#### **CRC CORNER**

This week we have hosted the Crossroads Breakfasts throughout the Shire. It has been great for all Councillors and staff to catch up with community members and discuss any issues or concerns they have, and to just have a chat and check in. Thank you to Tincurrin Rural Services for the use of the BBQ trailer.

We have served over 75 bacon and egg rolls to the community and thank you to our Councillors who got involved with the cooking and serving and staff for getting the trailer where it needed to be and setting up/packing up.

Thank you also to Barry and Andy who were able to attend a couple of the breakfasts.

To highlight the points made at the breakfasts:

1. During harvest please use the whole road (not just three channels) to spread the impact

- 2. If there you have concerns about any roads, please contact the Shire so we can assess the issues
- 3. Harvest Bans we understand the impact harvest bans have on your business however they are done to protect the community. Harvest bans are only initialised after weather tests have been taken including wind, wind gusts, humidity, temperature and fuel load. If these readings are above a certain level, then a Harvest Vehicle Movement Ban must be declared. The conditions are monitored and reviewed regularly.
- 4. Fires a reminder to the community to call 000 immediately when you have a fire or see a fire. This allows DFES time to mobilise their teams. If you can put the fire out, you can then call 000 and inform them it is under control and the fire units will stand down. Please do not wait until the fire is out of control to contact 000 as this is when major damage to you, and

- your neighbours can occur. It can be too late to minimise the damage if you wait too long. Make 000 your first call
- 5. Drive to the conditions the speed limit may be 110 (100 for trucks) however it doesn't mean you need to do that limit on all roads, at all times. Drivers cannot afford to be complacent on the roads, especially during harvest. Slow down, drive safely drive to the conditions and the conditions of the roads and keep all road users safe.
- 6. Harvest Ban Information Line 9880 1511 this is updated to the current status of harvest bans.

Thank you to everyone who attended and supported the breakfasts, and we wish everyone a safe harvest.





#### ZUCCHINI SLICE AND LEMON WHITE CHOCOLATE BROWNIES (GF)

#### **Zucchini Slice**

#### **Ingredients**

- 5 eggs
- 1 cup self raising flour375g zucchini, grated
- 1 large onion, finely chopped
- 200g rindless bacon, chopped
- 1 cup grated cheddar cheese
- ½ cup vegetable oil

#### Step 1

Preheat oven to 170C

#### Step 2

Beat the eggs in a large bowl until combined. Add the flour and beat until smooth, then add zucchini, onion, bacon, cheese and oil and stir to combine.

#### Step 3

Grease and line a 30 x 20cm lamington pan. Pour into prepared pan and bake in oven for 30 minutes or until cooked through.

## **Lemon White Chocolate Brownies GF**

#### **Ingredients**

- 250g white chocolate + 50g for decorating
- 200g unsalted butter, chopped
- 3 large eggs
- 200g caster sugar
- 3 lemons
- 170g GF plain flour
- Pinch of salt

#### Instructions

#### Step 1

Place 250g white chocolate into a

microwave-proof medium-sized bowl, with the unsalted butter. Microwave for 30 seconds, leave to stand for 30 seconds then stir, then repeat a second and third time or until the chocolate and butter have melted — do not overheat or you risk splitting the chocolate / getting a very messy microwave! Stir vigorously with a fork or small whisk to combine.

#### Step 2

Grease and line a 20cm square baking tin with non-stick baking paper. Preheat the oven to 170C.

#### Step 3

Crack the eggs into a large mixing bowl, then sift in the caster sugar. Then add the zest of the 3 lemons. Mix with a fork or wooden spoon until well-combined.

#### Step 4

Pour the chocolate mixture (which should have cooled slightly by now – warm is okay but ensure its not really hot, as this may curdle the eggs) into the bowl with the eggs, sugar and lemon zest. Mix immediately until you have a thick batter.

#### Step 5

Finally add the pinch of salt and sift in the GF plain flour. Mix really well until the flour has been incorporated into the brownie batter.

#### Step 6

Now pour the brownie batter into the prepared baking tin, then bake on the middle shelf of the oven for 35 minutes. The brownie will largely bake, but with a really wobbly section in the center when you take it out of the oven – this is exactly how you want it to be for a fudgy centre. If you prefer cakier brownies, bake for an extra 5 minutes.

#### Step 7

As we are making a fudgy brownie you will need it cool fully before cutting else it may be soft and runny in the middle. You can either leave it at room temperature or if you are in a hurry pop it in the fridge as it has stopped being hot to speed up the cooling.

#### Step 8

Once the brownies have completely cooled, carefully lift the entire brownie square out of the tin (I lift the sides of the baking paper to transfer them), and onto a chopping board.

#### Step 9

Now to make a lemon and white chocolate ganache to drizzle over the brownies. Add the remaining 50g white chocolate to a small microwavable bowl and squeeze over 10ml lemon juice (the remaining lemons can be stored in the fridge and used for salad dressings/other recipes). Microwave for 10 seconds, leave to sit for 30 seconds then stir – if still thick, microwave for a few seconds and stir again until smooth and glossy. Don't overheat as it will split.


#### Step 10

Pour the ganache into a small piping bag or use a spoon to drizzle it over the brownies. Pop in the fridge for 15 minutes to set, then slice into 12 brownies and enjoy!



#### **MOVING HOUSE**

#### Get Rid Of Some Stuff

Packing all your possessions into boxes, bags and more can be overwhelming. Make it a little bit easier on yourself by cutting back on clutter as much as possible. Before you pack a single box, do a merciless purge of unused or unnecessary items. You'll have less to pack, less to move, and less to unpack – and you'll start life in your new space with a clean slate.

#### Make A Moving Folder

Start collecting new address information, rental or purchase papers, moving contracts and more in one folder. (Consider a hard copy, rather than a digital one, in case computer or phone batteries die during the move.) If any questions come up during the planning process or the move itself, you'll have the answer (and records of agreements, payments, and more) on hand.

#### Pack As Far In Advance As Possible

Ideally, you'll know about a move (even if you're not sure of the destination) weeks or even months in advance. Start by packing off-season items and the items you won't miss. If you're moving in summer, you can pack winter coats in advance — and likely books and other once in a while items. When it's finally time to move, many items will already be ready to go, giving you less stress about.

#### **Book Early**

If you're hiring moving services, renting supplies, or hiring professionals such as painters or cleaners to work on the house, book early. Waiting to do so could mean paying a higher price, or not being able to get a truck or movers at all, particularly if it's peak moving season.

#### Schedule Utilities For Your New

#### Place

Once the dates are finalized, contact your utility providers to schedule service at your new home. You don't want to arrive there, tired from the move, only to find that the electricity, water or heat it off. Schedule it ahead of time and keep records of your requests in your moving folder. At the same time, request service stops for your move-out date at your current home

#### **Keep The Essentials With You**

On the night before the move, tuck everyday essentials – a change of clothes, a toothbrush, must have stuffed animals or toys for the kids, medications, paperwork, into a suitcase or bag you'll keep with you in the car, the truck cab, or on the plan. If a catastrophe strikes and the moving truck gets lost, at least you'll have some essentials with you.

#### **Invest In Equipment**

A few days before the big move, stock up on supplies. The last thing you want is to have to make a run to the store while you're packing moving boxes or making sure everything is out of the house. Order or purchase box cutters, adhesive bandages, permanent markers, packing tape, paper towels, and garbage bags.

For larger moving equipment, considering renting moving tools from a moving company. If you move frequently, you may be better off purchasing these tools. Either by buying, renting, or borrowing, make sure you have a furniture dolly, furniture pads or covers, and tie down straps or rope at your disposal during the move.

#### **Snap Lots Of Pics**

No, not of your sweaty face, of your old and new place. If there's a security

deposit involved, you're going to want photos to prove how you left things and what things were like when you moved in.

#### **Unpack On A Deadline**

This will not be a process with instant gratification but consider giving yourself a timeline. Maybe you can do five boxes a day? Or two rooms a day? Or all the essentials right away? Decide what's realistic and do your best to stick to it.

#### **Use The Right Size Boxes**

When you pack books for moving, pack them or other heavy items in small boxes; light items, like linens and pillows, can be packed in bigger ones. (Large boxes packed with heavy items are a common complaint of professional movers. They not only make the job harder but also have a better chance of breaking.)

#### **Tape Your Moving Boxes Well**

Use a couple of pieces of tape to close the bottom and top seams, then use one of the movers' techniques – making a couple of wraps all the way around the box's top and bottom edges, where stress is concentrated.

#### If You're Moving Expensive Art, Ask Your Mover About Special Crating

Understand exactly how to pack artwork for moving to help keep it safe. You should never wrap oil paintings in regular paper; it will stick. When you pack pictures for moving, make an X with masking tape across the glass to strengthen it and to hold it together if it shatters. Then wrap the pictures in paper or bubble wrap and put them in a frame box, with a piece of cardboard between each framed piece for protection.

# PET REGISTRATIONS \*\* \*\* (DOGS & CATS) \*\*\*\*\*\*

There is State Government legislation in place to ensure control and registration of dogs and cats in our community. The State Government also sets all of the registration fees associated with the control and registration of dogs and cats. The registration period for 1-year and 3-years expires on 31 October.

Each year from 1 June, new one-year pet registrations are half price. This registration is only valid through to 31 October, at which time it will be due for renewal.

The Shire of Kulin is responsible for enforcing and administering State Government legislation in our community. Registering and microchipping your pet makes it easier for our Rangers to help return your pet to you if they become lost.

#### WHEN TO REGISTER YOUR PET?

- Dogs aged over three months are required to be microchipped and registered
- · Cats aged over six months must be registered, microchipped and sterilised
