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CEO Leave – Acting CEO Appointment

The Shire of Kulin advises that Chief Executive Officer, Mr Alan Leeson, will be taking six weeks' leave from Monday 8 September 2025 to Friday 17 October 2025, to spend time in Queensland with family.

During this period, the position of Acting Chief Executive Officer will be filled by Mr Peter Clarke, a highly experienced local government executive with extensive service across the Wheatbelt region. Mr Clarke brings a wealth of local government knowledge and leadership capability and will ensure continuity of operations and service delivery throughout Alan's absence.

Pingaring Rock Water Catchment – Inlet Renewal Works

The Shire of Kulin is pleased to provide an update to the Pingaring community regarding proposed improvements to the historic water catchment infrastructure at the Pingaring Rock Water Tank.

The project will see the replacement of the 600mm inlet pipe that transfers stormwater runoff from the rock wall catchment into the 9-million-litre concrete

tank. This inlet pipe is a vital component of the gravity-fed water harvesting system, and over time, it has deteriorated and become compromised—particularly due to root intrusion and age-related joint failure.

The proposed works will involve full renewal of approximately 180 metres of pipeline, from the junction point at the base of the rock catchment to the tank inlet. Importantly, the scope includes construction of a new reinforced concrete headwall and inlet structure at the tank itself, improving the durability and hydraulic efficiency of the system.

This intervention is considered Stage 1 of a longer-term program to enhance and preserve the integrity of the Pingaring Rock water infrastructure. Once completed, it will restore effective function to the catchment inflow system and allow any future upgrades to the tank itself (such as external sealing treatments) to proceed from a more reliable baseline.

The Shire has developed a rigid maintenance plan to manage the new infrastructure, with particular emphasis on vegetation control and inspection regimes to prevent future root intrusion.

The Shire continues to work closely with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) to finalise both the technical scope and funding arrangements for the project. It is anticipated this process will be completed in the coming couple of weeks,

enabling the Shire to proceed with detailed planning and delivery of the works in the coming weeks.

Pingaring Drought Resilience Project – New Tank and Standpipe

In parallel with the inlet renewal works, the Shire of Kulin is progressing a complementary drought resilience project that will deliver a new high-capacity water tank and standpipe for the Pingaring community.

The project, funded under the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation's Community Water Supplies Partnership Program, involves the construction of a new 360,000-litre zincalume water tank and the installation of a new agricultural-grade standpipe on Luke-Price Street near the existing tanks and standpipe. This new infrastructure will be connected to the existing 9-million-litre concrete tank at the Pingaring Rock site, forming part of an integrated and independent strategic water supply system.

The key objectives of the project are to:

- Provide a climate-resilient non-potable water supply to support firefighting efforts during peak fire season
- Support drought preparedness for local landowners by improving access to reliable water during dry periods

- Reduce dependency on scheme water and cartage from remote locations
- Enhance local infrastructure for emergency response and agricultural continuity

The standpipe will be fitted with a secure and accessible draw-off system and will be connected to the new tank via gravity feed. The system has been designed to allow for future expansion if required and to provide long-term operational efficiency with minimal ongoing maintenance.

The formal Funding Agreement has now been received by the Shire and is expected to be signed in the coming days. Once executed, the project will proceed to procurement

and construction phases, with works anticipated to commence later this year.

This project reflects the Shire's ongoing commitment to strengthening regional water infrastructure, building community resilience, and supporting sustainable water use across the Shire.

A big thank you to Ambrose and the shire crew who always have things in perfect condition for our visitors- the comments we receive are mostly due to your endeavours.

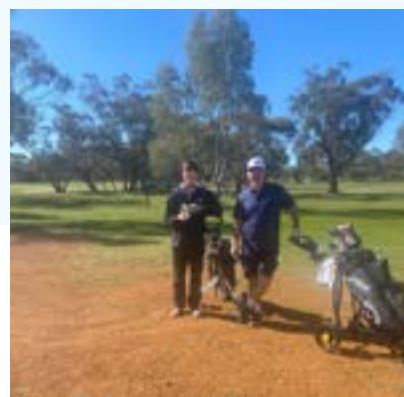
Congratulations to our Clayton Cup 2025 winner- Blake Wilkins and all of those who received trophies.

MARG WATERS- COMMITTEE MEMBER EARLY DAYS....

30 yrs ago a meeting was called for ideas of what could be held to keep Kulin alive as many small towns were having trouble keeping going. After much discussion the idea of an annual bush races was voted on. A committee was formed and with no back up money, track or how many horses would be available the idea went ahead. The Shire put up some backing money and the first race meeting was held.

I was on the committee for 10 years and my job was the souvenirs with Wendy. We started in a tent with polo shirts, t shirts for adults, t shirts for kids and stubby holders. Pat Robins and I sewed show bags from calico, and the bush race logo was stamped on to them. They consisted of whatever we could get donated from firms, banks etc. After a couple of years, we purchased ready-made show bags.

The venue for the races was at Jilakin rock on Lucchesi's property and what a magic place it is. The morning of the first races out to the track bright and early to set up our tent and what a magnificent sight with the sun rising over Jilakin lake full of water.

With an art show held in town on the Friday night the weekend was a huge success and to this day the races are still going strong. To finish off when the sun went down the moon was over the lake with a sight not to be forgotten.

JUDD HOBSON

I was 14 yrs old for the first ever bush races at Jilakin. Days of only small tents and people running around everywhere in organised chaos, making things happen. In those days I was able to drive around on a John Deere Gator being Graemes off sider for any jobs that needed to be done on the spot. I can't remember too many kids' activities that year but I'm sure there was something.

Back then I remember the car parking up in the gravel pit being the major hurdle, with trying to fit cars in and making up parking areas on the run. There used to be an old car in the car park with a set of tractor forks through the window and a sign on it saying, "if you don't park your car properly, we will park it for you". Things are a bit more civilised now!

OUR SOULS AT NIGHT

August Seniors Morning Tea

Last Tuesday, we gathered for our quarterly Seniors Morning Tea, and what a lovely morning it was. With 21 attendees (not including Shire representatives), the room was full of friendly faces, good conversation, and a strong sense of community.

After a warm welcome and a delicious spread courtesy of Amy from Acres of Taste, we settled in for a good catch-up and some informative updates from the Shire.

Shire CEO Alan Leeson opened the morning with a summary of the recently adopted Shire Budget, followed by news that rates notices had just been sent out. Alan and Taryn, our Executive Manager of Community Services, also spoke about the maintenance of health services in Kulin, including the transition to our new provider, St Luke's, with Dr Mackie assisting during the handover. The new service will include a nurse practitioner, and our health nurses will continue to be available at the clinic. The Shire encourages ongoing connection with Kondinin Hospital to support continuity of care.

The conversation turned to drought resilience, with recent focus on the Pingaring townscape standpipe. Judd, our Shire Works Manager,

provided updates on the Road Budget and shared exciting news about improvements at the Visitors Discovery Zone, including a new BBQ, gazebo, grassed area, and gardens for picnicking. Work will also begin soon to upgrade the footpath near the school.

Taryn shared that a gazebo/shelter with seating will be installed at the Macrocarpa Trail, and upgrades are underway for the shower and dump point at the Pingaring RV Stop. Improvements to tennis court lighting are also planned, and the Shire is proud to support the 100-year celebrations of the Dudinin Tennis Club this year.

Maintenance continues around Jilakin Rock, and new street bins are being installed in town. Mr Proud noted how wonderful it is to see new homes going up and more people relocating to country towns like Kulin.

GARDEN UPDATE

The season is changing and the garden is calling—time to get our hands in the dirt and enjoy the spring sunshine.

As the sun begins to peek out more and more over the coming weeks—and we're lucky enough to still be enjoying some lovely rain keeping our gardens watered—the weeds aren't the only things growing madly. That's right, I'm seeing little patches of lawn starting to take off again, and I'm just about ready to give it a good weed and feed to get it cranking along.

I've filled my beautiful new raised garden beds and planted some seedlings, so we'll see how that goes very soon. I'm also (belatedly!) starting my potato towers, and I've popped a guide to the method I'm trying on the following page. I've read and heard good things about this approach, so I'm giving it a go and will keep you updated.

I've also planted a splash of colour in our front yard, and over the next couple of weeks I plan to really dig in—pun absolutely intended! As we all know, Bush Races are just around the corner, and our little town will be inundated with very welcome visitors. As advertised, the Shire will be doing a verge-side pick-up in the next few weeks, so it's perfect timing to get rid of any old rubbish and bits and bobs we no longer need. They'll take away garden debris, but not lawn clippings—so I'm getting ready to have everything looking dandy.

A spring makeover for the yard is well and truly underway. And there are so many ideas for pretty things to plant right now... Somebody hold onto my wallet so I don't get carried away! Potato Tower



Step 1 – Build the Tower

- Form a cylinder using mesh or chicken wire - Approx. 50cm in diameter and 1–1.5m tall. Secure the edges with wire or zip ties
- Choose a sunny spot in your garden & drive a garden stake or star picket into the ground. Secure the mesh cylinder to the stake for stability

Step 2 – Create the Straw Nest & Plant your Potatoes

- Add a 10–15cm layer of straw to the bottom of the cylinder and rake some straw up the sides to form a nest shape.
- Mix compost, manure, and soil or peat moss and soak thoroughly until moist but not soggy to use as your planting medium.
- Fill the straw nest with a layer of your planting mix and then place seed potatoes around the edge of the tower - Cut into halves or quarters if needed—each piece must have an eye



Step 3 – Cover, Pat Down, Repeat

- Cover the seed potatoes with planting mix and gently pat down to settle the soil.
- Layer and Repeat - Add another layer of straw to form a new nest, fill with planting mix and add more seed potatoes. Cover with planting mix, pat down, and top with straw.
- Repeat until you reach the top or run out of potatoes. Ensure the top layer is straw
- Water in VERY WELL

Growth and Care

- Sprouts will appear from the sides within a few weeks
- In 1–2 months, expect lush green growth
- Keep watering regularly—potatoes are thirsty!



Harvest Time

- Remove ties and detach the mesh from the stake, knock the tower over gently. Break apart the straw and soil to reveal your potatoes
- Brush off excess soil and store for a delicious dinner
- Recycle straw and soil back into your compost heap

Rotating your groceries by packing new items away behind the older ones is the secret to keeping everything fresh. At the right moment, everything in your fridge has plenty to give.

Did you know...

Soup, Stories & Friendly Competition

– With a spicy recipe that brings people together

Last year, my son Lawson was working up in Moora at the butcher's shop. It was a fantastic crew – the kind of team that pitched in to help each other, shared a laugh, and still keep in touch even though Lawson's moved on. The camaraderie was something special, and every couple of months they'd run friendly cooking challenges: best meat pie, top burger, a recipe using an unusual shop ingredient... and one time, a pumpkin soup competition.

Well, when Lawson heard about that one, he was straight on the phone: "Mum, I need your spicy pumpkin soup recipe!"

It's a favourite in our house – passed down from my mum and granny, with plenty of tweaks along the way. It started with their golden rule: "Always put apples in your pumpkin soup." Over time, I've played with spices and heat levels, and now I don't even measure – I go by feel. That's the beauty of this recipe: if you want to dial up the spice, just add more once it's out of the oven. If chilli's not your thing, leave it out. No fuss.

The real magic comes from slow-roasting the veggies first. The smell wafts through the house, and no matter what time of day I make it, the kids start hovering around the kitchen. As a bonus, it freezes beautifully – just defrost it slowly and give it a good stir to recombine. You might want to add a splash of stock, cream, or water when reheating, depending on how thick you like it.

We serve it with toasted fingers of Turkish bread for dipping. It goes a long way – even in our family of six, there's always enough for at least two dinners.

And yes – Lawson won the competition. That soup, made with a bit of family magic, took out top honours.

Enjoy. Food made with love and memories is good for the soul. This one comes from my family to yours.



Spicy Pumpkin Soup

Ingredients:

- 1 large pumpkin
- 1 large sweet potato
- 1 large brown onion
- 2 potatoes
- 2 Granny Smith apples
- 1 tbsp Keen's curry powder
- 1 tsp ground cloves
- 1 tsp smoked paprika
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 2 tbsp minced garlic
- 2 tsp fenugreek
- 1 tsp cumin
- 1 tsp ground coriander or coriander seeds
- 1 tsp chilli powder (optional)
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- 1 tbsp butter
- Olive oil
- Salt and pepper
- Chicken or vegetable stock
- Handful of parsley
- ½ cup cream or coconut cream
- Cream for garnish
- Parsley or coriander for garnish.

Method:

1. **Prep the veg:** Chop pumpkin into large pieces

(skin on). Peel and chop sweet potato and apples into chunks about the size of a quarter of an apple. Peel and quarter the onion. Place all into a large mixing bowl.

2. **Spice it up:** Combine all spices in a small bowl. Melt butter and golden syrup together (microwave in 30-second bursts). Pour over the veg and fruit, then sprinkle over the spice mix. Mix well to coat everything evenly. If the mixture looks a little dry, add a splash of olive oil to help everything coat nicely and stay moist during roasting.
3. **Roast:** Line a baking tray with baking paper. Spread the mixture out and bake at 160°C fan-forced (or 170°C conventional) until soft and caramelised.
4. **While roasting:** Peel and chop the potatoes. Finely chop the parsley.
5. **Soup time:** Once roasted veg are cool enough to handle, remove pumpkin skins. Place all roasted veg and raw potatoes into a large soup pot. Cover with stock and bring to a fast simmer. Cook until potatoes

are very soft.

6. **Blend & finish:** Add parsley and blend until smooth using a stick blender. Stir through cream or coconut cream if using. Season to taste.
7. **Serve:** Garnish with extra parsley or coriander and a drizzle of cream. Serve with toasted Turkish bread fingers.

NOTES

- If you store this in a plastic container it will stain the container a lovely orange colour. No harm done but good to remember.

VIETNAM VETERANS DAY: HONOURING OUR OWN

Last week, driving through Quairading on my way to a meeting, I noticed a quiet gathering at their war memorial. Wreaths were being laid, and it took me a moment to realise—it was Long Tan Day.

It's not one of the big public holidays. Not one we all stop for. But maybe we ought to.

Long Tan Day, now formally known as Vietnam Veterans Day, marks the anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan in 1966. It was a brutal and heroic encounter where outnumbered Australian and New Zealand forces held their ground against a much larger enemy.

Delta Company of the Royal Australian Regiment left Nui Dat around 11:15am, heading for the Long Tan rubber plantation. They departed to the sounds of a concert back at base—Little Pattie and Col Joye performing for the troops. By 3:00pm, they reached the plantation. Less than an hour later, the North Vietnamese attacked with mortars, machine guns, and small arms.

Desperate calls for support went out. The New Zealand 161 Field Battery responded swiftly, saving the Australians from being overrun. Under torrential rain, surrounded and low on ammunition, D Company fought on. Two RAAF helicopters braved the weather and enemy fire to drop boxes of ammo and blankets for the wounded.

Alongside the New Zealanders, the Australians were supported by the 103 and 105 Field Batteries and a U.S. battery. Their accurate artillery fire inflicted heavy losses on the enemy. Reinforcements arrived just before 7:00pm as daylight faded. When the North Vietnamese finally withdrew, the Australians didn't yet grasp the scale of their victory.

Captured documents later revealed that 105 Australian soldiers and 3 New Zealand artillerymen had fought for nearly four hours against more than 2,000 Viet Cong and North Vietnamese troops. Eighteen Australians were killed, and 24 wounded.

It was a remarkable battle—but not an outlier. The men who served in Vietnam, often not by choice, did their duty with courage and loyalty. They looked out for their mates. They fought like we expect Australians to fight—with grit, heart, and honour.

Vietnam Veterans Day is a time to remember all who served in that war—a war that remains controversial. Between 1965 and 1972, Australia had a conscription policy for National Service. All 20-year-old men had to register, and a birthday ballot determined who would serve. Known as Nashos, many had little choice: serve or face jail.

Public support for the war, initially strong, quickly waned. And when our boys came home—

bruised, broken, and changed—it wasn't to cheering crowds. It was to jeers and silence. For many, the scars remain.

After I got home from Quairading, I reached out to local Vietnam vet Meggsy for a chat. I felt incredibly lucky when he popped into the Shire offices straight away. Over a cuppa and a bikkie, he shared his story.

Meggsy comes from a long line of Defence Force service. A fit, strong Kulin boy, he was quickly recognised by the Army. Though Nashos were required to serve two years, they kept asking him to sign on for more.

"Come be a PTO (Physical Training Officer) in Sydney," they said. "You won't have to go to Vietnam."

"Not a chance," said Meggsy. "You get my two years and not one day more."

He served in artillery. It was rough. The memories still gnaw at him sometimes. But he also remembers the mischief, the mateship, and the laughter. He and a good mate ran a bookie business over there—tuning in to Radio Australia to run the odds. Officers knew about it and kept an eye on things, even stepping in when bets were being placed by blokes whose money wasn't making it home to their families.

When his two years were up, they asked him to stay on and head to Singapore.

"No way," said Meggsy. "I gave them my two years. That was all they were getting."

And so he came home. Back to the bush. Back to CBH. But coming home wasn't easy.

"You come home and you're still fighting the war. But you just want to go back to normal."

Being out in the bush gave him the space and quiet to begin healing. Footy, fitness, and home helped. But the turning point came in 1987, nearly 20 years later, at the Welcome Home Parade in Sydney.

Prime Minister Bob Hawke said:

"I firmly believe that the October parade will be

the culmination of a long process of reconciliation and community acceptance of its obligations to the veterans of Vietnam. I believe we must honestly acknowledge that our involvement in Vietnam did cause deep divisions in the Australian community. But whatever our individual views on the merits of Australian involvement, we must equally acknowledge the commitment, courage and integrity of our armed forces who served in Vietnam."

For Meggsy, that parade mattered. The local community rallied and sent him off to Sydney to be recognised. It was a moment of pride and healing.

These days, it's bittersweet.

Fewer mates left to march. This Anzac Day, Meggsy headed to Perth to march for the first time—with his family watching on. A proud moment. A worthy one.

So to Meggsy, and to all our Vietnam veterans: we haven't forgotten you. You did your part. You served with courage and pride. And we are proud of you.

Thank you.

Next year, on August 18th, I'll be laying a wreath for you.

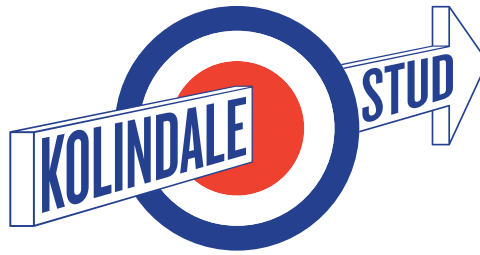
