Updated Firebreak Order

2025/2026

Updated User Fees & Charges

2025/2026

At the Shire of Kulin Ordinary Council Meeting held on 17 September 2025 the Council agreed to adopt an updated Firebreak Order for the 2025/2026 fire season which incorporates the new provision for Licenced Grain Out-Loading Hard Stand Areas.

This provides landowners, particularly those using contractors, with an approved and managed option for completing grain out-loading during periods when a Harvest & Vehicle Movement Ban is in place. Details are included in the updated Firebreak Order which is published in this edition of the Update and available on the Shire's website

Approval for a Licenced Grain Out-Loading Hard Stand Area on your property can be made by completing the application form on the website — please note application forms must be lodged by Monday 20 October 2025.

Council have imposed a \$250 application fee for the licensing of each grain out-loading hard stand area and this fee has been included in the Shire of Kulin User Fees & Charges (imposed from 1 October 2025).

SHIRE OF KULIN FIREBREAK ORDER 2025/2026

Issued pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954

Notice to All Owners and/or Occupiers of Land

You are hereby required on or before 31st October, and thereafter up to and including 15th March, to have a 3 metre firebreak clear of all inflammable material on all rural and townsite land owned or occupied by you, as per the following requirements.

General Firebreak Requirements

Rural Land

- Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.
- In such other positions as are necessary to divide land in excess of 400 hectares into areas not exceeding 400 hectares, each completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- Immediately surrounding any part of land used for crop.
- Parallel to and within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps situated on the land.
- Immediately surrounding any drum or drums or other receptacles situated on the land which are normally used for the storage of fuel, whether they contain fuel or not, provided that the firebreak required shall be not less than 5 metres wide.
- Immediately inside land on which bush has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not); provided that the firebreak required to comply with this paragraph only shall be not less than 7 metres wide. Where the land is prepared for clearing by burning after 19th September you shall provide the firebreak immediately.

Townsite Land - Area Less than 1 Hectare

- All hazardous material must be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants.
- In the remaining area all vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 100mm.
- It is recommended that at least a 2m wide area immediately within the external boundaries of the lot, be clear of all flammable material except for living trees, plants and shrubs. (Note: any land of one hectare or above – rural provisions apply.)

Important Notes

These requirements are made pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954. Failure to comply with this notice may render the landowner or occupier liable to a penalty and the Shire may carry out the required works at the owner's expense. These requirements are in addition to, and not a replacement for, the duty of care under the Act to prevent fire on your property.

Registered Grain Out-Loading Hard Stand Areas

The Shire of Kulin may approve grain out-loading hard stand areas to facilitate safe out-loading of grain, including during periods when a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban (HVMB) is in place.

A registered grain out-loading hard stand area must meet the following requirements:

1. Application Requirements

- Landowner must submit an application and statutory declaration.
- Photographs must show the nominated area is bare earth with a minimum 25-metre radius from any
 ignition source (for example and ignition source might be augers, trucks, or other machinery). Multiple
 areas may be nominated in one application, however approval will be at the discretion of the Shire and
 not all nominated areas may be approved.
- An annual registration fee of \$250 + GST applies.
- GPS/map pin drop required for each nominated site.
- All applications must be lodged with the Shire by no later than 20 October of each year.

2. Maintenance & Standards

- The registered area must be maintained with bare earth for a minimum of 25 metres from any ignition source at all times during its use.
- Approval does not negate the requirement for compliant firebreaks elsewhere on the property
- Registered areas are subject to inspection by a Fire Control Officer at any time without notice.

3. Operational Conditions During Out-Loading

- A dedicated fire unit with a minimum of 600 litres of water, pump, and hose must be present at the site.
- The fire unit must be attended by a person other than the person conducting the out-loading activity.
- Out-loading activity from registered areas may be suspended without notice at the direction of the CBFCO, DCBFCO or FWO(s), for example:
 - o when there is an active fire within the Shire of Kulin
 - when a Catastrophic fire weather forecast is issued by the Bureau of Meteorology.

Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans - Exemptions for Fire Suppression Activities

During the period of a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban (HVMB), the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer (CBFCO) may grant an exemption for the movement of plant or equipment (for example, a dozer) that has been called into fire suppression activities in another local government area.

This exemption is subject to the following condition:

- a fire unit must be in attendance whilst that activity is undertaken, attended by a person other than the person moving the plant/equipment.

Firebreak Variation

If it is considered by the owner or occupier of the land that it is impractical to clear firebreaks to comply with this notice due to soil erosion, the spread of salinity or for any other reason, a request for a variation may be made to the Council not later than 1 September of each year.

Such a request must be in writing and include a detailed farm plan showing the proposed location of firebreaks or of the alternative fire protection methods to be used.

Burning of Garden Refuse During Restricted Burning Period (Sec. 24 (f)) Bush Fires Act 1954)

- (1) A person must not burn garden refuse at a place (other than a rubbish tip) during the limited burning times for that place unless it is burned
 - (a) in an incinerator in accordance with subsection (2); or
 - (b) on the ground in accordance with subsection (3).
 - Penalty: \$3 000.
- (2) Garden refuse burned in an incinerator is burned in accordance with this subsection if
 - (a) the incinerator is designed and constructed so as to prevent the escape of sparks or burning material; and
 - (b) either:-
 - (i) the incinerator is situated 2 m or more away from any building or fence; or
 - (ii) if the incinerator is within 2 m of a building or fence, the local government has given written permission for the incinerator to be used; and
 - (c) there is no inflammable material within 2 m of the incinerator while it is in use; and
 - (d) at least one person is present at the site of the fire at all times until it is completely extinguished; and
 - (e) when the fire is no longer required, the person ensures that the fire is completely extinguished by the application of water or earth.
- (3) Garden refuse burned on the ground is burned in accordance with this subsection if
 - (a) there is no inflammable material (other than that being burned) within 5m of the fire at any time while the fire is burning; and
 - (b) the fire is lit between 6 p.m. and 11 p.m. and is completely extinguished before midnight on the same day; and
 - (c) at least one person is present at the site of the fire at all times until it is completely extinguished; and
 - (d) when the fire is no longer required, the person ensures that the fire is completely extinguished by the application of water or earth.
- (4) A local government must not give permission under subsection (2)(b)(ii) unless it is satisfied that the use of the incinerator is not likely to create a fire hazard.

Bush Fire Brigade Protective Clothing

Do you require Protective Clothing for the Bush Fire Season?

A duty of care exists for a Fire Control Officer to ensure that persons attending an incident has appropriate PPE (personal protective equipment), the same responsibility rests with those attending so please ensure you wear the required clothing, otherwise insurance issues may arise.


As we head towards the start of Bush Fire Season, the Shire offers all our volunteers the opportunity to order protective clothing - coats and trousers, supplied by Stewart & Heaton Protex as well as Honeywell 7600 face masks, provided by Scavenger Supplies.

The Kulin Shire cover the full cost of protective clothing and will pay 50% of the cost of face masks or fire goggles. Please email to@kulin.wa.gov.au to request an order form. Cut off date for all orders will be Monday 20 October 2025.

You must be a *registered member of a bushfire brigade* within the Shire of Kulin, and have not placed an order in the past 5 years.

Shire of Kulin Restricted Burning Information

Restricted Burning Times are from 19 September – 31 October 2025 PERMITS ARE REQUIRED DURING THIS TIME

Fire Permits

Permits for burning will only be issued during the restricted burning period and are available from your local Fire Control Officer.

Permits will only be issued if the Fire Control Officer is of the opinion that the weather conditions are suitable, and may apply restrictions. Failure to comply with the restrictions is an offence.

When a Fire Control Officer refuses to issue a permit, he must advise the Chief Executive Officer that the permit has been refused and details of the grounds for refusal to ensure that a permit is not obtained from another officer.

From the start of the restricted burning time to the end of Easter, no person is allowed to light a fire on a Sunday or Public Holiday.

Campfires, BBQs and Pizza Ovens

Campfires may be permitted during the Restricted Burning Period, dependent on the weather, as per the table below.

Campfires are not permitted on public land or campgrounds during both Restricted and Prohibited Periods.

INFORMATION SHEET FOR RURAL LANDOWNERS

Basic Raw Material Extraction for Commercial Purposes

PURPOSE OF THIS INFORMATION

This information sheet has been prepared to assist rural landowners who may be approached by companies or contractors seeking to extract basic raw materials including sand, gravel, rock, limestone, clay and shale from their properties for commercial purposes (e.g. wind farm footings).

Landowners should be aware of planning, environmental, and road network considerations before entering into any arrangement.

1. Planning Requirements

Zoning and Land Use Controls

The extraction of basic raw materials including sand, gravel, rock, limestone, clay and shale is classified as 'Industry - Extractive' under most Local Planning Schemes. This use is not exempt from planning approval in the Shire of Kulin, even on rural land.

- Development Approval is required under the Shire of Kulin Local Planning Scheme No.2 (LPS2).
- Approval must be obtained before any extraction activity commences.
- Proposals are assessed against zoning objectives, land capability, and environmental impacts.

Supporting Documentation for Planning Approval

- Site plan and excavation details
- Estimated volumes of material to be extracted
- Duration and staging of activity
- Rehabilitation plan
- Dust and noise management measures
- Traffic impact assessment and traffic management plan

Key Consideration

Even "temporary" or "small-scale" borrow pits require formal approval if the material is being used for commercial purposes such as wind farm infrastructure.

2. Environmental and Licensing Matters

- If more than 50,000 tonnes of any basic raw material/s is proposed to be extracted per year, a Works Approval or Licence may be required from the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) under the Environmental Protection Act 1986.
- If clearing of native vegetation is required, a Native Vegetation Clearing Permit may also be required from DWER.
- Consider potential impacts to wetlands, watercourses, or remnant vegetation.



KULIN BUSH RACES SHARE YOUR MEMORIES

FROM CRAZY IDEA TO KULIN ICON BY - WENDY GANGELL

My first memories of our bush races are many. From the very first mention that we should try having something to put KULIN on the map to the idea of horse racing in an area with a handful of people who could actually ride a horse with about eight horses in the whole area.

Friday nights at the pub were huge- the building bursting at the seams- real live bouncers at every door and all our out of town visitors letting their hair down before boarding the bus to head back to the track.

My involvement with everything Tin Horse has been a huge experience and the number of horses



we have and the varied people who have, and are still contributing, to our now famous highway is mind blowing.

Many things have changed over our 30 years but much remains the same. Why change what works while moving ahead to keep things interesting and vital to today's needs. I have great faith in the people now heading our event and with all of the exciting developments this year- new shed, KBR HQ and a strong sense of strength going forward I wish you all well. Thank you for letting me still have the best job on race day where I get to mingle with the race winners, chat with the sponsors and enjoy all the goings on in the track office.

Lets all celebrate this year and along with my generation support and watch our event as it heads into the next sunset.

WELCOMING RIDERS AND SHAPING THE TRACK BY - GEOFF BROWN

Alongside many volunteers one of the first jobs I was involved in was to plan the racing track and construct the horse yards. The track and railing has been improved over the years but has remained the same design and location. The horse yards lasted well but were finally upgraded to steel in 2023.

On the eve of the event, my responsibility was to welcome all competitors in the horse races and gymkhana when they arrived on course. On horseback I would meet everyone and escort them to where they would camp. Often parents participated as racehorse owners and riders, while their children showcased their ponies in the gymkhana. Engaging with competitors and their horses prior to the competition ensured riders could approach me easily on race day if they had any issues.

My race day commenced early with a trail ride for all gymkhana competitors. Bernadette Carmody played a vital role in organising the participants, ensuring that everyone felt welcomed and understood the event schedule. The gymkhana was essential for obtaining the racing permit, as it needed to be conducted alongside the horse races.

Following the gymkhana my role as Clerk of the Course meant I checked in with the racing competitors and worked alongside them to ensure they were taken to the start line safely and then following races they were escorted to the horse yards.

The days were typically long, hot and dusty. Once the races concluded, the festivities commenced, filled with music and fireworks.

My responsibilities transitioned from overseeing the horses to sometimes supervising the younger attendees, encouraging them with set up their



camps as far away from the family campers as possible.

The Kulin Bush Races is a cherished tradition, attracting participants and supporters for thirty years is an incredible achievement. Through Kulin's community's dedication, the legacy of the races is something remarkable—an annual celebration that fosters fun and connection and showcases the wonderful community spirit of the people of Kulin.

As we barrel down the track towards Bush Races next weekend, it's been absolutely hectic with all systems go out at the grounds. Busy Bee days have seen volunteers scurrying to and fro, working tirelessly to pull off what's shaping up to be the best Bush Races yet. And rightly so—this year marks the 30th anniversary of the event, a massive achievement that the whole town, especially the Bush Races Committee and volunteers, can be incredibly proud of.

I'm still a relative newcomer to Kulin, but never fear—I've been out there getting my hands dirty and having a blast getting to know more of the community as we work side by side. Under the expert guidance of Mary Lucchesi, I've been helping keep our hardworking crew fuelled and fed. As they say, an army runs on its stomach—and pulling off something as spectacular as the Kulin Bush Races really does take an army of volunteers.

And that army takes some feeding. It's been a feast of toasted sandwiches, burgers, sausages, slices, bikkies, and cake. Thank goodness we live in a town of master cooks! I decided to contribute a plate of brownies for afternoon tea. I happily cooked a double batch, stacked them high on a plate, and gave it a look over: "Oh yeah, that's heaps—there'll be leftovers for sure," I thought.

But no! That loaded plate vanished in record time, leaving behind only a few scattered crumbs as the volunteers dashed off to resume their tasks.

So, seeing as the brownies were devoured with gusto, I figured that's the recipe worth sharing this week. It's dead easy, always a winner, and perfect for feeding a hungry crowd. As always, from my table to yours, enjoy!

Fudgy Chocolate Brownies

Ingredients:

Brownies

- 375g butter
- 300g dark chocolate (use the good stuff its worth it!)
- 6 eggs
- Large pinch of salt
- 570g caster sugar
- 240g plain flour (use gluten free if required, it still works perfectly)
- 2 cups of Nuts or chocolate chips (I use half Dark Chocolate and half Milk Chocolate for amazing chocolate overload)
- 2 tsp of good bourbon

Frosting

- 60g butter
- 60g milk chocolate
- 1/4 cup evaporated milk
- 1 tsp vanilla essence
- about 2 cups of icing sugar, adjust to a consistency that coats the back of a spoon.

Method:

- 1. Preheat your oven to 180 degrees.
- 2. Chop your chocolate and butter into small pieces and melt in a double boiler, then set aside to cool.
- 3. Beat all six eggs with your sugar until extremely light and fluffy, it will double in size!
- 4. Add the flour and salt and gently combine.
- 5. Add the cooled chocolate mix and bourbon and fold through with a spatula until all mixed in.

- 6. Add your chocolate chips/nuts and gently fold through.
- Pour into a large lined lamington tray. Bake about 45 minutes until set but still sticky in the middle.
- 8. Remove from the oven and cover with foil to keep the moisture in while it cools..
- 9. Make your frosting Melt the butter and chocolate together in a saucepan with the evaporated milk and vanilla.
- 10. Once melted add the icing sugar and mix together until smooth and adjust the amount of icing sugar so that the consistency allows you to coat the back of a spoon.
- 11. Pour over the still warm brownie and allow to set.
- 12. Cut into pieces with a hot knife and serve!

As the atrocious weather has kept us grounded, I thought I would write of our recent orchid adventures.

We have just experienced 2 weekends looking at wildflowers and orchids within the shire and just on its outskirts in Corrigin (Gorge Rock) and Kondinin at Yeerakine Rock.

The first day, we visited Hopkins Reserve along Commonwealth Road. We saw orchids growing roadside so we stopped and found a few species quickly. Onto Hopkins Rd and it is always a joy to see the Foxes Banksia. More orchids found here included a couple of Dancing spiders.

A visit to Jilakin Rock was next. Within a short walk of the carpark we found many species of Spider orchids and in good numbers. This visit would become a highlight of both our stays.

Within the townsite of Kulin, there is easy access to a number of orchid spots including the bush behind the caravan park and Rankin Street bushland. The Macrocarpa trail has many orchids and other wildflowers on display.

Our second visit this weekend involved visits to Jitarning South Reserve, Gnarming Road West (intersection of Gorge Rock/Lake Grace Road) and Yeerakine Rock. We found orchids in every location.

A few of the spots we visited are known to us from previous stays. We have the

- Hold onto a support and stand up tall with feet together.
- Hold for 10 seconds.
- Repeat twice.

- 1. Remove hand from support
- 2. Close your eyes
- 3. Increase to 15 seconds



Step Forward

- Hold onto a support and stand up tall with feet together.
- Take a step forward with your left leg.
- Hold for 10 seconds.
- Swap legs so your right leg is in front and begin again.
- Repeat twice on each leg.

Make it harder

- 1. Remove hand from support
- 2. Close your eyes
- 3. Increase to 15 seconds



HEALTH AWARENESS

Foot in Front

- Hold onto a support and stand up tall with feet together.
- Take a step forward with your right leg placing it directly in front of your left foot so the heel and big toe are touching.
- Hold for 10 seconds making sure your foot doesn't rest against your other leg whilst balancing.
- Swap legs so your left leg is in front and begin again.
- Repeat twice.

Make it harder

- 1. Remove hand from support
- 2. Close your eyes
- 3. Increase to 15 seconds



Single Leg Standing

- Hold onto a support with both hands and stand up tall with feet together.
- Bend your right knee so your foot comes up off the ground.
- Hold for 10 seconds.
- Swap legs so your left foot is off the ground. Begin from the start.
- Repeat twice.

Make it harder

- 1. Remove hand from support
- 2. Close your eyes
- 3. Increase to 15 seconds

Be breast aware this October

Cancer Council WA is urging everyone in the Wheatbelt to take Breast Cancer Awareness Month as an opportunity to familiarise themselves with the common symptoms of breast cancer.

In 2021, 1,862 women were diagnosed with breast cancer, and sadly, 279 women and one man lost their lives to the disease. In the Wheatbelt, 64 women were diagnosed with breast cancer and sadly, 13 died from it.

Common symptoms of breast cancer include:

- A lump or hard area in your breast or underarm, especially if it is only on one side
- A change in the size, shape or feel of your breast
- Change in the look of your breast, including redness, rash, or your skin looks like the skin of an orange, or is wrinkling in small folds
- Changes to the nipple, like it's pulled inwards, leaking, itchy or has a sore that won't heal
- Breast pain or discomfort, especially if it is only on one side
- An area of the breast that feels different to the rest

If you have had any of these symptoms for more than four weeks, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker as soon as possible.

If you have any of the symptoms, it doesn't mean you've got cancer; often, it turns out to be something less serious, but finding breast cancer early often means that the breast cancer is small, less likely to have spread to other parts of the body and can be more effectively treated.

Lumps and bumps

A lump or hard area in your breast or underarm, especially if it is only on one side.



Unusual dimpling or rashes

Change in the look of your breast, like: your skin looks like the skin of an orange, your skin looks and feels different in one area, redness or rash.



Changes to the nipple

Changes to the nipple, like: it's pulled inwards, leaking, itchy or has a sore that won't heal.



Pain or swelling

Breast pain or discomfort, especially if it is only on one side.



A change in size

A change in the size, shape or feel of your breast.

Get to know your breasts and what is normal for you. If you notice any of these symptoms or unusual changes, talk to a doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker without delay.

If you have a symptom, it does not mean you have breast cancer. Often these symptoms turn out to be something less serious. However, it is important to get these symptoms or any unusual changes in your body checked out just in case.


