Justices of the Peace play a vital role in supporting the community by witnessing and certifying documents, and helping ensure access to justice services for all.

We are looking for people who:

- Demonstrate sound judgement and communication skills
- Are willing to undertake training and commit time to the role

Training requirements:

Successful nominees will be required to complete mandatory training provided through the Department of Justice. This includes developing an understanding of the duties and responsibilities of a JP, legal and ethical obligations, and the correct procedures for witnessing and certifying documents. Ongoing learning and adherence to guidelines are also expected as part of the role.

Eulogy for Kareena Waters

Thank you for being with us today to remember and celebrate the life of the wonderful person, Kareena Waters.

Today gives us each the opportunity to reflect on our relationship with Kareena, what we each shared and the memories we have taken away from that relationship. Memories that will stay with us forever. Memories of that smile that never seemed to have an off switch.

Kareena was born in Narrogin in 1964. She was the second child of Hastie and Shirley Adams. Many of you will know her parents and her older brother Warren.

Like many of us, Kareena filled many roles to many people - a number of family roles, she was a work colleague, a great friend and a volunteer for many clubs around her community.

As a child you may remember her being a bright eyed and friendly girl. She played netball, indoor cricket, rode horses and was a St John Ambulance cadet.

She attended Narrogin Primary School and Narrogin Senior High School before leaving to commence a hairdressing apprenticeship at Pandora Salon.

She worked as a hairdresser at the salon for eleven years. There was a time where she was in charge of the salon with up to a dozen staff to support as well as her regular clients. Perhaps you have memories of working with her, maybe she trained you when you did your apprenticeship. Or perhaps you remember that she gave you the best haircut you have ever had!

In 1983 this is where she met her future husband John – although it would be several years before that initial meeting became a relationship.

In March 1991 Kareena and John married and welcomed their children, Kaitlyn and Clayton, a few years later. Many of us will have been fortunate to have spent time with the whole family.

As many will know, through dedication and hard work, she embraced farming and learned to talk fleece, fire bans and fertiliser with the best of them.

Kareena loved farm life but liked to get off the farm and travel too – Southeast Asia, Europe, Canada, America and around Australia and New Zealand, as well as involving family and friends in her travels, as a part of the journey or as a part of the destination.

Back home Kareena was a very active community member. She loved playing tennis at her home courts in Dudinin, and was club captain for a time, secretary and took on catering. She played Kulin Netball more often in A1, was the Junior Netball coach and involved in the Junior Basketball Club, Kulin Bush Races and was a committee member of the Freebairn Recreation Centre. Perhaps you have shared grand final memories with Kareena or you worked together at some community events. Kareena was a weekly blood donor, as her blood type was rare and of course extra special as we all know. Kareena was always the giver.



She was also a very active family member, coordinating family events and catch ups for the broader family.

Kareena loved to cook and was very good at it. Her mother Shirley will tell you this is something she did from a young age. Shirley will also tell you that none of that skill came from her, deferring to Perth Nanna and Aunty Joy as Kareena's cookery inspirations.

The family and community definitely benefited from her love of cooking as she produced memorable dishes like her ice-cream slice (peppermint crisp or cherry ripe), sticky date pudding, Nutella slice, Swiss roll, lemon marshmallow slice or the chocolate muffins with the cream cheese centre! Melt in your mouth memories.

I'm sure you will always remember Kareena for her bright, bubbly spirit. She worked hard to hold onto happiness, even when life made it difficult. Her kindness was extraordinary—she cared deeply for others and so often put their needs before her own.

I hope each of you hold close the many wonderful memories you shared with Kareena and that her lasting legacy is her beautiful smile that will stay in your hearts forever.

MEDIA STATEMENT

Shire of Kulin – Renewable Energy Planning Submission

The Shire of Kulin Council, at its meeting on 18 March 2026, endorsed a formal submission to the Western Australian Planning Commission in response to the Draft Renewable Energy Planning Code.

The Shire recognises the challenges and opportunities associated with the transition to renewable energy, and the significant role regional Western Australia will play in that transition. However, Council's submission highlights the need for stronger planning controls to ensure renewable energy developments are appropriately located and managed.

Council's position is focused on achieving a balanced outcome, where renewable energy projects can proceed without compromising productive agricultural land, rural amenity, or the interests of local communities.

Key issues raised in the submission include the protection of high-quality farming land, appropriate setbacks between turbines and neighbouring properties, and the need to properly manage cumulative impacts on small regional communities.

The Shire has also highlighted emerging challenges already being experienced in parts of regional WA, including pressure on local housing availability, workforce displacement, and increased demand on community services during construction phases.

In addition, Council has raised concerns regarding the impact of heavy vehicle movements on local road networks and the need for developers to appropriately contribute to infrastructure upgrades and maintenance.

The submission also calls for stronger requirements around water use, decommissioning and rehabilitation of sites, and the protection of the rights of neighbouring landowners.

Importantly, the Shire has emphasised the need for improved transparency and consistency in how community benefit arrangements are negotiated, as well as the inclusion of robust social impact assessments as part of the planning process.

Chief Executive Officer, Mr Alan Leeson, said the Shire is seeking a planning framework that provides certainty for both communities and developers.

"Renewable energy is coming to regional WA, and we recognise both the challenges and opportunities it presents," Mr Leeson said.

"But it must be done properly, with clear rules, respect, fairness, and a genuine place for Local Government and the broader community as part of the process."

The Shire of Kulin will continue to work constructively with the State Government and industry to ensure that renewable energy development is planned responsibly and delivers genuine long-term benefits, with respect, fairness and a genuine place for Local Government and the broader community as part of the process.

Tropical Low (Ex-TC Narelle) Expected to impact Kulin Region

The Shire of Kulin is advising residents to prepare for a period of unsettled and potentially hazardous weather associated with the remnants of Tropical Cyclone Narelle, expected to move through our region in the coming days.

While the system is forecast to weaken to a tropical low by the time it reaches our area, it may still bring strong winds, rainfall, and localised impacts.

This is a precautionary notice based on current advice as at 26 March 2026



WHAT TO EXPECT:

- Strong, gusty winds
- Rainfall, possibly heavy at times
- Reduced visibility while travelling
- Water over roads
- Tree limbs and debris on roads



PREPARE YOUR PROPERTY NOW

Take a few simple steps to reduce risk:

- Secure or store loose outdoor items (furniture, bins, trampolines, tools)
- Check gutters and downpipes are clear
- Move vehicles, machinery, and equipment under cover where possible
- Clear drains around your home
- Avoid parking vehicles under trees



BE PREPARED AT HOME

Make sure you have:

- Torch and spare batteries
- Battery-powered radio
- Fully charged mobile phones and devices
- Basic supplies (water, food, medications)
- Checked in on neighbours, particularly elderly or vulnerable residents



TRAVELLING & FARMING OPERATIONS

- Be mindful of rapidly changing road conditions
- Expect water on roads and reduced visibility
- Consider timing of travel and operations, particularly from Friday onwards



Kulin Child Care Centre

We have followed the learning theme of Sea week during March. Our Educator Nadia who is working towards completing her Early Education studies planned two very well thought out experiences for our children. Firstly we have a water sensory table which was filled with sea, sand and animals. We also had plastic 'rubbish' inside the table. Our children had to work to clean the sea by removing the rubbish and correctly disposing it into our bin. This activity supports us to teach our next generation about caring for the environment, our planet and sustainability.



This activity links well within our Early Years Learning Framework supporting children to learn the concept of ***Being which recognises the significance of the present, as well as the past in children's lives. It is about children knowing themselves, developing their identity, building and maintaining relationships with others, engaging with life's joys and complexities, and meeting challenges in everyday life.***

The Rainbow fish by Marcus Pfiste is a story about learning how to share and make friends. This story was supported by a mat session and a craft activity filled with fine motor skills. The linking of these activities supports children to practice the transfer their learning.



Our Educator created a treasure chest table which was created with recycled items painted in gold. The children have enjoyed picking through and filling these chests with trinkets. The lid also allows for the schema play of posting, supporting discovery and co-ordination.

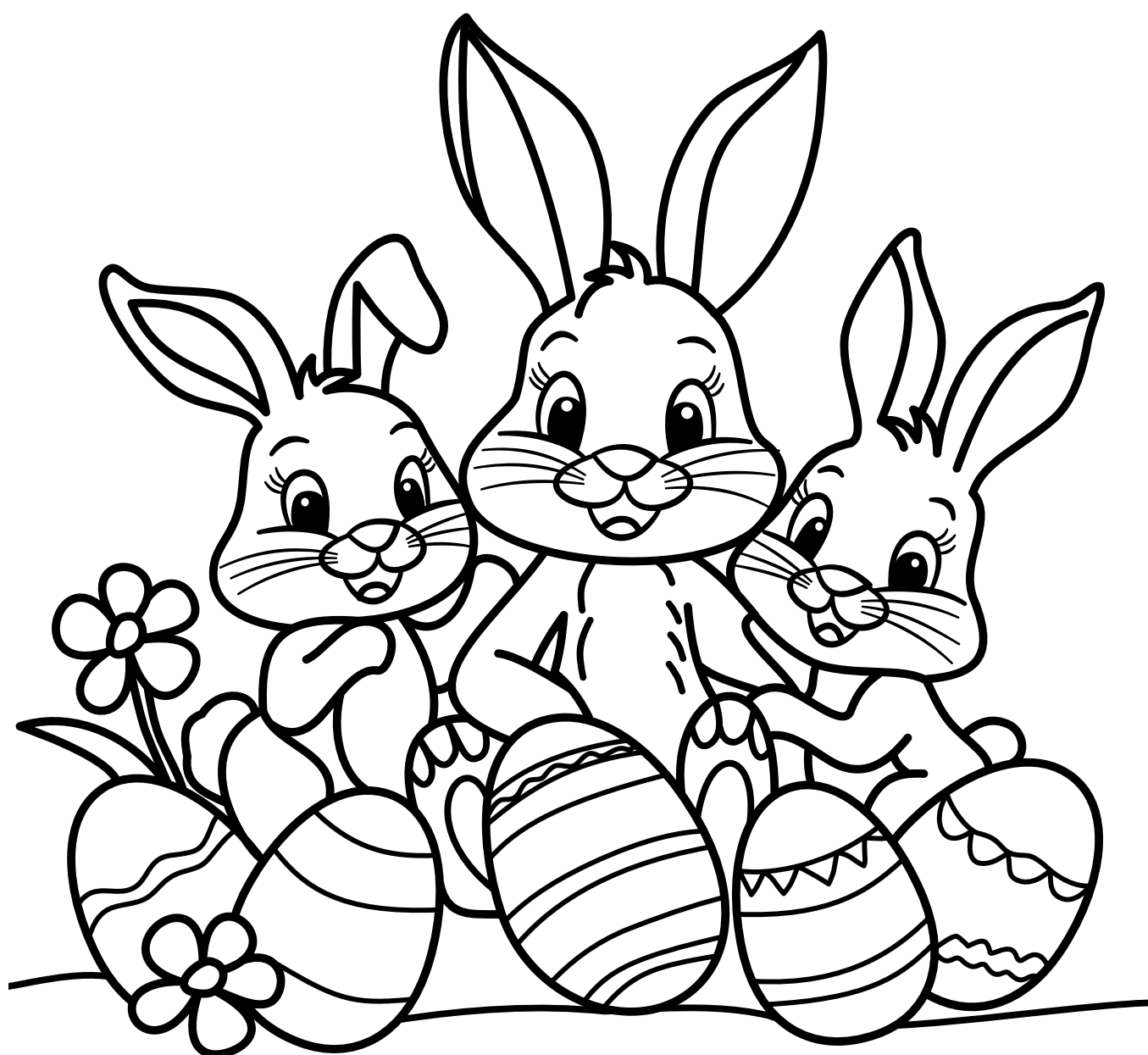

Our Stories, Our Voices.



LET'S SHARE OUR STORIES

When the fire is lit and the sparks rise into the winter night, something shifts. Conversations slow. Memories surface. Stories that have been carried quietly for years begin to find their voice.

In June 2026, the Kulin CRC, will present *Stories by the Fire - Our Stories. Our Voices.* – a curated Winter Solstice storytelling showcase

This is more than a single evening event. *It is a creative invitation to our community.*

Stories of long days on the land, of laughter and mischief, of storms weathered and seasons endured. Stories of childhood adventures, first jobs, hard lessons and quiet triumphs. Stories of imagination, memory and place.

Too often, these stories stay within families or fade over time.

Stories by the Fire seeks to create a welcoming space where those stories can be written, shared, performed and preserved.

A CELEBRATION OF CREATIVE EXPRESSION

While many stories may draw on lived experience and local history, this is also a chance to stretch your creative muscles. We want to encourage people of all ages to explore storytelling, you don't have to be an expert to share something special.

Submissions will be invited across a range of categories including youth, local history and heritage, bush and rural life, fiction inspired by place and poetry. Whether you are eight or eighty, whether you have written before or are trying it for the first time, we want to hear from you and have you join in with this special project.

Selected stories will be presented live on the evening in a curated fireside showcase. As our stories are read by the fire we can enjoy a magical evening out at the Bush Races Grounds, celebrating diverse voices from across the Shire.

CREATING A LASTING RECORD

Every suitable submission will be included in a professionally presented printed publication. In addition to spiral-bound copies for community distribution, a limited number of beautifully bound hard cover editions will be produced as keepsakes, preserving the voices of this moment in time for years to come. Both the hard cover and spiral bound editions will be available for purchase at the CRC.



Participants will also have the option to record their stories at the CRC. These recordings will be made available digitally (with contributor consent), allowing family members and friends, near and far to hear the voices behind the words.

WHY THIS MATTERS

In a busy world, it is easy for stories to slip quietly away.

The small moments. The hard seasons. The laughter around kitchen tables. The lessons learned under wide skies.

Stories by the Fire is about gathering those moments while we can. It is about listening to our elders and encouraging our children. It is about remembering where we come from and imagining where we might go next.

HOW TO GET INVOLVED

Story submissions will open soon, with full guidelines and categories to be released in the next few weeks.

Now is the time to begin thinking. To jot down memories. To shape ideas. To sit with a notebook and let your voice emerge.

One day, someone will ask what life was like here. What we valued. What we endured. What made us laugh. What held us steady. Let this be the moment we choose to answer.

WARM BOWLS, COLD WINDS AND TOUGH CONVERSATIONS COME IN, SIT DOWN, YOU'RE NOT ALONE IN THIS.



The wind turned cold this week and, while it's not winter just yet, I've dug out the snugly pyjamas and decided it's time to start on the soups.

There's something deeply comforting about sitting down to a steaming bowl, a stack of crusty bread on the side and a generous spread of golden butter. It feels cosy straight away, and it's the kind of meal that warms you through without weighing you down.

The last few weeks, though, have felt a little heavier.

There have been a lot of questions and not many answers, and that uncertainty is something many of us are carrying right now. I keep thinking about an old ad I remember from years ago, a farmer standing out in the rain while a voiceover said something along the lines of, "When Mother Nature throws a spanner in the works, it'll be the biggest one she can find."

I can't even remember what the ad was for. But the line has stuck with me.

Right now, it doesn't feel like it's Mother Nature throwing the spanner. It's a different beast, just as powerful in its own way, Global events, politics, supply issues, things far beyond our control, and more unpredictable than the weather.

Out here, we feel that impact quickly. The pressure is real. Crops, fuel, timing, decisions that can't be

delayed but don't come with clear answers. And at the same time, there can be a real sense that people outside of rural communities don't quite see how heavy that load is.

I've seen those conversations around the table before. As a kid, watching my parents work through tough seasons, and now as an adult, sitting in those same conversations myself.

I don't have the answers.

But I do know this. Sitting down together and talking about it matters. It might not solve the problem, but it reminds you that you're not carrying it on your own.

And sometimes, that's what gets you through.

I can't fix it for my family or my friends. I can't change the weather, the markets or the world. But I can put a big pot of soup on the stove. I can make something warm, nourishing and affordable, and I can say, come in, sit down, you're not alone in this.

And maybe that's enough for now.

So, this week, I'm sharing a Spicy Pork Noodle Soup. It uses pork bones, one of the most affordable cuts you'll find at the moment, along with plenty of aromatics and vegetables. The noodles help stretch it into a meal that goes a long way, perfect for feeding a family or sharing around the table.

We're built tough out here. We always have been.

But we're stronger together than we are alone.

There is always a place at the table. Keep the conversation going.

Spicy Pork Bone Noodle

Soup *Serves 4 generously, but stretches to 6 easily.*

INGREDIENTS

FOR THE BROTH

- 1 kg pork bones, patted dry
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- Salt and pepper
- 2 tsp garlic powder
- 2 tsp paprika
- 1 tsp ground ginger
- 1 tsp onion powder
- 1 tbsp brown sugar
- 2 litres chicken stock
- 1 large onion, quartered
- 1 carrot, halved
- 1 stick celery, halved

FOR THE SOUP

- 800 g pork mince
- 3 tbsp minced garlic
- 1 tbsp fresh ginger, grated (or 1 tsp ground ginger)
- 1 tsp chilli flakes
- 2 tbsp mirin (or Chinese rice wine vinegar or apple cider vinegar)
- 2 tsp fish sauce
- 3 tbsp soy sauce
- 2–3 spring onions, chopped (white and green parts separated)
- 2 carrots, sliced
- 2 cups bok choy, spinach or kale, roughly chopped
- 200 g rice noodles or ramen noodles
- 1/2 cup fresh coriander,

roughly chopped

OPTIONAL

- 2 tbsp chilli paste (gochujang works beautifully)
- 4–6 eggs
- Sesame seeds, to serve

METHOD

1. Roast the bones

- Preheat oven to 180°C.
- Place a large baking dish with olive oil into the oven to heat.
- In a bowl, toss pork bones with salt, pepper, garlic powder, paprika, ground ginger, onion powder and brown sugar.
- Carefully place into the hot dish and roast for 30 to 45 minutes, turning once, until deeply browned and caramelised.

2. Build the broth

- Transfer roasted bones to a large pot. Deglaze the baking dish with a little water or stock, scraping up all the flavour, and add to the pot.
- Add chicken stock, onion, carrot and celery along with soy sauce, mirin, fish sauce, chilli flakes and chilli paste if using.
- Bring to the boil, then reduce to a gentle simmer and cook for 3 to 4 hours. Stir occasionally and allow it to reduce to a rich broth (around 1 litre remaining).
- Strain the broth, discarding vegetables and bones. Skim excess fat from the surface.

3. Prepare the pork mince

- In a pan, sauté garlic and ginger until fragrant. Remove from the pan.
- Add pork mince and cook until well browned and caramelised. Return the aromatics to the pan, mix through, then set aside.

4. Bring it together

- Return the strained broth to a clean pot and gently bring back to heat.
- Add cooked pork mince, sliced carrots and the white part of the spring onions. Simmer for

5 minutes.

- Remove any remaining meat from the pork bones, shred, and add back into the soup.
- ##### 5. Add noodles and greens
- Add noodles directly to the broth and cook for 4 to 5 minutes, stirring occasionally so they don't stick.
 - Turn off the heat, then add greens and the green part of the spring onions. Cover with a lid and allow to steam through
- ##### 6. Optional Eggs
- Place eggs in a saucepan, cover with cold water and bring to the boil. Simmer for 6 minutes, then transfer immediately to cold water. Peel and halve.
- ##### 7. Serve
- Ladle into bowls and top with fresh coriander, sesame seeds and a soft-boiled egg if using.

Notes from the Table

- This is one of those meals that stretches further than you expect. It will comfortably serve four, but you can easily feed six by adding a few extra eggs and letting the noodles and broth do the work.
- If you prefer a cleaner, more restaurant-style finish, you can cook the noodles separately in hot water and add them to each bowl before ladling over the soup.
- Personally, I like cooking them straight in the broth. They soak up all that flavour, and that's where the magic is.
- It might look like a long recipe, but it's really just a few simple stages. It's affordable, nourishing, and exactly the kind of meal that feels like a bit of care in a bowl.

Autumn in the Garden

It's happening. The wind is colder, the sky has been overcast for a week, and the sun isn't burning quite so hot. It's not here yet, but the weatherman is talking rain. We know he's not always the most reliable bloke, but maybe, just maybe, we're on our way into autumn planting time. With April only days away and Easter creeping up fast, it's time to start thinking about what's going in the ground.

Everyone has their own favourites, but I dearly love getting my autumn veggies in. Summer can be a real test here in the Wheatbelt, and there's something hopeful about this change in season. The garden starts to feel possible again. You don't have to do it all at once, just pick a few things, get your hands in the soil, and see what grows.
