coming days hazard reduction works will commence in Reserve 25777 on the northwest edge of the Kulin townsite. The exact date of the burn is not confirmed, and the decision will be made on the day dependent on suitable weather conditions and fuel moisture. Every effort will be made to conduct the controlled burn when prevailing winds are taking smoke away from the Kulin townsite. The burn will be conducted prior to Easter 2024.

We have a few positions currently open at the Shire. We are seeking a casual Customer Service Officer, a Plant Mechanic and casual childcare educators. If you or someone you know would be interested in any of these, be sure to get in contact.

The FRC has been flat out recently, with non-stop bowls, events and meetings being held there. Having a centre managed so well is such a great asset to our community, and Iria and

The Shire of Kulin has a path network improvement plan in place, this means that paths are assessed and replaced as necessary. If you notice any issues with path quality, please be aware that is most likely already on our radar and scheduled to be replaced.

Conditions of employment are in accordance with the Local Government Industry Award 2020, Industrial Agreement.

On Thursday the 14th of March we had very special student doctors Ella, Natasha, Ashlee & Hayley visit Kulin Childcare Centre.

The children were overjoyed with excitement to have the doctors along for the morning. They began with discussing how to



keep your bodies healthy including eating fruits & vegetables and drinking water, making sure that we are sun safe wearing long clothes & sunscreen and playing in the shade when able. They discussed brushing our teeth every morning and night to keep our teeth and gums healthy. The doctors also talked about keeping our hands clean to stop germs spreading and entering our bodies when we eat.



The children had a chance to take their teddy or doll to the doctor with a problem which they then resolved together. The doctors used play doctor sets to help demonstrate how doctors might come to a diagnosis on a patient.

The children then took a turn at being the doctor with their patient, the students assisted the children in taking temperature, wrapping bandages, taking blood pressure, and giving immunisations.



The children all had a very positive experience with the doctors on the day and the experience we hope will help build their confidence about going to the doctor or dentist and also being more aware of how to take care of their bodies and teeth.

A big thank you to Rural Health West for organising the Medical Student Immersion Program which allowed our children to have this experience in the centre.

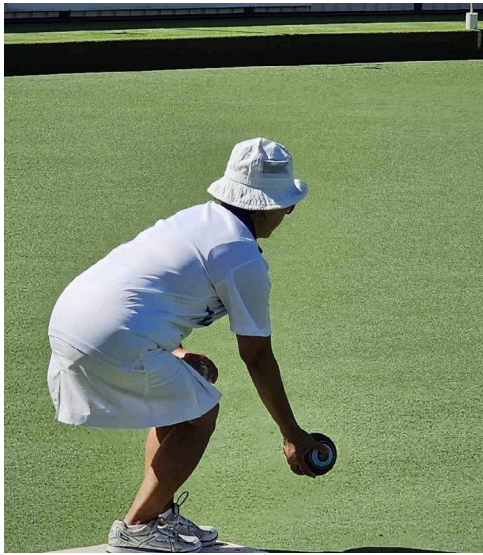

Blazing Swan Event being held between March 27th and April 2nd

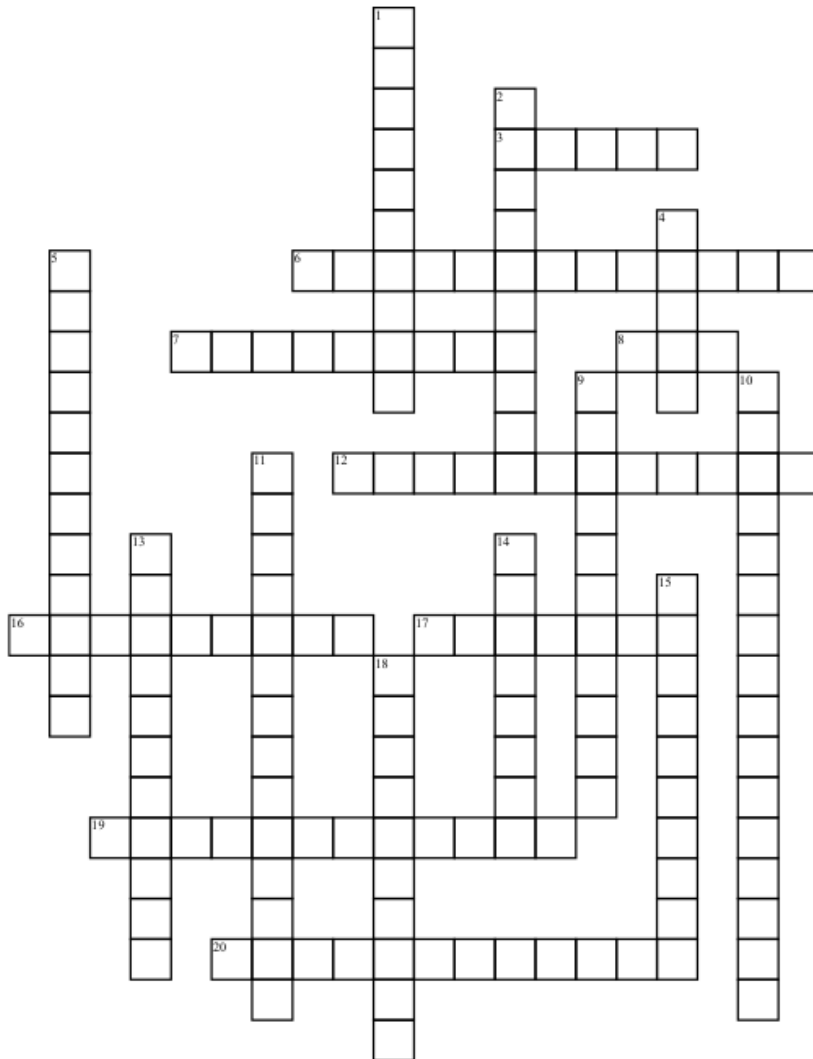

The WA Firearms Act Reform Voluntary Buyback Scheme



The WA voluntary firearms buyback scheme commenced on Wednesday 21 February 2024.

All WA individual firearm licence holders are eligible to receive compensation for surrendered firearms regardless of whether legislative changes impact their licence. The voluntary scheme will remain open until Saturday, 31 August 2024, or until the \$64.3 million fund is exhausted.

A payment schedule based on current retail baseline valuations, similar to those used in the 1996/97 Commonwealth buyback, has been developed in conjunction with industry stakeholders.

Firearms can be surrendered at any WA Police station. Unlicensed firearms may be surrendered without penalty and without fear of prosecution, however, they will not qualify for the buyback scheme.

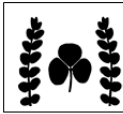
