

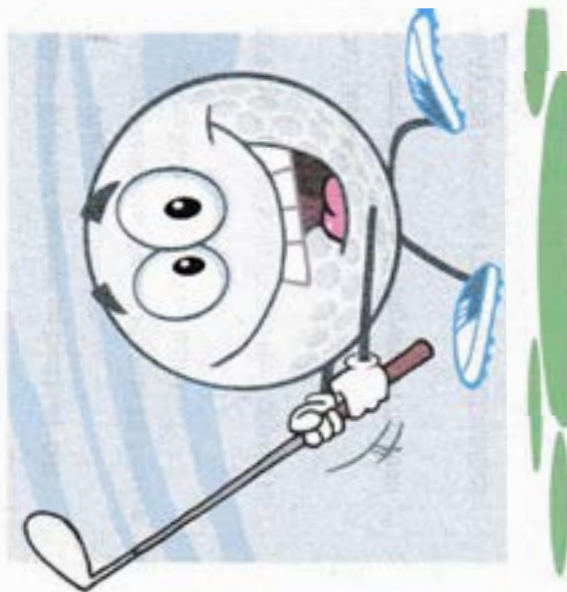

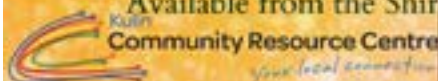

Last year we reached out to local Noongar Yorga Talicia Griffin from Ballaradong Kondinin to explore the story of Kulin Child Care Centre early education and turn this into a beautiful artwork design for our Indigenous shirts.

It was important to us that we had a local person complete the artwork as we wanted it to reflect the land and stories of our community where we are located today and for everyone who comes to our centre for learning or visiting. Through conversation we have captured what we regularly learn about as well as special parts from the land including language, native flora, native animals, waakarl, flowers, and community.

From the artwork within our shirts, we are building conversations with our children and visitors to understand the care for this land and also the first nations people including their rights, history, and culture. The artwork in these shirts helps us to link both traditional and contemporary learning themes regarding first nations people. This shirt will not simply be worn but importantly discussed and shared with our children. We continue to work towards embedding Aboriginal perspectives and culture into our everyday practice and centre environment.



We continue to broaden our education and resources to support and deepen our connection to our children, their culture and the culture of their peers.

As staff we are very proud to wear these shirts and proud to share they were designed by a local Ballaradong artist through conversation & friendship.

Talicia has captured a beautiful story of our learning journey to date. To Talicia we would like to express our greatest thank you. During this process you were very professional and delivered a visual story which was beyond our ideas, without you we would not have been able to wear a design which supported our land and learning links. The artwork in our shirts is not just artwork this is knowledge shared by Talicia, we understand the importance of the information shared and the journey we are all on to care for the first people's land.

IN THE MIDST OF THE CHAOS, A SIMPLE SOUP IS A GIFT



It seems lately that chaos is the only word that really fits.

Rushing from one thing to the next. Adding more and more to the to-do list, while nothing ever quite comes off it. Layer that with the quiet worries about the season, about life, about the wider world, and it doesn't take much to feel like you're caught in a small cyclone of stress.

In moments like that, there's real value in pressing pause.

Not for anything elaborate or time-consuming, but for something simple. Something nourishing without being heavy. Something that soothes but still brings a bit of flavour and life back to the table.

That said, I am very aware that time feels tight for everyone at the moment.

So when I came across this recipe the other day, it felt like a bit of a gift. It comes together quickly, uses minimal dishes, and can be easily adjusted depending on what you have on hand or what suits your budget. And most importantly, it is genuinely delicious.

No prep ahead. No complicated steps. Just a good, comforting meal in under half an hour.

Because in amongst the hurry and the noise, the things that matter most are still close to home.

Our families.

The moments where we stop, even briefly.

The simple act of sitting down together.

When you look back after a busy stretch, it's rarely the long list of tasks that stand out. It's these moments. A shared meal. A conversation across the table. The comfort of something warm in your hands and good company around you.

So, from my table to yours, here's a simple shortcut to flavour, comfort, and a place at the table.

Easy Curry Laksa

Serves 6 generously

INGREDIENTS

- 2 tbsp vegetable oil
- 1/2 jar laksa recipe mix
- 2 tbsp Thai red curry paste
- 2 tbsp curry powder
- 400g chicken thigh fillets, thinly sliced
- 400ml coconut milk
- 4 cups chicken stock
- 400g peeled prawns (optional)
- 400g frozen pork or prawn dumplings (optional)
- 2 tbsp fish sauce
- 1 tsp sugar
- 1 packet rice noodles
- 2 cups bok choy, sliced
- 100g bean shoots
- 1/3 cup coriander, roughly chopped
- 3 boiled eggs, halved

METHOD

1. *Heat the vegetable oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add the laksa recipe mix, Thai red curry paste and curry powder. Cook for about*

30 seconds, or until fragrant.

Prepare the chicken

2. *Add the sliced chicken and stir-fry for around 2 minutes.*
3. *Pour in the coconut milk and chicken stock, then bring to a gentle simmer. Allow to cook for around 10 minutes, or until the chicken is fully cooked through.*
4. *Meanwhile, cook the rice noodles in boiling water according to packet instructions.*
5. *Once cooked, reduce the heat on the soup to low. Drain the noodles and add them straight into the broth, gently separating them as you go.*
6. *Using the same noodle water, cook the dumplings if using. While they are cooking, add the prawns to the soup and allow them to cook through.*
7. *Stir in the fish sauce and sugar, adjusting to taste.*
8. *Add the cooked dumplings and bok choy to the soup, allowing the greens to wilt slightly. Be careful not to overcook, they should stay fresh and vibrant.*
9. *Ladle into bowls and top with bean shoots, coriander and halved boiled eggs.*

And just like that, dinner is done. A little warmth. A little comfort. And a reminder that even on the busiest days, there is always room to come back to the table.

May in the Garden

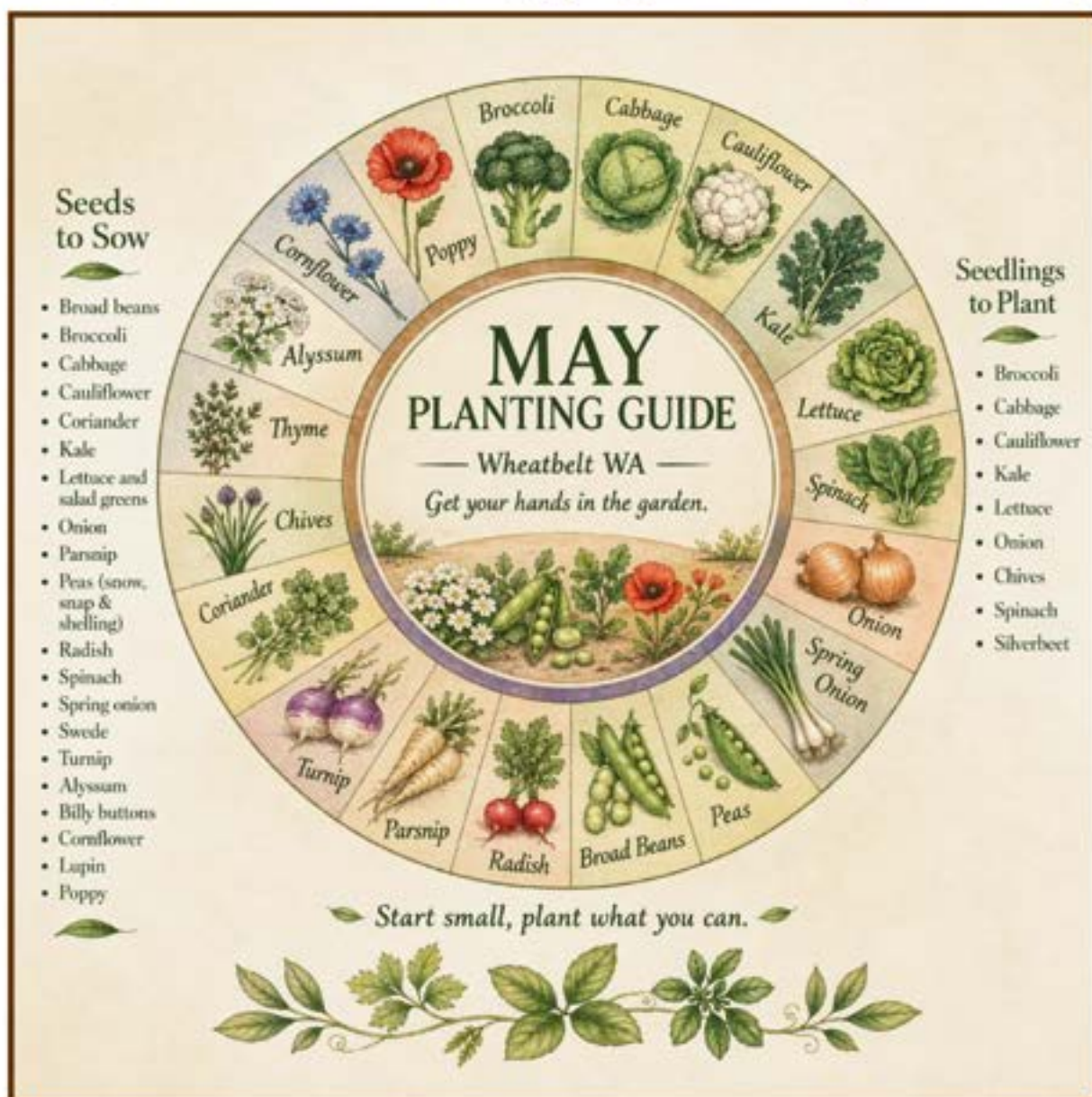
Winter is just around the corner. The days are shorter, the nights much cooler, and the wind is starting to carry a bit of a bite.

If you haven't already, now is the time to get those winter veggies in. There is still a great window for planting, and a few simple jobs in the garden will set you up well for the colder months ahead.

Don't forget to fertilise your new seedlings with a liquid fertiliser or seaweed solution to help them establish strong roots. Top up the mulch on your veggie patch, herb garden and ornamental beds. Think of it as tucking a cosy blanket around your plant babies before the cold really sets in.

And keep an eye on the weeds. As soon as the weather shifts, they are off and running, making a break for freedom. Not a chance. Rein those bad boys back in before they take over.

Most of all, take a moment to slow down and enjoy getting your hands in the garden this time of year.



SLICES FOR SEEDING

In the midst of seeding, when the days are long and the mental load is even longer, coming up with something tasty, easy and reliable that you haven't made a hundred times before can be a challenge. So here are two lunchbox-ready slices to add to the rotation.



Banana Bread (Oil-Based)

Lunchbox-friendly, freezer-ready and always a winner

INGREDIENTS

3 large ripe bananas (or frozen, thawed) – about 1 1/2 cups mashed

1/2 cup vegetable oil

2 large eggs

1 cup sugar (white or light brown)

2 cups plain flour

1 tsp vanilla

1 tsp baking powder

1 tsp bi-carb soda

1/2 tsp salt

1 tsp ground cinnamon (optional)

1 cup chocolate chips or walnuts (optional)

METHOD

- 1. Preheat oven to 170°C and line a loaf tin.*
- 2. Mash the bananas well using a fork or food processor. Lightly beat the eggs. In a large bowl, combine the mashed banana, eggs, oil, sugar and vanilla. Mix until well combined.*
- 3. Add the remaining ingredients and gently stir until just combined. Take care not to overmix.*
- 4. Pour into the prepared loaf tin and bake for 1 hour to 1 hour 15 minutes, or until golden and cooked through when tested with a skewer.*
- 5. Allow to cool in the tin for 10 minutes before turning out onto a wire rack.*
- 6. Slice to serve or store whole.*
- 7. This loaf freezes beautifully and keeps well in an airtight container.*
- 8. Best enjoyed with a generous swipe of butter.*



Peanut Toffee Shortbread

Sweet, crunchy and a little bit indulgent

INGREDIENTS

290g butter, softened

115g caster sugar

1 egg

185g (1 1/2 cups) plain flour

60g self-raising flour

185g (1 cup) brown sugar

2 tbsp golden syrup

1/2 tsp lemon juice

400g (2 1/2 cups) toasted peanuts

METHOD

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C. Lightly grease and line an 18 x 28cm slice tin.*
- 2. In a large bowl, cream 110g of the butter with the caster sugar until pale and fluffy. Add the egg and beat well.*
- 3. Fold in the plain flour and self-raising flour until just combined.*
- 4. Press the mixture evenly into the prepared tin and bake for 15 minutes, or until firm and lightly coloured. Allow to cool for at least 10 minutes.*
- 5. Meanwhile, place the brown sugar, golden syrup, lemon juice and remaining butter into a saucepan. Stir over low heat until the sugar has dissolved.*
- 6. Increase to a gentle simmer and cook for a further 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add the peanuts and mix well to coat.*
- 7. Carefully spread the hot toffee peanut mixture over the base using two spoons. Take care, it will be very hot.*
- 8. Return to the oven and bake for a further 5 minutes, or until golden.*
- 9. Allow to cool in the tin for 15 minutes before turning out and slicing while still warm.*


