The weather has warmed up this week with a fitting start to the Kulin Aquatic Centre season. The pool will be open on Friday 1st November and the slide will be open on Saturday and Sunday. Early morning swimming starts up Friday between 6.00am and 7.30am which is the perfect way to start your day and grab a coffee to go.

With the weather warming up and harvest starting we have a few reminders regarding burning and harvest bans.

# PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All burning is prohibited from 1 November 2024 to 15 February 2025. NO burning permits can be issued in this period.

#### HARVEST BAN INFORMATION LINE | 9880 1511

This is a recorded message and is updated with current harvest ban information

#### IN CASE OF FIRE RING 000

If there is a fire you must call 000 immediately. Shire of Kulin staff are unable to register the emergency.

#### HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans are issued by your local government and are put in place when your local Bushfire Control Officer identifies the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery as high bushfire risk activities, during particular times of the day. Kulin Shire will distribute this information via SMS and the harvest ban information line.

#### TOTAL FIRE BAN

A Total Fire Ban is declared on days when fires are most likely to threaten lives and property. This is because of predicted extreme fire weather or when there are already widespread fires and firefighting resources are stretched. Total Fire Bans are put in place by DFES.

#### **Registration of Farm Dogs**

From time to time the Shire will receive notification of a missing farm dog. On occasions the dog will end up in the hands of the Shire.

Notwithstanding the legislative requirement to register all dogs including farm dogs, registration and microchipping of farm dogs does assist the Shire in identifying the owner of the dog, in particular when the dog goes missing after a storm as one common example.

Rural dog owners are encouraged to follow up with the Shire regarding the process and requirements of dog registration, which at the end of the process ultimately protects the owners interest in the dog and the dog itself.

A duty of care exists for a Fire Control Officer to ensure that persons attending an incident has appropriate PPE (personal protective equipment), the same responsibility rests with those attending so please ensure you wear the required clothing, otherwise insurance issues may arise.

As we head towards the start of Bush Fire Season, the Shire offers all our volunteers the opportunity to order protective clothing - coats and trousers, supplied by Stewart & Heaton Protex as well as Honeywell 7600 face masks, provided by Scavenger Supplies.

The Kulin Shire cover the full cost of protective clothing and will pay 50% of the cost of face masks.


















Come along to our season opener to register, meet the coaches and find out all the info about the Kulin Swimming Club in 2024. It will be a fun and social event for everyone!

recently Sue put together shaving foam sensory trays for a morning activity. The children explored the texture of the foam mixing in wooden blocks. Sensory experiences such as these allow children to explore touch, enjoy messy play and build their abstract thinking skills. Communication between children during this activity was a joy to watch.



Our home corner is featuring our doctor kits again. A true favourite in our children's role play is this first aid equipment. Role play in this scenario supports children to understand the concepts they have come to understand from their own medical experiences. This builds their confidence when attending the doctor or hospital. Communication is practised between the children during role play, advising their patients, or recounting an experience. The more they can interpret these experiences between their peers the easier they become to do in real life.

One of our favourites outside matt sessions is our 'letter friend' game. The children take turns to drop a letter to their friend as everyone sings, the letter has a picture and song included. The children can often read the title of the song from the picture inside. As a group they all sing the song with actions.





Surfing outside is a new activity for our children. Although the beach is awhile away, all we need at KCCC is the beach boys playing and our sandpit mat surf boards. This is a great example of educators scaffolding children's interest to include imagination in play.





#### OCTOBER 2024 RURAL AID ARTICLE

People have an ability to choose their attitude. In any situation we can choose how we respond. This is unique and can be found not in always seeking happiness but instead seeking wholeness of self. Mind Body, Soul. Everything has something to teach us. Life does and will throw us challenges, life does and will give us grief, life has and will give us stress and life has and will show us happiness. There's no escaping these experiences. But there is always meaning in these experiences. That meaning can be realised at that moment and also later on when we look back and reflect on the event.

Understand that you are unique. As the only person who really knows you then its up to you to be best 'me' you can and do what you believe is right. Live to your values, be who know you really are.

Our individual meaning of our existence goes in hand with our personal values. Our personal values help us move towards our personal life's desired goals. The following three statements describe how our personal life's values are achievable focussing on or realising that; 1. Life has meaning under all circumstances,2. the main reason for living is our will and capacity to find meaning in life, 3. We in all situations have freedom to find meaning. Even in times of extreme hardship we have freedom and an ability to find a meaning to continue on. Even if this meaning is spiritual it's still a reason to continue walking forward. Spiritual is not confined to religion; it can be whatever you believe spirituality to be.

What's this about? This time of year, sees people getting very busy in various roles in our regions as the harvest and all the associated businesses of harvesting ramps up. Lambing, Calving, crutching and sales of stock before the end of year break makes us busier. A reminder to understand that being busier for some, not all, means being more stressed and tired, more tired means being less able to reason, less ability to reason opens the door to more negativity. More negativity leads to more stress and frustration.

We all have the ability to pause and reflect before we respond. This ability helps to stop the knee jerk reaction of saying or doing something in the moment. Afterwards you ponder, why did I do that? where did that come from? Why did I say that? When your body and mind are telling you something, listen. Accept the fact that you and only you are responsible for your reaction and attitude. No one is saying, 'hey you get frustrated and stressed now'. If someone close to you expresses concerns because they have noticed you appear different; not the person they know and love; then the same rule applies. Pause, reflect on why they feel they need to tell you this and accept it comes from their

heart.

"If you are patient in a moment of anger, you will escape a hundred days of sorrow" (Chinese proverb)

This is not easy but it is a choice. I choose to follow the path towards my values not the alternative negative path some thoughts are asking me to take.

Sometimes our negative thoughts are to strong and we cannot see any light through the black clouds around us. This realisation is also a time to listen to your body and soul and seek help. Be strong seek help, be strong be that help. You will be surprised how many people actually do care when your negative thoughts are advising you otherwise.

#### CREAM CHEESE SUGAR COOKIES AND CARROT CAKE

#### **Pumpkin Cheesecake Pie**

#### **Ingredients**

#### **Biscoff Crust**

- 32 Biscoff cookies
- 5 tbsp unsalted butter

#### **Filling**

- 452g cream cheese, room temperature
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup brown sugar
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup pumpkin puree
- 1 tbsp cornstarch
- 2 tbsp heavy cream
- 1 tsp pure vanilla extract
- ½ tsp lemon juice
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- ½ tsp ground ginger
- ½ tsp ground nutmeg
- ½ tsp ground cardamom
- Small pinch freshly ground black pepper
- 2 large eggs, at room temperature

#### Instructions

#### Step 1

Preheat oven to 177C.

#### Step 2

Make the crust. Use a food processor or blender to grind the Biscoff cookies into fine crumbs. You can also place them in a zip-tip bag and crush them into fine crumbs using a rolling pin and some arm muscle. In a medium bowl, stir the Biscoff crumbs and melted butter together until combined. The mixture will be thick, coarse, and sandy. Try to smash/break up any large chunks. Pour the mixture into an ungreased 9-inch pie dish. With medium pressure using your hand, pat the crumbs down into the bottom and up the sides to make a compact crust. Do not pack down with heavy force because that makes the crust too hard. Simply pat down until the mixture is no longer crumby/crumbly.

#### Step 3

Bake the crust for 10 minutes. Make the filling in the next step as the crust bakes.

#### Step 4

Make the filling. In a large bowl, using a handheld or stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment, beat the cream cheese and brown sugar together on medium-high speed until the mixture is smooth and creamy, about 3 minutes. Add the pumpkin, cornstarch, heavy cream, vanilla extract, lemon juice, and spices, and beat until fully combined and very smooth. You don't want any lumps. Then on medium speed, add the eggs one at a time, beating after each addition until just blended. After the second egg is incorporated into the batter, stop mixing, If you still see some lumps at this point, switch to a whisk and whisk by hand.

#### Step 5

Reduce the oven temperature to 163C. Spread the pumpkin cheesecake filling into the warm crust.

#### Step 6

Bake the pie for 40 - 45 minutes or until the filling is almost fully set with a little wobble in the very center. Give the pie a light tap to check. During bake time, if the pie is browning too quickly on top and around the edges, tent with aluminum foil.

#### Step 7

Set the pie on a wire rack and cool for 1 hour at room temperature. Then place it in the refrigerator and chill for at least 2 hours and up to 2 days before serving.

#### **Carrot Cake**

#### Ingredients

- 175g sugar
- 175ml sunflower oil
- 3 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 140g grated carrot
- 100g raisins
- 1 large orange, zested

- 175g self-raising flour
- 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
  - ½ tsp grated nutmeg

#### **For The Frosting**

- 175g icing sugar
- 1 ½ tbsp orange juice

#### Method

#### Step 1

Heat the oven to 180C. Oil and line the base and sides of an 18cm square cake tin with baking parchment.

#### Step 2

Tip the sugar, sunflower oil and eggs into a big mixing bowl. Lightly mix with a wooden spoon. Stir in the carrots, raisins and orange zest.

#### Step 3

Sift the flour, bicarbonate of soda, cinnamon and nutmeg into the bowl. Mix everything together, the mixture will be soft and almost runny.

#### Step 4

Pour the mixture into the prepared tin and bake for 40 minutes or until it feels firm and springy when you press it in the centre.

#### Step 5

Cool in the tin for 5 minutes, then turn it out, peel off the paper and cool on a wire rack. (You can freeze the cake at this point if you want to serve it at a later date.)

#### Step 6

Beat the icing sugar and orange juice in a small bowl until smooth – you want the icing in a small bowl until smooth – you want the icing about as runny as single cream. Put the cake on a serving plate and boldly drizzle the icing back and forth in diagonal lines over the top, letting it drip down the sides.



#### MELBOURNE CUP DAY

Australia's Melbourne Cup Day, held the first Tuesday in November at Flemington Racecourse, in Melbourne, Victoria, is November 5 this year. It's a state holiday, and most schools and businesses shut down to let everybody take part. About 100,000 people flock to Flemington, but the 3,200-meter turf race is televised live to about 650 million people around the world. "Cup Day", as its popularly known, is the biggest horse racing event in Australia, home to more racecourses than any other country in the world. The day is part of a weeklong Melbourne Cup Carnival of festivities and fashion.

#### **History of Melbourne Cup Day**

It was 1840 when the Gold Rush town of Melbourne decided to racehorses down by the banks of the river. There was a large flat area, with a hill to the northwest for spectators. The next year, the organizers put up some scaffolding, but it was 1848 before there was a real grandstand. The course became known as the Melbourne Racecourse.

The landowner named the area "Flemington" after property his wife owned in Scotland, and in the 1850s everyone was calling the course the "Flemington Racecourse". It's the oldest racecourse in Australia.

By 1859, horses from New South Wales, Tasmania and New Zealand were competing in the Australian Championship Sweepstakes. The event attracted 40,000 people and was the first Australian sporting event ever telegraphed in Sydney. At that point, Melbourne's racing power players conceived an even bigger, more prestigious event that could bring in funds for developing the track.

The Melbourne Cup made its debut in 1861. In those early days, there were two rival racing clubs, the Victoria Turf Club and the Victoria Jockey Club. With the two at loggerheads, management of the course and the Cup suffered, the track was sabotaged, and both clubs went into debt. So, they merged in 1864 to form the Victoria

Racing Club, the governing body of Flemington today. The next year, the Club was pleased to have Melbourne Cup Day declared a half-day holiday.

One problem, though, was that the Victoria Racing Club didn't own the land; they leased it. In 1871, the government passed the Victorian Racing Club Act, entrusting land ownership to the club. The Melbourne Cup was first run on a Tuesday in 1875. Two years later, Victoria made the day an official state holiday to accommodate the size and significance of the event.

## Why Is Melbourne Cup Day Celebrated?

Melbourne Cup Day has been observed in Australia since the first race was held at the Flemington Racecourse in Victoria in 1861. The race was won by Archer, who won it again the following year.

## Is Melbourne Cup Day A Public Holiday In Victoria?

Melbourne Cup Day is a public holiday across all of Victoria unless an alternate local holiday has been arranged by non-metro council.

# How Many Horses Died In The Melbourne Cup 2019?

While the Cup is undoubtedly one of Australia's biggest sporting events, 2019 has proved to be one of the most challenging years yet. An undercurrent of anti-racing sentiment has been on the rise after the deaths of six horses in the Cup since 2013 – a tragic statistic seized on by protesters.

#### How To Celebrate Melbourne Cup Day

#### 1. Watch The Parade

The day before the race, join thousands of other people for a big parade in central Melbourne as part of the week-long Melbourne Cup Carnival. There's a car or carriage for each entrant, carrying the jockey and

trainer.

#### 2. Wear A Big Hat

Racing enthusiasts on the distaff side turn out in their elegant floral finery and lift a glass of bubbly at the Victorian Race Club on Kennedy Oaks Day, one of four race days that make up the Melbourne Cup Carnival. No torn jeans and t-shirts today! Ladies make the fashion scene in puffy sleeves, bright colours, bold prints, lace, ruffles, whimsical headpieces, and footwear never intended for walking on grass. This is the day Australia's top milliners compete on the catwalk for the Millinery Award.

#### 3. Place Your Bet

Only four-horse races in the world can boast a bigger purse than the Melbourne Cup. That's just one of the reasons the Cup is called "the race that stops the nation," as office workers across Australia stops what they're doing to watch the race on television or internet as it goes off at 3:00pm in Melbourne.

#### **Cup Day Lasts A Week**

Cup day reigns over the weeklong Melbourne Cup Carnival, which includes four race days, fashion competitions and fun for all. The Lexus Melbourne Cup trophy, the 18-carot gold loving cup now sponsored by Lexus, travels the state in the Lexus Melbourne Cup Tour to raise money for local causes.

#### **Humans Become Clotheshorses**

Cup Day is not casual. The fashionistas trot out to Flemington to strut their stuff. Throughout the year, ladies compete in Myer Fashions on the Field, with regional winners advancing to the state and national final, where the winner is crowned. Not to be out-dressed, male peacock punters pull out their patterns and pocket squares and pursue their own national fashion trophy.
